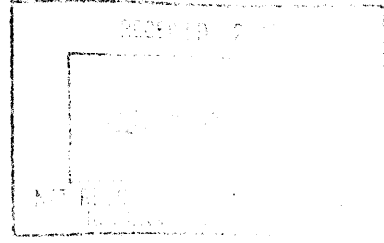

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7. Narrative Description

The Woodlawn Historic District is centrally located within the Woodlawn neighborhood in east-northeast section of Birmingham approximately 3.5 miles from the city's center. Originally a separate incorporated city, Woodlawn became part of Birmingham in 1910 and is now generally bordered by the suburban neighborhoods of East Lake and Gate City. The district generally extends along 1st Avenue North between 47th Place North and 61st Street North, with portions of the district extending south to Division Avenue and north to Interstate 20/59. The topography of the district is flat.

The street grid within the district is irregular and reflects the historical merging of the random layout of the former City of Woodlawn with the more formal street grid of the City of Birmingham. 1st Avenue North, the district's principal thoroughfare, proceeds from the southwest corner of the district along an angle of approximately thirty degrees from west to east. In the northeast quadrant of the district, the street doglegs more to the north and it is at this junction that the commercial core of the neighborhood is centered. A second principal thoroughfare, Messer Airport Highway, intersects 1st Avenue North immediately southwest of the district and extends through it from west to east at an angle of approximately forty-five degrees. With the exception of the parallel streets immediately to the north and south of 1st Avenue North, residential streets west of the core commercial area typically run north-south and east-west forming rectangular blocks of varying sizes. Streets to the east of the commercial core extend at varying angles forming irregular-shaped blocks.

The district is primarily residential, with 571 (92%) of its contributing resources and seventy-one (80%) of its noncontributing resources in that use. Residences are concentrated throughout the district except within the commercial core and along 1st Avenue North and Messer Airport Highway where only scattered examples remain. Of the district's thirty-one contributing commercial resources, twenty-five are stores, three are office buildings and one is a bank. Nonresidential buildings are typically located along 1st Avenue North with a concentrated downtown area surrounding the intersection of 1st Avenue North and 55th Way North and extending approximately one city block to the north and south. Several commercial buildings and churches are also scattered throughout the district. Additional contributing resources include six churches, four schools and one church school, a cemetery, a city hall and a fire station, a school gymnasium and a stadium, an electrical substation, and a library. The principal governmental building, the former Woodlawn City Hall, is located within the core commercial area and a library and fire station are located two blocks north along 1st Avenue North.

Residential buildings in the district generally fall into three stylistic categories: Late Victorian dwellings account for approximately forty-nine percent of all contributing resources, early twentieth century bungalow/Craftsman or gable front form dwelling represent approximately forty-eight percent, and the remainder including a mix of mid-twentieth century styles. Slightly less than ninety percent of the district's contributing residential buildings are one story in height with the remainder about evenly divided between one-and-one-half story and two story examples. Virtually all of the residential resources are of frame construction, with masonry accounting for only about two percent of the total.

Victorian dwellings were typically built between circa 1880 and 1915 reflect national architectural trends. Approximately seventy percent of the houses are pyramidal forms featuring hipped roofs with typical variants including hipped cores with lower cross gable wings or hipped roofs with single or double front gable projections. Other common Victorian residential forms include gable-front-and wing, gable front, side gable massed plan, and ell and tee plans. Stylistically, the houses are

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loosely based on Queen Anne patterns but generally of a more folk character with common decorative details including decorative wood shingles and/or window and vent combinations in gable ends, simple and limited sawn decorative trim, and turned or chamfered porch posts occasionally with simple gingerbread trim. Many examples have transoms and/or sidelights at their principal entrances with some retaining leaded glass.

Early twentieth-century bungalow/Craftsman or gable front form dwellings are scattered throughout the district with a higher concentration of examples in the northern and western sections. Bungalows and gable fronts tend to be relatively simple in design and detailing with many exhibiting simple Craftsman style details such as exposed rafter ends, angle bracketed eaves, porch pillars or supports on pedestals and apron walls. A number of examples are stylistically more developed and can be classified as good examples of the Craftsman style. Mid-twentieth century houses tend to be simple in character and the majority are representative of the minimal traditional form.

Buildings in the core commercial area are typically constructed of brick, one to three stories in height, and are representative of late-nineteenth and early twentieth century styles. Prominent landmarks within the core area include Woodlawn City Hall (site #92, NR 1991), constructed in the Beaux Arts style in 1908; the romantic French revival style Woodlawn Fire Station (circa 1930, site #83); the Victorian Gothic Revival style Woodlawn Methodist Church (1909-1912, site #85) and its Tudor Revival style school complex (1924, site #84); the Woodlawn Masonic building (1915, site #86); and the Tudor Revival style Woodlawn High School, (1922, site #103) with its associated gymnasium and stadium; Grace Episcopal Church (circa 1910, site #80); and the modern style Woodlawn Public Library (1950, site #81).

Residential buildings are typically located on narrow lots with minimal front and side yards and larger rear yards. Front yard depth varies by block with relative consistency within each block. Landscaping is typically casual and the residential areas typically retain mature tree canopies. Commercial buildings typically cover much of their sites, especially in the densely developed commercial core where party walls are common. Other than vacant lots, the district's open space is limited to Willowood Park, a four-acre site one block west of the Woodlawn High School.

Archaeological Component

Although no archaeological survey has been conducted, the possibility of subsurface remains is minimal.

