and the windows and door have stretcher voussoirs. Door jambs are reeded; window jambs angled.

The stairway is open stringer with scroll stepends and square spindles. There are chair rails in the downstairs rooms. One mantel downstairs has been removed. Others have broken shelves, one with a diamond-shaped central tablet, one with a plain tablet and fluted pilasters, the third with panels to either side of the pilasters a press to the right.

Upstairs there are board and batten doors. No mantels remain in the upstairs rooms. Above the hall is an alcove in the $\frac{1}{2}$ -story pedimented gable. This house has been unoccupied for many years. The present owners have put a new roof on the building, closed all openings and hope to start renovation in 1983.




