DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The United States' Post Office and Court House is a two-story, rectangular structure with one story wings at each side. The building sits on a priviledged site in Mayagüez, slightly raised, claiming different vistas from town. A concrete and iron fence circles the landscaped area.

In what otherwise a flat facade, a second floor balcony is recessed into the volume. Iron railings shield the open area of the balcony. Here, columns, like evry other feature of the facade, are covered in cut stone of different colors. The entrance is highlighted by mouldings, trimmings and an eagle icon. Openings, kept to a minimum, are in the glass and metal, wether doors or windows. At its top, the structure exhibits high-releif details which include the building's name and a colored frieze of geometrical patterns. This frieze runs the full lenght of the structure. The sloped roof is stopped by red clay tile.

Inside, circulation is handled by two stairs at opposite ends of the rectangle. Glazed ceramic tile is used as wainscoat; public areas are limited on the first floor, which is mostly devoted to Post Office work. Boxes are in wood and glass.

On the upper floor, a hallway facing South and running East-West leads to different offices, eight of them.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The United States Post Office and Court House of Mayagüez is located on what was the site of the Old Spanish Infantry Building, badly damaged in 1918 by an earthquake.

The 1935 structure built by the United States' government, being most distinguished and architecturally significant, emerges as an excellent representative of the period in which it was built. The Post Office symbolizes the initial efforts of the American government to sponsor, foster and stimulate construction on the Island. As such, it is among several edifices used for institutional purposes (schools, health facilities and such) that would become references and precedents for subsequent construction in Puerto Rico.
