DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Hollingsworth House, built in the 1850's, is a rectangular 5 void brick structure with 6/6 sash windows in the second floor and 2/2 sash (later) on the first. The simply massed two story home has a two story wooden rear wing and a single story summer kitchen. A rubble stone foundation which comprises the basement walls, supports the paneled brick walls. Two chimneys at either end of the house and one on the summer the only accents on the low gable, shingle roof with short returns on the gable ends. The eaves have a decorated wooden cornice, repeated to the front porch roof line. All openings are rectangular with plain surroundings. Wooden shutters highlight the second story windows. The main door is plain and reached by a two story wooden pillard porch across the entire front of the house, added at a later date. The front door is unique in that it incorporates a central transom light flanked by smaller circular lights and side lights with rounded ends.

The interior is simple and features poplar floors probably cut in Hollingsworth saw mill. The doors are simple 4 panels of pegged construction and the frames have an entablature with shaped lintle above it. The cornices are decorated with small plaster detail work.

Most of the original fabric is extant and the house is in good condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The house is a fine example of rural vernacular architecture done predominately in the Federal style and shows the development of a home as a family's needs increased.

George Hollingsworth, the original owner, was typical of those who left the eastern shores to carve a home out of the Indiana wilderness. The Quaker family settled on 200 acres of land on Little Eagle Creek in 1826. George built a log home and the first saw mill in Pike Township, which was some distance from the Hollingsworth House. Later the main portion of the house was built. The property then went to George's son, Sylvanus, who became one of the leading agriculturists of the area. Although the family does not still own the property, they are still active in township affairs. The Hollingsworth House reveals the longevity of a prominent local family.

Many Indian artifacts have been found on the property and a site of undetermined significance is near the property.

This home is then significant as an architectural statement and for its illustrations of early settlement in Marion County as well as probable aboriginal occupation.