1 Commercial Building, Not Named 1925 ca. 5000 1st Ave. N. Contributing
 Rectangular 1-story brick three-unit one-part commercial block with a flat roof concealed by flat parapets; faces south, three storefront bays at facade: western bay with replacement framing and a central entrance flanked by display windows with a continuous enclosed transom; center bay with historic framing with a central double-leaf entrance flanked by display windows on brick bulkheads and a continuous enclosed transom; east bay divided by a brick pillar with modern display window on historic brick bulkhead to its west and a single entrance and narrow display window to its east; painted exposed brick facade and west elevation, remaining brick walls set in common bond; continuous brick foundation. Construction and design details suggest that this commercial building was constructed circa 1925 and remodeled circa 1975.

2 House, Not Named 1895 ca. 5008 R 1st Ave. N. Contributing
 Rectangular 2-story frame dwelling with a complex roof form covered with composition shingles; faces south, central 2-story 2x2 core with hipped roof with front-facing gable on gable 1.5 story front-gable projection and rear extensions, polygonal bay at center of west elevation; modern 1-story brick commercial building with a flat roof has been added in

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front of its facade; side hipped porch with supports on brick pedestals, lattice infill; historic fenestration at facade obscured by modern addition, single and double wood 1/1 double hung sash windows at upper level and at side elevations; wood weatherboard siding, wood shingles at gable ends; 1 interior stucco chimney observed; brick pier foundation with infill. Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 1895 and remodeled circa 1965.

3 Commercial Building, Not Named 1960 ca. 5008 1st Ave. N. Noncontributing
Rectangular 1-story brick veneer commercial building with a flat roof. Construction and design details indicate that this commercial building was built circa 1960.

4 Commercial Building, Not Named 1970 ca. 5012 1st Ave. N. Noncontributing
Rectangular 1-story industrial metal commercial building with a flat roof. Construction and design details suggest that this industrial building was constructed circa 1970.

5 House, Not Named 1895 ca. 5014 1st Ave. N. Contributing
Rectangular 1-story brick veneer pyramidal form dwelling with a hipped composition shingle roof with a central decorative hipped dormer and a pedimented gable projection with flared eaves at the west bay of its front slope, decorative side pedimented gable dormers, gable projection has a single window with geometric upper sash; faces south, 2x3 bay core with a slightly projecting west bay at its facade and side gable projections; full facade gable on hip porch with historic wood columns on brick pedestals formerly wrapped to projecting bay at east elevation, east portion now infilled; entrance at east bay of facade with transom & sidelights flanked to the west by a triple wood 1/1 double hung sash window, similar single and double windows at side elevations; painted brick walls; 2 interior brick chimneys observed; continuous stucco foundation. Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 1895 and remodeled circa 1980.

6 House, Not Named 1895 ca. 5016 1st Ave. N. Contributing
Rectangular 1-story brick veneer pyramidal form dwelling with a hipped composition shingle roof with a central decorative hipped dormer and a pedimented gable projection with flared eaves at the east bay of its front slope, decorative side pedimented gable dormers; faces south, 2x3 bay core with a slightly projecting east bay at its facade and side gable projections; full facade hipped porch with replacement metal supports wraps to projecting bay at west elevation; entrance at west bay of facade with transom & sidelights flanked to the east by a single wood 1/1 double hung sash window, similar single and double windows at side elevations; painted brick walls; no chimneys observed; continuous stucco foundation. Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 1895 and remodeled circa 1965.

7 Commercial Building, Not Named 1940 ca. 5416 1st Ave. N. Contributing
Rectangular 1-story masonry 5-unit 1-part commercial building with a monopitch roof concealed by flat parapets with clay tile caps; faces southeast; facade divided into five storefront units by tile pillars, storefronts are aluminum framed and typically have central or side entrances with transoms flanked by display windows; exposed tile veneer exterior walls; foundation not visible. Construction and design details suggest that this building was constructed circa 1940 and remodeled circa 1975.

8 Woodlawn Branch Bank 1950 ca. 5428 1st Ave. N. Contributing
Rectangular 2-story masonry bank building with a flat roof concealed by flat parapets; faces south, 3x3 bay 2-story core with a 1-story wing along its facade; no porch; slightly recessed aluminum frame storefront entrance at west bay of facade with paired central entrance doors with transom & sidelights, grouped aluminum window system across eastern bays

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wraps to east elevation, similar aluminum windows at side elevations; front-1-story porch faced with stucco over a continuous structural glass bulkhead, 2-story porch faced with cast stone panels with central decorative fluted motif at facade; aluminum letters at eastern bay of upper level of facade read "WOODLAWN BRANCH", AmSouth Bank sign at western bay is modern. Construction and design details suggest that this commercial building was constructed circa 1950 and remodeled circa 1985.

9 Woodlawn M. E. Church South 1909-12 5432 1st Ave. N. Contributing
NR, Woodlawn Commercial Historic District, 1/25/91
2-story rectangular Victorian Gothic Revival style church on a raised basement with a front-facing gable composition shingle roof; faces south, 3x5 bay core with a rear gable 1-bay deep extension and 1-bay deep hipped extension, 4-tier corner tower at southeast corner with a hipped roof with central finial atop roof and corner finials atop parapets, 2-tier corner tower at southwest corner with stepped gable; entrances at 1st level of corner towers each recessed with an archway and set within arched openings with paired doors and arches stained glass transoms, entrances accessed by flanking stone staircases; grouping of three windows at central bay of first level includes a central double stained glass window flanked by similar single windows, large triple window at center bay of upper level within pointed arch; three single pointed arched windows grouped at the second level of both towers; triple rectangular lowers at third level of southeast tower with triple Luverne at fourth level within traceried frame in pointed arched opening; similar pointed arched stained glass windows at side elevations; cut stone exterior walls; continuous stone foundation. Constructed between 1909n and 1912 as a sanctuary for the Woodlawn Methodist Episcopal Church School; addition constructed circa 1950.

