Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Bolton High School (1926) is a three story neo-classical masonry building with limestone facing. It is located in a residential area of southern Alexandria. Despite a few alterations and a 1967 cafeteria addition, the building easily retains those features which make it an important example of its style in Rapides Parish.

The plan is axial with a central entrance lobby leading to the main office area. The overall building consists of three main parts: a broad frontal section, a broad rear section which is linked to the front by a service court, and a large rear auditorium. The service court is open at the sides on the ground level and can be entered on either side by means of a broad archway. Most sections of the building have a central corridor leading to classrooms.

The entire exterior is styled in a severe neo-classical manner. The rusticated first story is surmounted by a colossal piano nobile. Each bay of the piano nobile is defined by Doric pilasters with groups of schoolroom sash windows sandwiched between them. The piano nobile is surmounted by a strong but plain entablature and a slight parapet. The five part entrance facade has a central Ionic columnar pavilion and a pair of relatively plain end pavilions. The parapet is raised slightly over the pavilions.

The interiors are relatively plain. A noteworthy exception is the arcaded lobby, with its full Doric entablature, coffered vaults, marble wainscotting, and elaborately molded cornice.

Changes made since the building's construction include the refitting of some of the classrooms and bathrooms, the replacement of the original bronze front doors with glass, and the construction in 1967 of a one story rear cafeteria addition. These changes we feel should be regarded as minor given the total scope of the building's original architectural fabric. Also, it should be pointed out that the rear addition has a minimal visual impact.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph) Criterion C

Bolton High School is locally significant in the area of architecture because it is Rapides Parish's largest and most imposing example of the neo-classical tendency of the early-twentieth century known as the "American Renaissance." Exemplary features include the building's quiet lines, severe classicism, and five part pavilion articulation.

There are only a few other period neo-classical buildings in Rapides Parish and they are mainly relatively small commercial structures. The Bentley Hotel is an exception to this because it is large and opulently styled. But unlike Bolton High School, the Bentley is not fully articulated with classical features. The Bentley's front colonnade is its only exterior classical feature. There is no all encompassing modular piano nobile such as at Bolton High School.

Bolton's local preeminence as an example of the "American Renaissance" is important for Rapides Parish. This style was regarded in its day as the final maturity of American architecture. It was generally thought that American architecture was at last taking its place with the architecture of the older countries of the Western World. So, taken in this light, Bolton can be seen as the most urbane and sophisticated early-twentieth century building in the parish.
