DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Shelby County Courthouse is a Richardsonian government facility set ponderously on the central square in the downtown area of Harlan. It measures $63' \times 113$, of rusticated stone on a high basement. The hipped roof is broken by the gables of the pavilions which protrude slightly at each corner and at the center of the east and west facades. All elevations are symmetrical, with east and west, and north and south, being identical.

The round arch, with large voussoirs, is liberally utilized. It is found in all four entrances, in the paired first-floor windows, and on the second story of each pavilion, where triple windows give an arcade effect. Basement windows have flat heads, and broad stone lintels.

Main entrances are on north and south ends, reached by stone steps. The doorways are recessed beneath large stone p orches supported by pairs of very short, squat pillars. East and west entrances, which open directly from the basement level, have been filled in. Above each of these is a small blind arcade, formed by pilasters, with a single short pillar between them. The gable ends of the pavilions have small pediments and finials. Centered above the north and south entrances are small, pedimented roof dormers. Of interest is the wide cornice, which has a course of arcaded corbelling.

The courthouse was originally designed and built with a tower common to expressions of this style. The tower was removed in 1899, apparently for structural reasons, since the order for removal was coupled (in Supervisors' minutes) with an order to reinforce or double the existing truss system. The windows have also been altered: the upper sections, including tympana, are filled in with a narrow ashlar. The lower window sections now combine plate glass and glass block.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although removal of the tower and filling-in of window openings has considerably altered architect Bell's original design, the Shelby County Courthouse retains its essential Richardsonian character. The impression of overwhelming mass is strong in this building, partly due to the inherent nature of the style, but reinforced by the loss of the tower, which originally may have drawn the eye upward and away from the ponderous block.

This structure is Shelby County's fourth courthouse. The first, erected in the 1850's, was at the then county seat of Shelbyville. Harlan became the county seat in 1860, and a courthouse was erected on the main square. A larger facility, built in 1875, was about 1890 sold and moved for use as a livery stable. The present structure was built in 1892, the tower removed seven years later.