10 Woodlawn Masonic Building 1915 5502 1st Ave. N. Contributing
NR, Woodlawn Commercial Historic District, 1/25/91
Rectangular 3-story masonry 2-part commercial building with a monopitch roof concealed by flat parapets; faces south, 10x13 bays. Constructed in 1915 as the Woodlawn Masonic Building.

11 Commercial Building, Not Named 1925 ca. 5505 1st Ave. N. Contributing
Rectangular 1-story masonry 1-part commercial building with a monopitch roof concealed by flat parapets; faces north; facade separated into two storefront units by an off-center brick pier, east unit with a single replacement display window on a low brick bulkhead, west unit with a single modern aluminum frame entrance with transom flanked by a 2-panel display window; exposed brick veneer exterior wall with a flat parapet with stone details; continuous brick foundation. Construction and design details suggest that this commercial building was constructed circa 1925 and remodeled circa 1965.

12 Commercial Building, Not Named 1945 ca. 5507 1st Ave. N. Contributing
Rectangular 1-story masonry 1-part commercial building with a monopitch roof concealed by flat parapets; faces north; facade with rounded corner at northeast corner with corner entrance with transom & sidelights, flanked to the west by a single fixed display window with an oversized transom and brick bulkhead; facade appears to be clad with painted structural glass; foundation not visible. Construction and design details suggest that this commercial building was constructed circa 1945 and remodeled circa 1975.

13 Building, Not Named 1960 ca. 5514 1st Ave. N. Noncontributing
Rectangular 1-story concrete block commercial building with a flat roof. Construction and design details suggest that this commercial building was constructed circa 1960 and remodeled circa 1985.

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14 Commercial Building, Not Named 1950 ca. 5515 1st Ave. N. Contributing
Rectangular 1-story masonry 1-part commercial building with a monopitch roof concealed by flat parapets; faces north; facade with single storefront system with double central entrances with double leaf doors with transoms flanked by 2-panel display windows on low bulkheads, central doors and windows flanked by similar 4-panel display window; exposed brick veneer exterior wall finishes; foundation not visible. Construction and design details suggest that this commercial building was constructed circa 1950 and remodeled circa 1975.

15 Building, Not Named 1900 ca. 5516 1st Ave. N. Contributing
Rectangular 2-story brick 2-part commercial building with a monopitch roof concealed by a flat parapet at its facade and stepped parapets at its sides; upper level has been covered with stucco; modern aluminum storefront at first floor with an off-center entrance with transom flanked by fixed display windows, aluminum sign panel above; upper level of west and all of east elevation are exposed, west elevation has a series of segmental arched window openings that have been bricked in; five small segmental arched window openings at first floor of east elevation, four segmental arched window openings at second floor; painted exposed brick side and rear walls; continuous brick foundation; brick flues within parapets at side elevations. Construction and design details suggest that this commercial building was constructed circa 1900 and remodeled circa 1985.

16 White House Sandwich shop 1935 ca. 5519 1st Ave. N. Contributing
NR, Woodlawn Commercial Historic District, 1/25/91
Rectangular 1-story masonry 1-part commercial building with a monopitch roof concealed by flat parapets; faces north, 3x4 bays with a curved northwest corner; off-center entrance flanked by former display window openings now infilled with plywood siding and two narrow vertical fixed pane windows; west elevation has no openings; east elevation abuts adjacent building; modern stucco exterior walls; foundation not visible. Built circa 1935 as the White House Sandwich Shop, an "Art Moderne Streamline style commercial building," according to the documentation for the Woodlawn Commercial Historic District.

17 Building, Not Named 1950 ca. 5520 1st Ave. N. Contributing
Rectangular 1-story masonry 1-part commercial building with a monopitch roof concealed by flat parapets; modern aluminum storefront with a recessed central entrance flanked by fixed display windows on low bulkheads, aluminum awning above; facade covered with permastone, side and rear elevations stuccoed; foundation not visible. Construction and design details suggest that this commercial building was constructed circa 1950 and remodeled circa 1985.

18 Building, Not Named 1928 ca. 5522 1st Ave. N. Contributing
NR, Woodlawn Commercial Historic District, 1/25/91

Rectangular 1-story split faced concrete block commercial garage with a side gable roof. Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 2000.

23 Building, Not Named 1995 ca. 5547 1st Ave. N. Noncontributing
Ell-shaped 1-story brick veneer commercial building with a flat roof. Construction and design details suggest that this commercial building was constructed circa 1995.

24 Woodlawn Baptist Church 1965 5600 1st Ave. N. Noncontributing
Octagonal brick veneer church building with a conical composition shingle roof with center spire; faces south, octagonal block at front with irregular shaped 2 and 3 story educational wings to rear; fixed multi-light stained glass aluminum frame windows; buff colored brick veneer exterior walls; continuous concrete foundation. Built in 1965 as the Woodlawn Baptist Church according to a datestone on the building.

It occupies approximately two acres on 57th Street North at First Avenue, on land originally belonging to Edmond Wood and passed on to Obadiah Washington Wood Sr. who, in 1898, deeded it to the Wood family for burial of family members and descendants by birth or marriage. Like other settlements in the county, Woodlawn appears to have remained a sparsely populated agricultural region well into the mid-nineteenth century, attractive to settlers for its convenient location on the Georgia Road and its fertile, well-watered valley land.

