Lucerne Guard Station: Detached, T-shaped, 1 story, wood-frame, poured concrete foundation, wood-shingled high gable roof, cross gables offset left, attached vertical boards, plain battens every other joint on all gable ends. Windows are one-over-one double-hung aluminum sash and aluminum casements. Umbrage, center east elevation, shelters main entry; surrounds are formed by flush 10 x 10 timber posts, comparable plain lintel, heavy timber brackets extend from platform surface to lintel gradually curving; entry accessed by four straight concrete steps. Rear entry, off-center on west elevation, recessed. Louvered ventilators located on north and south gable ends immediately below roof peak. Single vehicle entry, off-center on north gable end of attached garage, now enclosed by narrow vertical boards. Single-leaf vertical board door, offset to right, accesses converted garage interior. No decorations, no obvious exterior alteration except for aluminum windows. The date of their installation is unknown. New windows appear to be the same size as the originals, thereby retaining the relation of openings to solids and minimizing the effect on the facades.

There is a small outbuilding present on the property and used for storage. It is believed to have been built in the 1960's and is counted as a non-concributing building.

SIGNIFICANCE:

The Lucerne Guard Station typifies the construction projects undertaken by the Civilian Conservation Corps and signifies the aid to the local community provided by the emergency work-relief program through employment of youth and experienced craftsmen, purchase of building materials and camp supplies, and personal expenditures of enrollees. The property represents the Forest Service's presence in the locality, as the headquarters for field operation, and denotes, via the physical facilities required to carry out the agency's expanding responsibilities, the critical transition in the Service's development from custodial superintendence to extensive resource management. The Lucerne Guard Station exemplifies the rustic architectural idiom developed by the Forest Service, Pacific Northwest Region, to impart Forest Service identity and to represent its purposes and ideals, and signifies the agency's particular interpretation of a singular expression of early twentieth century American architectural thought. Possessing high qualities of design and execution, the Guard Station is a good example of an architectural locution invested with special aesthetic and associative values by the agency that created it.

Lucerne Guard Station

In the County of Chelan, State of Washington. A parcel of land lying in the northwestern quarter of Section 10, T.31N., R.18E., W.M., said parcel encompassing approximately .18 acres and described as follows:

Commencing at an orange spike in the southeast corner of the engineering dock on Lake Chelan; thence south 218° a distance of 129.3 feet to a spike imbedded in the north face of a 14 inch DBH ponderosa pine, said spike being the true point of beginning; thence 132° for a distance of 82.6 feet to the northeast corner of the property; thence 216° for a distance of 100 feet to the southeast corner of the property; thence 310° for a distance of 78 feet to the southwest corner of the property; thence 36° for a distance of 93.8 feet to the true point of beginning.
