DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Selma Historic and Civic Building is an imposing three story Greek Revival structure which is located on the corner of a large lot in one of Selma's residential sections. The red brick structure is rectangular in shape and its seven bay facade, central chimney and three story height make it unusual for this section of the state.

Four Ionic columns of the central portico rise the full three stories to support a pediment. The unadorned entablature encircles the structure and is topped with a simple cornice.

The doors of the central entrance have been replaced and the transom removed. Single doors which give access to the second and third story balconies are framed with side lights and transoms. Beltcourses continue the line of the two balconies across the facade. All windows are double hung, regularly spaced and have flat rectangular lentils. Those across the facade presently have two panes per sash while the remainder are 6 over 6.

The interior has been altered several times and the later addition of a rear wing was removed in 1971. On the ground floor, the central hall, a front parlor, and sitting room are furnished with period pieces. Grounds around the building have been landscaped with fountains, benches and walkways to provide a small park for the city.

#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Selma Historic and Civic Building is one of Selma's most historic buildings, having served a variety of public and private uses since its construction over 130 years ago.

Built in the late 1840's by the Selma Fraternal Lodge No. 27 of Free and Accepted Masons, the building housed a school, the Central Masonic Institute, which was operated jointly by the Masons and the Ladies Educational Society.

Incorporated February 19, 1848, the Institute opened in October of that year with 45 pupils. Three years later the property was mortgaged to Caroline M. Tarver, and apparently financial reverses resulted in its loss by the Masonic Order. During the Civil War, the former school was used as a hospital for sick and wounded Confederates.

Immediately after the war, Selma began an intensive campaign to have the Dallas County seat moved from Cahaba, where it had been since the county was established, to Selma. As a major factor in luring the county government to Selma, the city purchased the old Central Masonic Institute property and presented it to the county for use as a courthouse.

Voters subsequently approved the moving of the county seat to Selma, and from 1866 until a new courthouse was completed and occupied in the spring of 1902, county government was housed in the building. After county officials vacated the structure, it seems to have remained unused for some time. However, for four years prior to 1908 it again housed a school, the Selma Military Institute.

From 1911 to 1960 the building was again used as a hospital. Trustees of the estate of Henry W. Vaughn operated the Vaughn Memorial Hospital there. The trustees had purchased the property from the county.

The building stood vacant from 1960 until the city of Selma purchased the property in 1969 for \$82,500. Federal Open Space grant provided \$41,000 of the amount and the remainder was supplied by the county government and the Selma Housing Authority.

Restoration of the structure as a civic center and public garden was completed in 1971.
