


 Only the cut stone abutments remain of this former aqueduct that carried the Ohio and Erie Canal over Furnace Run. That portion of the canal between Akron and Cleveland opened July 4, 1827.

44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings  
 Rural. "Johnny Cake Lock" is approximately 1/2 mile to the north at Everett.