601 Church, Not Named 1925 ca. 125 57th St. N. Contributing
1-story brick church building with a front-facing gable composition shingle roof with exposed rafter ends; faces west, 2x5 bay rectangular core with a slightly projecting corner bell tower at its southwest corner, a rear 2x5 bay flat roof addition, and a modern flat roof addition to the north of the first addition; no porch; entrance at east bay of facade within tower with double leaf doors, flanked to the north by a large tripartite traceried window in a pointed arched opening, similar smaller double window above the entrance, similar single 1/1 double hung sash windows at side elevations, single and double 6/6 windows at historic rear addition; triple arch at upper level of bell tower with louvers; exposed brick veneer exterior walls; 1 exterior brick flue observed; continuous brick foundation. 603 Woodlawn High School 1922 140 57th St. N. Contributing
Rectangular 2-story brick school building on a full raised basement, roof not visible behind parapets; faces south, 13 x 8 bays, modern 1-story irregular-shaped addition to the east, series of 1 and 2 story additions to the west; 5-bay wide slightly projecting central pavilion with cast concrete towers flanking outer bays and a continuous cast decorative parapet, recessed entrances at 1st floor of outer bays with cast surrounds with double leaf doors with transoms & sidelights, with triple pointed arched windows above, central bays have grouped windows with common surrounds in rectangular openings at 1st floor and pointed arched openings at 2nd level; flanking wings with slightly projecting end bays with triple 6/6 aluminum replacement windows; exposed brick walls at central pavilion with decorative diamond pattern created by glazed headers, brick set in Flemish bond. The cornerstone for the Woodlawn High School was laid on 26 April 1921: "Woodlawn High School/This stone/was laid by the/Grand Lodge of/Alabama A.F. & A.M./A.L. 5921 A.D. 1921/Percy B. Dixon/Grand Master." The school was dedicated on 4 February 1922 with 5,000 people in attendance and "a school built for 700 students opened with 913.ö The gymnasium building was constructed in 1953.

Rectangular 2-story brick building with a cross-gable composition shingle roof with stepped parapets at the side elevations of its front core; faces S, 5x1 bay rectangular core with a 7 bay deep rear extension; recessed entrance at 2nd bay from west at facade within a decorative cast surround with double leaf doors and transom, flanked by double 6/6 aluminum replacement windows with blind transoms and simple flat lintels and sills, similar windows at upper level, similar single, double and triple windows at side and rear elevations; exposed brick exterior walls set in common bond with decorative buttresses at corners; foundation not visible. Construction and design details suggest that this building was constructed circa 1930 and was remodeled circa 1985.

605 Woodlawn High School Stadium 1925 ca. 140 R 57th St. N. Contributing
Football stadium with a central concrete bleacher system with flanking brick stair pavilions and accessory structures. Pavilions have flat roofs with parapets and decorative cast stone trim. Construction and design details suggest that this stadium was constructed as part of the Woodlawn High School campus circa 1925.

606 Woodlawn High School Gymnasium 1950 ca. 140 NW 57th St. N. Contributing
Rectangular 2-story brick gymnasium with a flat roof concealed by low parapets with cast concrete caps; faces east, 7x4 bays with secondary rectangular 1-story wing at west side of north elevation; grouped metal industrial windows; exposed brick exterior walls; foundation not visible. Construction and design details suggest that this gymnasium was constructed as part of the Woodlawn High School campus circa 1950.

607 House, Not Named 1900 ca. 141 57th St. N. Contributing
1-story frame pyramidal form dwelling with a hipped composition shingle roof with a pedimented cross gable at the south bay of its front slope; faces west, 2x4 bay rectangular core bay rectangular core; less than full facade recessed porch with wood posts; entrance at north bay of facade within porch with a transom and a single sidelight flanked by a single wood 1/1 double hung sash window, similar windows at side elevations; replacement aluminum siding; 1 interior brick

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chimney observed; brick pier foundation with brick infill; contributing frame garage to rear. Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 1900 and remodeled circa 1970.

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siding; no chimneys observed; continuous brick foundation. Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 1910.

2-story frame pyramidal form dwelling with a hipped composition shingle roof with secondary cross hips at the west bay of its front slope and center bay of its east slope; faces north, 3x4 bay rectangular core with a slightly projecting rectangular bay at the west bay of its facade and a polygonal bay at the central bay of its east elevation; full facade hipped porch with a shed roofed balcony over its central bays and wood columns wraps to east elevation; central entrance at facade with transom & sidelights flanked by single aluminum 1/1 replacement windows, modern entrance added to the west of the historic entrance, paired entrance at porch deck, similar windows at upper level and side elevations; replacement asbestos shingle siding; 2 interior stuccoed chimneys observed; continuous stucco foundation. Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 1905 and remodeled circa 1965 and 1980.

Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 1925 and remodeled circa 1975.

Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 1890 and remodeled circa 1975.

Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 1890 and remodeled circa 1975.

Construction and design details suggest that this dwelling was constructed circa 1925.

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8. Statement of Significance

Architecture

Initially a sparsely populated agricultural settlement, the Woodlawn community developed into a substantial community in the mid 1880s, was incorporated in 1891, and saw its first major growth boom when Birmingham's street railway system reached it in 1897. Woodlawn emerged as a prosperous turn-of-the-century self-governing town. Incorporation into the City of Birmingham in 1910 brought increased city services and a period of prosperity during which the neighborhood boasted locally renowned civic, religious, commercial, and educational institutions and facilities. The neighborhood's surviving historic resources illustrate much of its late-nineteenth through mid-twentieth century development and are architecturally significant under Criteria C as a representative collection of period building styles. The period of significance for the district extends from circa 1880, when the area experienced its first major period of construction, through 1952.

