

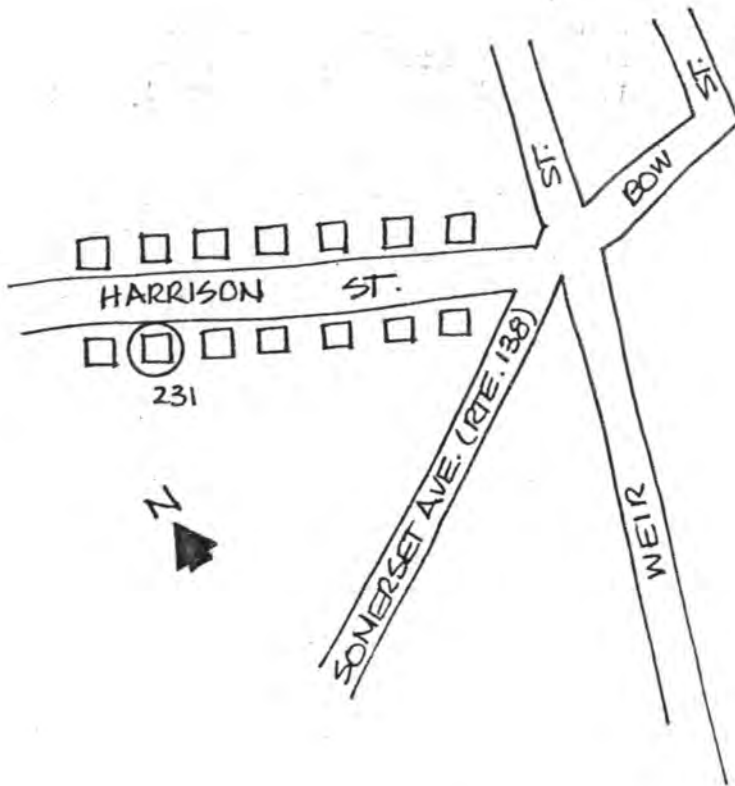

9. Historical significance (include explanation of themes checked above)

The most carefully-preserved structure of its period and style on Harrison St., this is perhaps the best example in Taunton of a side hall Greek Revival house that features transitional Italianate details. The scrolled cast iron ornament decorating the roof of the structure's porch is unusually ornate and rare.

The land on which the house is sited was part of Albert Field's extensive holdings, and was sold to Sarah A. Haskins in 1851. It is likely that she had the building built shortly after the sale of the land.

Description: The side hall, gable front house is 2½ stories and has a rear ell. It is fronted by a porch with fluted wood columns, and elaborate cast iron cresting and balustrade. Windows include parlor floor length 6/9 windows, 6/6, and a round-arched window in the gable.

Possessing integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship and association, the Sarah A. Haskins House meets criterion C of the National Register of Historic Places as Taunton's best preserved and most outstanding example of a transitional sidehall plan Greek Revival style house which displays intricate Italianate detailing.
