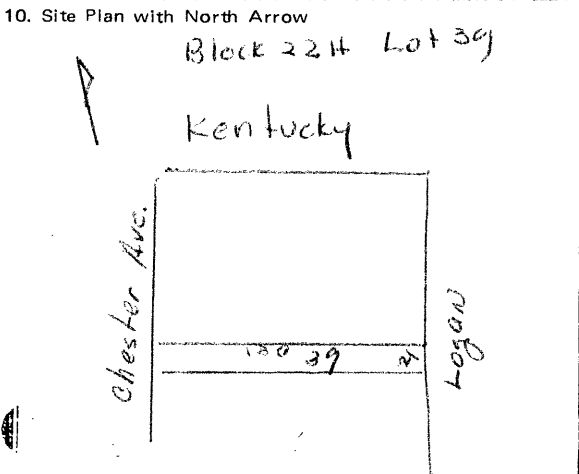

Firehouse #14 is a two-story brick structure in the Gothic Revival style. The first floor has been altered with the large fire door being filled in. This area is flanked by two single windows with stone lintels. A band of gothic-style ornament divides the first and second stories. The second floor has two pairs of double windows which have a central fluted pilaster. These windows area topped by a pointed arched transom with brick voussiors (over)

Steam Engine Company #14 was built in 1890 and is similar in style to Hook and Ladder #3 at Frankfort and Pope Ave. Steam Engine Company #14 originally served the Germantown and Shelby Park areas.

18. Accenting the voussiors is a stone band is an ogee arch terminating in oak leaf motifs. Radiating from the cornice are two diagonal placed stone bands, per window group, which also terminate in oak leaves, these were once part of decorative pierced gables which extended above the cornice line. Three buttresses begin at the windows level and provide visual support for the cornice.

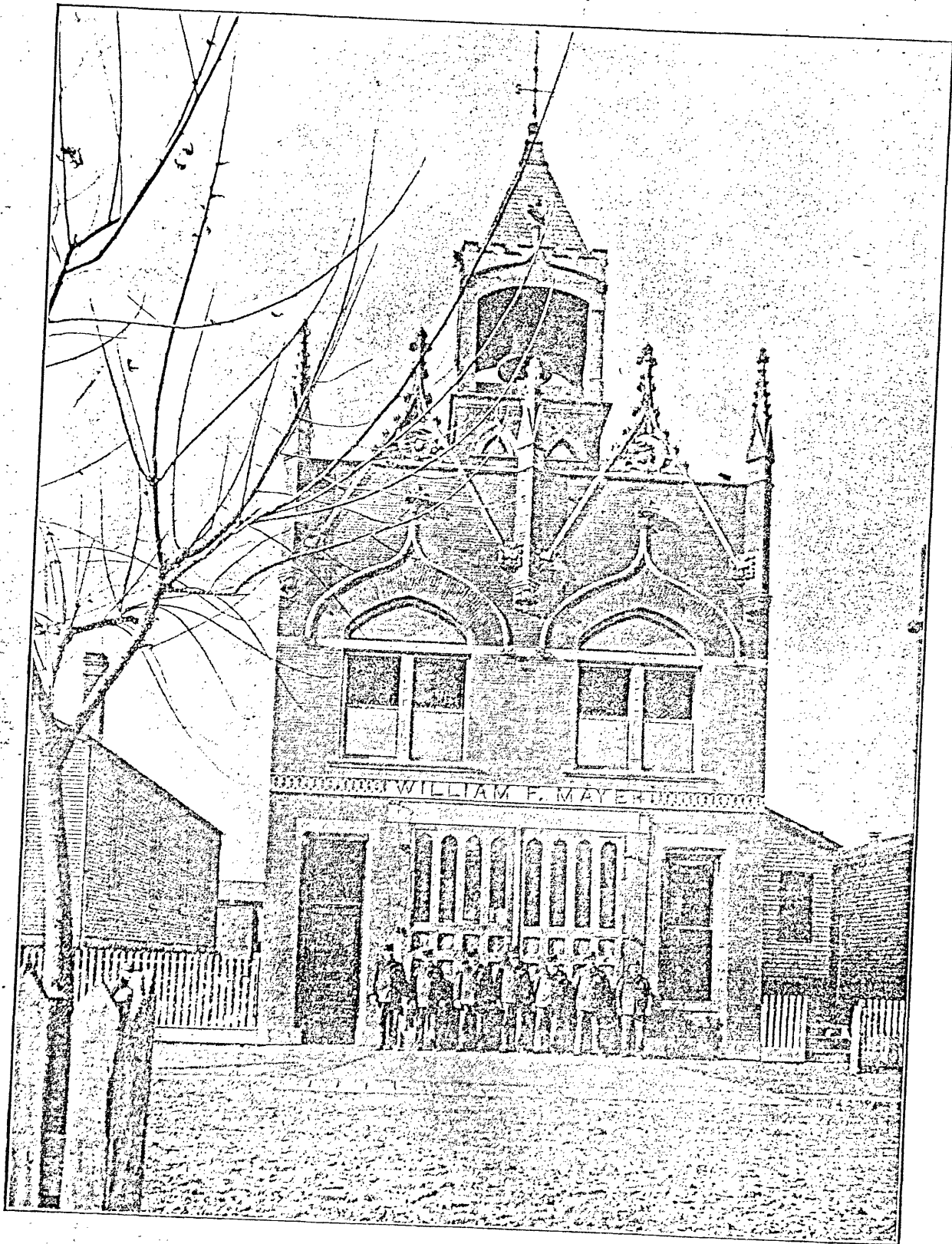
