DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ralls House is a single story house that is an excellent example of a mid-western Victorian cottage structure. Measuring approximately 30' wide and 35' long, it stands on a native stone foundation and was framed initially by its pine siding. It's multi-gables are covered with fish-scale shingles, the front porch has carpenter gothic trim, and its two-story tower is of Queen Anne style and reminiscent of A. J. Downing's cottages. The upper lights of the first story windows are framed in stained glass panes, as are the tower windows. The exterior has been altered only by the addition in the mid-1950s of asbestos shingle-siding, a concrete porch on the east front, and a screened "back" porch on the southwest corner. The effect of these additions is muted, and they do not detract from the original character of the house.

The interior of the Ralls House has remained virtually unchanged since its construction. The original floorplan consisted of two bedrooms on the south, a large entrance foyer and study in the center, and a living room, dining room, and kitchen on the north. They study was later converted into a bathroom and a walk-in closet and the foyer is now a sitting room. The house contains 12' high ceilings, hardwood floors presently carpeted, and hardwood baseboards and door trim covered with several coats of white paint. There are two features within the structure that make it somewhat unique: sliding wood-paneled doors draw together to separate the living and dining rooms and a serving window opens between the kitchen and dining room. The interior is tastefully appointed much as it was originally, well maintained by the present occupant, and suggests a feeling of controlled elegance.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Ralls House is significant because of its architectural style and integrity, and because it was the home of one of Atoka's most prominent families. Completed about 1900, when the community was still a part of Indian Territory, the house was built by J. D. Catlin, at the time a Deputy United States Court Clerk and lay minister of the Presbyterian Church. A white, Catlin had married the daughter of Captain James S. Standley, one of the foremost leaders of the Choctaw Indian tribe, who provided the land upon which the house was built. The Catlin family sold the house in 1919, but in 1933 it was purchased by Catlin's nephew, Joe Ralls, Jr. Ralls acted as secretary to the national attorney of the Chickasaw Nation prior to Oklahoma Statehood, became one of Atoka's most successful attorneys, and at one time served the community as mayor. Ralls died in 1970, but his widow still occupies the family home.

The Ralls House is especially important because it is the best example of turn-of-the-century luxury housing that remains in Atoka County. Moreover, its architectural style is picturesque and pleasant, and despite more than 75 years of occupancy, its integrity is unimpeached. Indeed, the Ralls House retains almost completely its original character.