The Woodlawn Historic District includes 712 resources, of which 623 (87.5%) are contributing. Only one of these resources, the Wood Family Cemetery (1824), is documented as having been constructed before 1880. Of the contributing resources, thirty-five percent were constructed between 1880 and 1904; eleven percent were constructed between 1905 and 1919; forty-two percent were constructed between 1920 and 1934; eight percent were constructed between 1935 and 1945; and four percent were constructed between 1945 and 1952. All resources were surveyed between 9 May and 28 June 2002 by David B. Schneider.

The contributing resources of the Woodlawn Historic District include a relatively small collection of prominent business, institutional and governmental buildings reflecting a variety of period architectural styles centered within a much larger collection of modest residences. Nonresidential resources account fifty-two of the 623 contributing resources (8.3%) in the district. Of these, twenty-five are stores (48.5%), six are churches (11.5%), three are schools (5.8%), and the remainder include a cemetery, a bank, three office buildings, a high school auditorium and gymnasium, a city hall, a fire station, an electrical subdivision, a library, and a religious school. Many of these buildings are clustered near the intersection of 1st Avenue North and 55th Street in an area that traditionally served as the community's commercial core. Thirteen of the buildings in the commercial core were listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1991 as part of the Woodlawn Commercial Historic District and one additional adjacent resource, Fire Station #12, was listed in 1990 as part of the "Historic Fire Stations of Birmingham MPS." The remaining nonresidential resources are scattered throughout the district

Residential resources reflect the district's major periods of growth. Late-Victorian dwellings comprise the largest collection and include 282 of the contributing dwellings (49.0%). Of these, the majority are based on common folk forms with simple Victorian style details applied. Almost seventy percent of these are variants of the pyramidal form and typically have tall hipped roofs with cross gables. Other forms include gable front, gable front and wing, and others. Several of the district's resources can be classified as being examples of the Queen Anne style and a small number of others are Foursquare houses that are transitional in between late Victorian and early-20th century styles. The second largest collection of contributing residential resources date from the early-20th century and includes 279 resources

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(48.4%). Again, most of these resources are more representative of common folk forms with detailing typical of the styles popular at the time. Gable front and massed plan forms are common. The majority of these dwellings have Craftsman style details, including angle bracketed eaves, exposed rafter ends, and geometric window sash are common. Fourteen (2.4%) of the contributing residential resources were constructed after 1946. Of these six were classified as minimal traditional, one as a ranch, and two were apartment complexes.

The district retains integrity, both in terms of its overall character and in terms of the condition of the majority of its resources. Notable intrusions have typically occurred along 1st Avenue North, where modern commercial and institutional buildings have replaced older residences. Scattered modern developments and building demolitions within the residential areas of the neighborhood have not substantially compromised their overall historic character. Of the noncontributing resources, most (86.6%) are residential with a variety of commercial uses representing the remainder. One-third of the residential resources are apartment complexes (34.0%) and the rest are single dwellings with some scattered duplexes. The majority of the noncontributing resources (90.2%) were constructed after 1952.

History

The neighborhood of Woodlawn is an irregularly shaped rectangle running in a north-south direction, located in east/northeast Birmingham, Jefferson County, Alabama, approximately 3.5 miles from the city center. Documented as one of the earliest settlements in Jefferson County, it was first inhabited as early as 1815. Later, in 1824, three generations of the Obadiah Wood family migrated from South Carolina to the Huffman area of the county. By 1839, son Edmund Wood settled what was to become Woodlawn, producing a prolific and successful progeny who impacted a lasting legacy on the community. The area grew slowly until development of the Birmingham Mineral District in the 1880s, when Woodlawn transformed within only a decade from a rural agricultural community to a working and professional class suburb. Though never the site of a major industry or planned company housing, it grew because of its proximity to the city and its location on street car lines connecting metropolitan Birmingham to the further outlying suburbs of East Lake and Gate City. Annexed into the City of Birmingham in 1910, Woodlawn peaked during the early and mid twentieth century, featuring locally renowned commercial, educational, religious, and civic institutions and facilities. After the mid-century, shifts in population and housing patterns paralleled expansion of the Birmingham Municipal Airport (now Birmingham

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International Airport) on the north end of the neighborhood and construction of Interstate 20/59 through the mid-section, and Woodlawn began a steady decline. City of Birmingham officials and planners stepped in during the 1960s with the first efforts to revitalize the neighborhood, addressing crime, blight, traffic, and housing problems. Local residents responded with participation in a Neighborhood Association, beginning an ongoing partnership with the City that continues to the present.

Woodlawn was first inhabited as early as 1815 and 1816 when the Hawkins, Riley, Eubank and John Smith families arrived (White, p. 15). In 1824, according to local historians, the Obadiah Wood family migrated from South Carolina to the Jones Valley, at the present site of Huffman. Arriving with his father was Edmund Wood, a native of the Greenville District of South Carolina. In 1838, at a price of \$1500, the younger Wood purchased 400 acres on the Georgia Road, six miles east of Elyton, shortly thereafter transferring the property to his son Obadiah Washington Wood (Carter, vol. I; Ferguson; Tutwiler).

