Description:

The Crystal Springs Recreation Area is located on Forest Service Road No. 177 off of Arkansas Highway 27 in Montgomery County. The recreation area is a rectangular shelter which is on a concrete foundation. The structure is all open air and has low bench-like seats on both the north and south sides. The structure has a hipped roof covered with composition shingles and is supported by eight (8) large log columns; four columns on both the north and south sides. The structure is in good condition.

The Crystal Springs Camp Shelter was constructed circa 1935 by members of the 741st Company of the Arkansas CCC District stationed at the Crystal Springs Camp that was located close nearby. It was constructed as part of a small, public recreational complex within the Ouachita National Forest (ONF) as a result of the CCC's emphasis upon recreational construction that began in earnest circa 1935. The extant historic structures within this complex include only this camp shelter and a dam (nominated separately), both of which allowed the area to function purely as a swimming and picnicking facility, as it continues to do today. As such, the Crystal Springs Camp Shelter remains significant through its associations with the contributions to American social history made by the Civilian Conservation Corps, its associations with the emphasis upon outdoor recreation that guided such construction, and its status as an excellent example of CCC recreational architecture in a remarkable state of preservation.
