

| 18. Description The Humphrey House is a two-story central block of brick construction with one-story wings on either side, also of brick construction. Each wing is double-pile and consists of two square blocks, each with a gable roof and interior gable-end chimney. The components of each wing were constructed as a single unit. | 19. History The dwelling was built for the Humphrey Family. In the 1830s the house and farm were acquired by Jack Chalfaut who engaged in the distilling of apply brandy. Local farmers sold their fruit to Chalfaut, whose brandy was known nationally. The 1838 Trimble County Tax Assessment Records listed Chalfaut as owning 300 acres. | | | |

18. entrance and a side entrance. The central passage is enhanced by three-pane sidelights, an elliptical fanlight which has been enclosed and supporting arch. The side entrance also had an elliptical fanlight which has been enclosed and supporting arch. Flemish bond brickwork embellishes the facade, while the remainder of the building is executed in common bond with a row of headers every five rows. The second floor of the central block is pierced by three bays. The center bay is a rounded arch window, which has been enclosed, with supporting arch and limestone sill. On either side are oval windows with supporting arches and limestone bases, and both windows also have been enclosed. Corbeled cornices and limestone returns enhance the central core. The gable roof is covered with tin, and interior gable-end chimneys on the central core and wings complete the structure. Rear windows are 8/8 pane and 8/12 pane, and each wing has a rear door. The wings are accentuated by corbeled cornice on both the facade and the rear.

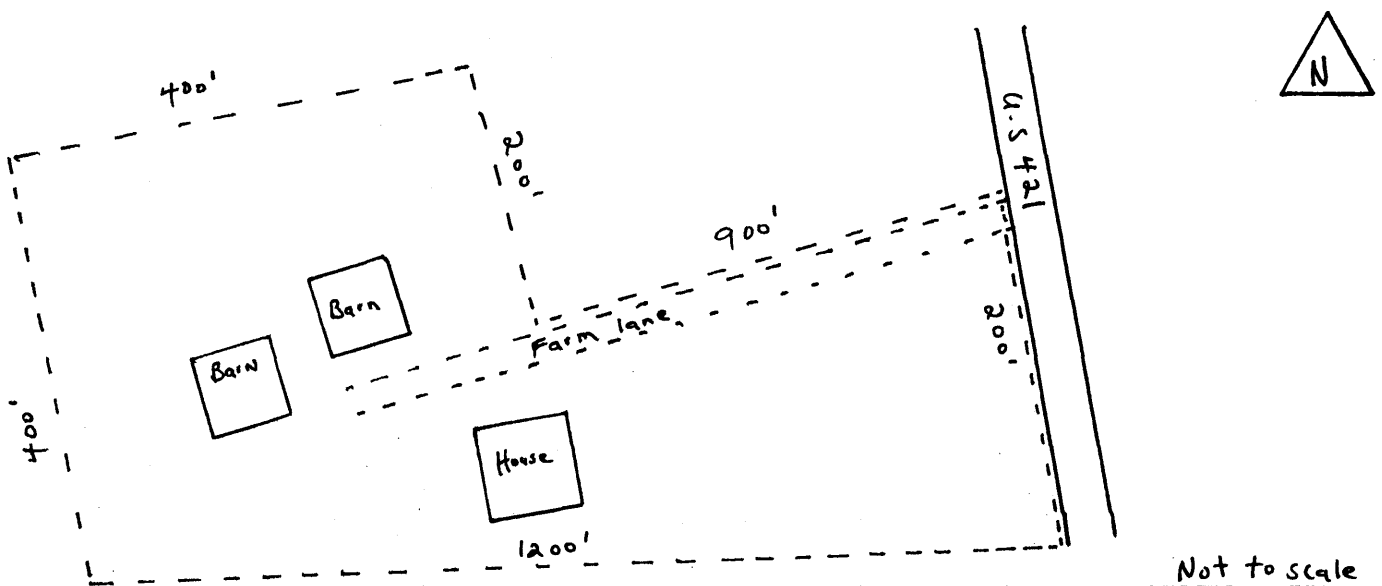

Beginning at the intersection of the farm lane and U.S. 421 proceed 200' in a southeastward direction along U.S. 421; thence 1200' in a southwestward direction; thence 400' in a northwestward direction; thence 400' in a northeastward direction; thence 200' in a southeastward direction; thence 900' in a northeastward direction along the north side of the farm lane to the point of origin. The boundary is drawn to include the house, outbuildings and farm lane.