With only minimal physical and documentary evidence of the settlement period, little is known about the community during its earliest development. Local historians hold that the first post office was established in the area in 1832, the community then being known as Rockville. Churches were not established for several more decades, Edmund Wood and others being active in the nearby Ruhama Baptist Church. In Woodlawn, the first place of worship, shared by all denominations in what was known as Union services, was built on land donated by Obadiah Washington Wood Sr. at 56th Street and Second Avenue, the later site of the Woodlawn Elementary School. Early homes have been lost, including the Edmund Wood Home "Willow Wood" at the present site of Willow Wood Park and the Obadiah Washington Wood Sr. home "Woodlawn" on the Georgia Road. O. W. Wood Sr. is credited with establishing the first general store, first post office, and first saw mill in the area, as well as granting rights of way for railroad and streetcar construction, and donating land for four churches, a school, and for the settlement of former slaves at nearby Zion City. The Wood Family Cemetery, containing roughly 150 graves dating from c. 1824 to the present, remains as evidence of early settlement and includes the graves of Obadiah and Edmund Wood and seven generations of Wood family members. It occupies approximately two acres on 57th Street North at First Avenue, on land originally belonging to Edmond Wood and passed on to Obadiah Washington Wood Sr. who, in 1898, deeded it to the Wood family for burial of family members and descendants by birth or marriage. Like other settlements in the county, Woodlawn appears to have remained a sparsely populated agricultural region well into the mid-nineteenth century, attractive to settlers for its convenient location on the Georgia Road and its fertile, well-watered valley land.

As entrepreneurs and industrialists worked to develop the potential of the Birmingham Mineral District during the waning years of the nineteenth century, Woodlawn found itself strategically situated between fledgling manufacturing plants and outlying suburbs. In 1870, the Alabama and Chattanooga Railroad, later called the Alabama Great Southern (AGS), completed a line through the Jones Valley, with a "grab post" erected at what is now 55th Street. In honor of the Wood family, the settlement was renamed Wood's Station, and a semblance of community began to appear. In 1878, Obadiah Washington Wood Sr. donated the land and erected the first school, the Woodlawn Academy, a one-story frame building on the site later occupied by the Woodlawn Baptist Church and the East Birmingham Church of God in Christ. Son-in-law John T. Hood served as instructor for several years. Subsequent growth led to the construction of a new school building

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by c.1884-1892, a three-story brick structure situated at the future site of the Woodlawn Elementary School. By the end of the decade, the first churches were established, the Baptists in 1886, Methodists in 1887, and Presbyterians in 1888. The Georgia Pacific Railroad (later Alabama Great Southern) was completed by 1883 and the Central of Georgia (later Seaboard Coast) and Birmingham Mineral line by 1888. The community was renamed Woodlawn in 1886, and, January 26, 1891, it was incorporated under a municipal government. Boundaries of the new city extended generally from 47th Street to 65th Street, between 12th Avenue North and 7th Avenue South.

Significant to the growth of Woodlawn was the late-nineteenth century development of the street car. Opportunity in and proximity to the up-and-coming City of Birmingham attracted laborers, professionals, patrons, and day trippers from the community's populace, all requiring a mode of transportation to reach their destinations. The AGS Railroad completed in 1870 provided the earliest accommodations. As cities across the nation grew and technology evolved, new modes of transportation became available. What became known as the dummy line, a steam-powered light rail line, proved uniquely suited to Birmingham's span of long distances between the suburbs, industries, and city. The first dummy car began operation in the city in 1885, and Birmingham soon became the largest operator of surface dummy lines in the United States, continuing even beyond the turn of the century. Service reached Woodlawn by 1887 with construction of the East Lake Dummy Line. A second steam dummy, the Birmingham & Gate City Railway, grew out of a franchise granted to the East Birmingham Land Company that was organized in 1886. Service began within the city limits in 1887 and extended the following year through Woodlawn along Third Avenue North to the Gate City suburb. The two lines intersected at First Avenue North and 56th Street, just one block east of what became the commercial center of the community. The ensuing years brought consolidation of a myriad of companies and, finally, electrification of the old steam dummy lines. Electric service came to Woodlawn in 1897 on the East Lake line and in 1898 on the Gate City line. The twentieth century brought competition of the automobile and the challenges of economic depression and world war, but light rail service prevailed well into the mid-century, actually spurred by the gasoline rationing of the war years. Bus service was first introduced to Woodlawn in 1931 but did not supplant the street car for over two decades. The Tidewater street car route, dating from 1913 and operating between Ensley and East Lake, passing through Woodlawn on Third Avenue South, ran the last street car in the city on April 19, 1953. For a few years hence, between 1950 and 1958, efforts were made to operate a trackless trolley, but these soon gave way to the city bus.

The late nineteenth century development of the industries of the Birmingham Mineral District and subsequent evolution of the streetcar system and outlying suburbs brought a decade of rapid growth for Woodlawn. The community entered the 1880s with a population of only 89, still a sparsely settled agricultural community. City directories of the period reflect the rapid transition to suburbia, beginning with the 1883-84 listings depicting the humble origins of the community. Listings included Postmaster O.W. Wood, general merchandising proprietor J. T. Hood, school principal W. D. Love, and twenty-four farmers who received mail at Woodlawn, then known as Wood's Station. Transition was already underway the following year, when, of the twenty-four entries, only eleven appeared in agriculture: five farmers, three truck farmers, two poultry breeders, and a dairy farmer. A second general merchandising store had opened under the proprietorship of J.W. Montgomery, a music teacher added to the staff of the Woodlawn Academy, two clerks and an assignee were employed at the local general store, and the first blue-collar laborers and commuters were listed, including a self-employed carpenter, a foreman at the Elyton Land Company and a worker at the Iron Mountain Nursery. Listings for 1886

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included a saddle and harness business in Woodlawn and a laborer employed by the Birmingham Iron Works. By 1887, the beginnings of a commuting professional class appear, with the listing of two real estate agents, a clerk, and an attorney who resided in Woodlawn and worked in Birmingham. A year later, in 1888, John T. Hood had established the Woodlawn Land and Improvement Company, located on Woodlawn Avenue at the corner of College and capitalized at \$50,000; the agency would become responsible for much of the subdivision and development of Woodlawn as a commercial center and residential suburb and continued under the direction of Hood until his death in 1913. Other agencies active in the community were Woodlawn Realty, under J. [B.] Gibson, operating between 1907 and 1932, its offices in the City of Birmingham until 1920, when it moved to Woodlawn. Another firm under the name of Couch and Dalby appeared in the City Directories between 1903 and 1908, briefly downtown and thereafter in the Woodlawn community. (City Directories, 1883-1888; Jefferson County Survey Plat maps,)

