DESCRIPTION

The Gibbs Drive Historic District is a neighborhood of fifty-two residences and associated outbuildings that reflect the characteristics of the streetcar and automobile suburb in Knoxville. The district has a linear street pattern, broad sidewalks, spacious facade lawns and sidewalks. Beginning in the era of streetcar suburbs, the neighborhood development continued throughout the period when automobile usage and ownership became prolific in Knoxville. The predominant building styles and forms are the bungalow, Craftsman, Minimal Traditional and four squares. Overall, the district is an outstanding example of the early twentieth century trend away from the elaborate Victorian era styles, to a more simplified floor plan and appearance

Buildings in the district are mainly one and one-half to two and one-half stories in height. Construction is brick or frame, with predominant building materials being brick, weatherboard siding or brick veneer. Lots are larger than those of other early twentieth century suburbs in Knoxville. Many garages and outbuildings survive in original form. The Gibbs Drive Historic District retains a high degree of architectural integrity. Only six of the fifty-two primary buildings are noncontributing. Most of the noncontributing houses have had visible additions or new siding; only one is post-1950.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Gibbs Drive Historic District is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places under criterion A and C for its local significance in community planning and development and architecture According to the Multiple Property Documentation Form (MPDF) context, Suburban Growth and Development in Knoxville, the district is representative of early twentieth century Knoxville residential development. The pattern of growth in the Gibbs Drive Historic District depicts the transition from streetcar suburb to automobile suburb. The district's wide sidewalks and long, straight grid street pattern are indicative of these developments. It is also a unique Knoxville example of the transition into the automobile era, which became prevalent in the city by the late 1920s. This is evident in the number of original garages, frame and brick, that prove the growing importance automobiles had during this period. The Gibbs Drive Historic District is a good example of the post-Victorian era, suburban development in Knoxville. It is a good representation of the building trends of the early to mid-twentieth century, when there was a return to simplified architecture and, often, smaller houses. This is most evident to the vast number of bungalow forms and Craftsman style influenced houses that dominate the block. In addition, the later Minimal Traditional style represent the building trends into the 1930s, 40s, and 50s. The district meets the registration requirements set forth in the MPDF.

Gibbs Drive is located in Fountain City, an area now included within the city limits of Knoxville. It is located in North Knoxville, approximately six miles from downtown, off of Broadway (U.S. 441) in Fountain City. However, Fountain City was, as late as the 1880s, a largely rural area dominated by farms. Originally called Fountain Head, it was far enough removed from the soot and grime of the industrial city to become a popular resort area. A large hotel with natural springs and a large lake became a popular spot for Knoxvillians and others to get away from the ever-increasing noise and pollution of the city.

Fountain Head also became a popular area in which to build "country homes." The development in 1890 of the Fountain Head Railway, a mechanized streetcar system, allowed a simple means of transportation from the city to the country. The first cars were steam-driven, and the route was tagged "The Dummy Line." It ran north on Broadway from Emory Place to the Fountain Head Resort, with a number of stop along the way. Due to its popularity, Fountain Head's population began to grow, and it incorporated as Fountain City in 1891. Because of increased ease in access, combined with its bucolic setting, Fountain City began to experience a growing trend in subdivision. The "Dummy Line" was electrified in 1905 and offered even more efficient transportation through the Broadway area. A number of residential developments sprang up along the route of the Dummy Line.

Once known as Jackson Boulevard, the first house to have been constructed on Gibbs Drive predates the subdivision of the land. The circa 1910 Colonial Revival house at 3047 Gibbs Drive was built on the corner of Jackson (Gibbs) and Jacksboro Pike. That same year, on September 15, Charles Gibbs, Frank Maloney and G.W. Maloney, real estate and mortgage company partners, had the land surveyed and subdivided. The Gibbs and Maloney Addition to Fountain City was recorded on September 26, 1911. The subdivision required that only single family houses be built. The next building occurred with the construction of two houses in 1913. The bungalows at 2821 and 2836 Gibbs Drive were built that year.

Throughout the rest of the second decade of the twentieth century, bungalows sprang up along this new development.

The popularity of the automobile in Knoxville became apparent and widespread during the 1920s. An increase in improved roads, the annexation of large land areas by the City of Knoxville in 1917 and general population growth spurred a second wave of suburbanization. Unlike the post-Civil War suburbanization, the newer suburbs were located far from downtown, in mostly remote rural areas. Growth in industry and manufacturing were no longer limited to the downtown region, and commercial areas sprang up to meet the need of the increasing suburban population.

The Gibbs Drive area continued to flourish throughout the 1920s. It is obvious that the automobile played an important role in its development, as is evident in the number of garages that were constructed along side or behind the homes. Approximately half of the houses in the district have extant historic garages. A number of local businessmen and business owners built houses or later moved into the district. One of the more notable is former Mayor George Dempster. Dempster's Neoclassical home at 2805 Gibbs Drive is the largest, and most visible structure in the neighborhood. It is located at the northwest corner of Gibbs Drive and Broadway. Dempster was considered a philanthropist and efficient politician in the Knoxville history books. However, his claim to fame is the invention, along with his brother, of the Dempster Dumpster, used today throughout the world.

The change in the architecture along Gibbs Drive mimics the changes from streetcar suburb to automobile suburb. The 1920s, 1930s and 1940s saw a shift from the bungalow and Craftsman influenced houses to the Colonial, Dutch and Tudor revival styles. Post World War II brought a proliferation of Minimalist Traditional styles, which were popularized in American magazines such as *Better Homes and Gardens* and *The Ladies' Home Journal*.

Of the fifty-two residences in the Gibbs Drive Historic District forty were built prior to 1930 and eleven were built between 1930 and 1950. The importance of Gibbs Drive as an extant example of early to midtwentieth century architecture in Knoxville is undeniable. It retains integrity unlike few Knoxville neighborhoods. No demolition has occurred and only one house was constructed during the 1980s. The houses are in good to excellent condition, perhaps a tribute to the long term occupancy of many residents.
