44. Description and House Plan:

Two story, hall-parlor, dry stone house 22 X 32; exterior chimneys in gable ends. Large yellow limestone walls, squared, laid in courses. Board partition wall between the rooms. House built on side of slope—west end of basement above ground. The cellar floor is the natural rock layer; the large foundation and wall stones may have been cut from the excavation.

Details re-done in Victorian style--flat hoodmolding, cornice with brackets, glass panel front door, Eastlake porch.

A new log addition and porch built at rear. Masonry repointed with concrete; frames replaced.

A single pen log house with shouldered stone chimney is west of the house. Sawn frame barn south of house, and tannery vat southeast of barn.
