

#### Description

During the Boom and Bust Era (1914-1939) in White County a variety of vernacular houses were constructed. They were also built out of a variety of materials. Surviving examples from this period are somewhat limited. The Lightle House is a good example of a one-story saddlebag structure that is of box construction and clad with board and batten siding. The gable roof is covered with corrugated metal and the entire structure rests on brick piers.

This building was constructed approximately one-half mile northeast of Searcy's original city limits. The Lightle House was constructed c. 1920, is currently being used for storage and is in fair condition. Its main, or south elevation plays host to a symmetrically placed porch that is showing signs of deterioration. Its shed roof is supported by only three simple wooden posts. A single centrally placed door accesses this porch. Fenestration on the original building consists of single symmetrically placed four-over-four double-hung wood sash windows; some of these windows have had some glazing removed. The single window on the east elevation of the original structure has been replaced by large aluminum doors that provide an entrance for the machinery that is currently stored within the building. A large corbelled brick chimney rises from the gable peak in the center of the structure. Dominating the north elevation of the original building is a board and batten clad rear "T" addition. It has a gable roof and a brick chimney rises from the peak of this roof in the center of the addition. A single symmetrically placed door and window relieve the west elevation of the addition while a single centrally placed window relieves its northern elevation while a single asymmetrically placed window is found on the eastern elevation.

#### Significance

Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of a line running along the northern edge of the driveway leading into the property with a perpendicular line running parallel to the western elevation of the house and located approximately 50 feet to the west thereof (located 825 feet east from the intersection of the northern edge of the driveway with the eastern edge of County Road 76), proceed northerly along the latter line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the northern elevation of the house; thence proceed easterly for a distance of approximately 200 feet along said line to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the eastern elevation of the building; thence proceed southerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to a point formed by its intersection with a perpendicular line running along the northern edge of the driveway; thence proceed westerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to the point of beginning.

#### **Boundary Justification:**

The original lot has been subdivided during the non-historic period, resulting in an indefinite current lot boundary; therefore, this boundary includes all the property historically associated with this resource that retains its integrity.