By 1890, the population of the community had grown to 1,506, a 1592.13% increase over the previous decade. A sampling of slightly less than half of approximately 330 residential entries in the 1890 City Directory depicts this drastic growth and transition of the community. More than half (56%) of those sampled worked outside of Woodlawn, primarily in the labor class (35%). A smaller percentage (15%) were employed in retail or clerical positions in the city, and less still (5.5%) commuted to professional or management positions. Approximately one-third (32%) were employed locally, primarily self-employed laborers (15%) or professional and merchant class (11%), with only a fraction listed in agriculture (3%) and even less in clerical and retail jobs (2%). Professional and management jobs in the city included real estate agents, attorneys, and contractors, while locally there were physicians, pastors, educators, one attorney, one real estate agent, and several merchants. A significant number (12%) did not report employment. (City Directory, 1890)

Upon incorporation in 1891, Woodlawn entered an eighteen-year period of self-government. Improvements included sidewalks, waterworks, fire service, school construction, telephone service and completion of the City Hall and jail. The fire department had grown from a nine-horse operation in 1888, to fifteen-horses in 1890, to its first motorized equipment in 1909. The Woman's Study Club organized in 1895 and became instrumental in establishing a public library in 1905. Later, in 1921, the club became a member of the Progressive Era Alabama Federation of Women's Clubs (AFWC) and General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC). A Masonic Lodge, the Woodlawn Fraternal Lodge #525 AF&AM, was organized in 1892. Schools established during the period included Woodlawn Central, Gibson, and Kennedy Elementary and Woodlawn High for whites and Patterson school for blacks. Grace Episcopal Church and St. Clements Catholic Church were also founded at this time. A commercial center had developed at what is now 55th Place and First Avenue North, as depicted on a sketch map of the area around 1900 prepared by J.P. Wood and visible in extant buildings dating to the period. The business section of the 1908 Birmingham City Directory lists some 60 establishments in the community, including five general merchandising stores, fifteen grocers (all except four working at their place of residence), an undertaker, two drycleaners, two contractors, one druggist, three real estate agencies, a justice of the peace, seven physicians, a plumber, portraitist, and three shoemakers. Construction of the Beaux Arts style Woodlawn City Hall in 1908 evidenced the community's civic pride and economic prosperity, and accommodated the municipal government, fire station, civic auditorium, and second-floor library, with as an adjacent jail dating from the same year. An 1888 Beers map details ownership of property, the large holdings by Wood family members glimpsing the widespread impact of the family on the community. Other historic maps from the period indicate the area comprising the community, reflecting the

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residential boom as well as depicting the roads and rail lines passing through it. Woodlawn entered the new century as a thriving suburban community with an economically prosperous and civic-minded citizenry. By 1910, the community's population was reported at 3750.

As the community of Woodlawn and the City of Birmingham continued to grow, a support for annexation into the city steadily increased. In 1898, city boosters began a "Greater Birmingham" promotion, seeking to add suburban areas to the city so that the 1900 census would reflect the "true population," as well as increasing the tax base and allowing for the provision of unified city services. Though not succeeding by the turn of the century, annexation gradually gained the support of nearly all involved: the business and residential groups within the city, suburban residents, real estate, and labor. A referendum of 1908 was supported by six of ten suburbs, Woodlawn voting in favor. On January 1, 1910, Greater Birmingham officially expanded its boundaries to 48 square miles and its population to 132,685, comprised of roughly 60,000 within Old Birmingham and 70,000 in the annexed suburbs, an increase of 245% for the decade. The results of annexation were a significant improvement of city services to the annexed suburbs, an ultimate end in 1911 to the ward-alderman system of government in favor of a City Commission, and the addition of an industrial tax base which, though smaller than that provided by the suburbs, offset expenditure of services to the suburbs. By 1921, when Birmingham celebrated its golden anniversary, annexation had launched the city to the position of major metropolis on a national ranking and a leading industrial city of the South.

With annexation, Woodlawn entered its period of greatest prosperity and began to take on a physical appearance it maintains to the present. Substantial housing development had taken place by 1911 when the Sanborn Fire Insurance Company recorded its first set of maps for the community. Residences were almost exclusively of frame construction, on lots generally around fifty feet wide and 150' deep. Based on the houses that survive today, the vast majority of these pre-1911 houses were folk Victorian form houses, many of which had hipped roofs with cross gable and simple Victorian detailing. Random street patterns reflected the unplanned growth of the community, with First Avenue being the principal east-west thoroughfare and Church Street/Eighth Avenue North and the Macadam Road the primary secondary routes. Only a handful of brick houses appeared, but brick commercial, religious, and educational buildings were present, including nearly a dozen commercial buildings, City Hall, 56th Street Baptist Church, Woodlawn Methodist Episcopal Church South (vener), Woodlawn Public School, Gibson School, and Kennedy School. Small industries appeared, generally at the outskirts of the community and close to railroad tracks, including the First Avenue Lumber Company, I. E. Hood Lumber Company, and the White Blakeslee Manufacturing Company. The population growth led to the establishment of churches beyond the nucleus of the community, including the West Woodlawn Baptist Church, West Woodlawn Methodist Church, St. Clements Roman Catholic Church, and at least two African American churches, the Louis Street Methodist Episcopal Church at Third Avenue North and 67th Street and the "Colored Church" at Third Avenue North and Spring. Other commercial buildings were randomly scattered, reflecting the success of small businesses.

