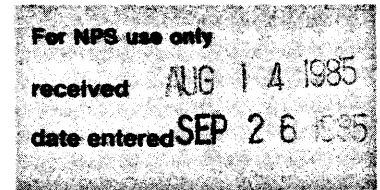

4. Owner: Margarito Herrera, 919 Railroad Ave., Las Vegas, N.M.
7. Description: Stuccoed foundation of unknown material; brick veneer over frame, stuccoed frame walls; asphalt shingle roof; hexagonal wood shingles in gable; 1/1, 2/2 double-hung windows with stone sills and segmental arches (1st) or continuous wood lintel (2nd); metal window hoods with cut-out metal brackets; three single doors; stucco up to first floor sills. Located in a residential area three blocks north of the **Railroad Avenue District**.
8. Significance: This house is not exactly like any other in town. The plan of the original brick section resembles the simplest one room deep version of the center hall house (see ill. 2), but with a hall and stairway which carry to a second story. The symmetrical facade is turned to the side and a second entrance introduced on the gable side, an entrance which enters a ground floor room. The house is not a chance elaboration, however, but a coherent, compact design. A person from an area where it was a common type probably built it or had it built. Other variations on the center hall plan date from 1875 to 1885, and so probably does this house. (A handful of other houses were built of brick shipped over the railroad.) The rear frame portion is a later addition.
