#### Description

The First Church of Christ Scientist was constructed in 1925. Its architects were Fitzhugh and Byron. A classroom addition exists to the rear of the building. The building is constructed in the Neo-Classical Revival architectural style and represents the American Traditional property type. It retains integrity of design, workmanship, and feeling. The First Church of Christ Scientist has been in continuous use as a church from 1925 to the present day.

The First Church of Christ Scientist is located on the southwest corner of Roosevelt and 1st Streets at an angle to the street intersection. The site is characterized by asphalt surfaces and mature trees. No outbuildings are located on the site.

The First Church of Christ Scientist is an essentially rectangular shaped, one and two story building of brick construction. The building is divided into vertical bays along its side walls. It measures 115 x 70 feet. The hip roof is covered with rolled asphalt and is hidden from view by a corniced parapet. It has a concrete foundation. The walls are sheathed with stucco.

Exterior features include the dominant angled entry facade with arcaded portico. The symmetrical, three part facade is topped with a stepped, corbelled parapet and deep classical cornice below. The slightly recessed central bay is penetrated by three tall, round arched openings providing access to the recessed portico and a triple set a paired doorways. Details at the portico include cast stone keystones, architraves and cornice molding.

## Statement of Significance

The First Church of Christ Scientist is significant under Criteria C in the area of Significance of Architecture. Built in 1925 and designed by local architects Fitzhugh and Byron, the First Church of Christ Scientist is a good local example of the Neo-Classical architectural style with Beaux Arts Classicism influences and therefore represents the historic context "Religious Architecture in Phoenix, 1910-1942." The building is a good illustration of the American Traditional property type. The building possesses the important characteristics of the property type, specifically design ideas based on academic interpretation of traditional classical architecture. Additionally, the use of Neo-Classical styles was common to most Christian Science churches in America.

The First Church of Christ Scientist building is locally unique in that it presents its entrance facade at an angle to the street intersection. The dominant Beaux Arts three part facade is topped with a corbelled parapet and projecting cornice. Characteristic of Neo-Classical architecture, the central bay includes three tall arched openings at the portico, each detailed with keystones and cornice molding at the springline. Other representative stylistic influences include strict attention to symmetry, bold, monumental facade elements, and white stuccoed wall surfaces.
