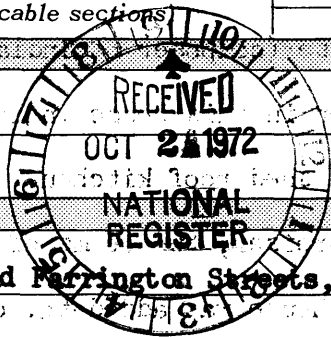

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

When Paul Dresser (composer of Indiana's state song On The Banks of the Wabash) was born in this house in 1859, it was a one-story, two room brick with lean-to, shed roof kitchen. The second floor was added by his father, John Paul Dreiser, two rooms of brick with outside wooden stairway. Over the years the house was added-to, changed, and the original location of 318 South Second Street became a decided slum neighborhood. In the city's urban redevelopment program, this house was due to be bulldozed, so the Vigo County Historical Society raised the necessary funds to have it moved to Fairbanks Park on the banks of the Wabash river.

The original two rooms plus the second floor two rooms, in other words, the four-room brick house was moved to its present site, and the shed-roof wooden frame kitchen was added later in the restoration work. The five rooms are furnished authentically and the restored home is now the second museum of the Vigo County Historical Society.

Theodore Dreiser was a younger brother of Paul and one room has items pertaining to him; 200ft. by 200ft. grounds being landscaped to period by garden clubs in area.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

A highway historical marker is set at Third and Farrington streets, in the center of the median of U.S. Highway 41, directing tourists to site at First and Farrington, directly west. Another state historical marker is placed at the front entrance of the house.

It was felt the house was worth saving by the Indiana Historical Society as it was so typical of the working man's home before the Civil War. A restoration of this period (1850s) was unique in the state. Only mansions or log cabins had been preserved up to this time. The Indiana General Assembly proclaimed the house as a State Shrine and State Memorial.

The City of Terre Haute and the Vigo County Historical Society felt it was important to save for posterity as an excellent example of the type of dwelling of the working man of Terre Haute of the pre-Civil War period. The fact that Paul Dresser (original name Dreiser) was born in the house gave it additional importance from the local and state history angle. In addition to writing Indiana's state song, Paul Dresser was one of the most noted popular song writers of the Gay Nineties. He gained national and international fame as the "King of Tin Pan Alley."