The height of development was reflected, in part, by the phase of second-generation buildings by most of the community's religious institutions. The Woodlawn Methodist Episcopal Church, who acquired property on First Avenue and 54th Street in 1907, laid a cornerstone in 1909, and held services in the new Romanesque Revival style building in

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1919. A Sunday School building was added to the site in 1925. The Woodlawn Baptist Church (formerly 56th Street Baptist Church) constructed a new facility in 1909-1911 on land donated by Obadiah Washington Wood. The Woodlawn Presbyterian Church replaced their 1890 structure in 1913. Grace Episcopal Church, originally established as Cavalry church in 1889, was renamed Grace in 1894 and added to the Episcopal Diocese of Alabama in 1902. In 1920, plans were made to replace its 1890 frame building, the result being a rusticated brownstone Gothic style building designed by Birmingham architect James E. Green. The cornerstone was finally laid in 1924 and services held in 1927. St. Clement Roman Catholic Church built a frame structure at First Avenue and Davies Street in 1910, constructed its parish school in 1916, and replaced the original house of worship with a brick building in 1928. Other institutions, such as Woodlawn's library, were a source of great pride for the community, becoming with annexation the first branch of the Birmingham Public Library. In 1922, Woodlawn High School was constructed on the site of the Wood family springs, special sewage systems being installed to divert the underground water. A new facility for the Gibson School dated from 1925. The Edmund Wood Home, Willow Wood, was purchased in 1926 by the City of Birmingham for use as a public park and community center known as the Willow Wood Park and Community House. It included a swimming pool, measuring 95' x 45' and fed by fifteen natural springs, added to the grounds in 1922 by Miss Della Wood, granddaughter of Edmund Wood, who graciously allowed the community use of the pool.

Sanborn Maps from 1930 further indicate the height of community development during the early twentieth century. Wood continued to be the dominant building material, but brick and stone residences, as well as duplex housing, appeared much more frequently. Stylistically, housing built in the early twentieth century included mostly small scale bungalows, many of which were simple gable front houses often with simple Craftsman style details including angle bracketed eaves, exposed rafter ends and geometric window sash. The first filling stations and garages reflected the impact of the automobile, and the first restaurant, movie theater, and swimming pool indicated a trend toward recreation and leisure made possible by the prosperity of the era.

The 1930s saw the advent of air transportation that would have positive impact on the city as a whole but would adversely affect the community of Woodlawn, eventually drastically increasing the amount of automobile traffic, producing extreme noise pollution, and encroaching on undeveloped and residential land. By 1929, the first air service had begun in the city at Roberts Field in West Birmingham. In 1931, the Birmingham Municipal Airport was dedicated at its present site, funded by a \$1 million bond issue and supported by the Birmingham City Commission, the Chamber of Commerce, and city residents. While it is difficult to assess the impact of the development of the airport on the primarily residential Woodlawn neighborhood, the airport certainly became a destination for increased automobile traffic along what was historically known as Macadam Road (now Messer Airport Highway) and its continuation along 50th Street.

At mid-century, Woodlawn continued its tradition of civic pride and excellence of service to the community. Woodlawn High school in 1939 boasted the addition to the proscenium arch of the auditorium of an 816 square foot mural by Sidney W.J. Van Scheck entitled "Panorama of Youth's Strife in the Approach to Life's Problems" and featuring more than a dozen nine-foot heroic figures and four fourteen-foot super-heroic figures. Additions were also made to Gibson school in 1944 and 1949-1950. A local newspaper begun in 1944 was short-lived, however, being absorbed by the Tarrant City

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News in 1951, the Trussville News in 1952, thereafter known as the East End News. A World War II memorial was erected in 1945 by the Rogers Brothers Post #3565 of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, in honor of local brothers killed on the same ship. A memorial service was held in 1946 in remembrance of the seventy-two Woodlawn students and graduates killed in World War II. Of great pride to the community was the construction of a new library in 1950 (architect Van Kuren, Davis & Company), the Eastern Health Center at First Avenue South and 57th Street in the same year (funded by Hill-Burton grant; architect E. V. Van Kuren), and the Woodlawn Branch of the First National Bank of Birmingham (architect Warren, Knight, & Davis) in 1951. In addition to these civic projects, residential development continued on the scattered vacant parcels that still remained within the neighborhood especially along its northern and western edges.

Modern development projects included renovation and addition to the Woodlawn High School, a new building in 1965 for the Woodlawn Baptist Church, and a renovation of the Woodlawn Elementary School in 1967. Construction of Interstate 59/20 began during the period, eventually taking 200 acres of land from Woodlawn and bisecting it across the middle. The community soon was to face new challenges, however, and, as Woodlawn reached mid-century, it began a transition from the prosperous streetcar suburb to a declining and outmoded community unable to meet the modern age of the automobiles and aviation.

In the early 1960s, the City of Birmingham Planning Commission began efforts at planned development of the city, producing in 1961 a report entitled "Birmingham Neighborhoods and Communities" that established geographical units to be used in future planning studies as a basis for Neighborhood Analysis and ultimately for a Community Renewal Plan. The Woodlawn neighborhood tabulated a population of 7427 and area of 336 acres, with no elementary schools, one five-acre park, local shopping, a fully-developed density of 20.5 persons per acre, a mixture of single-, two-, and multi-family housing, and a racial mixture of white- and non-white. A follow-up Neighborhood Analysis report in 1967 located areas of deterioration, obsolescence, and decay, determined and analyzed their causes and contributing factors. By the next decade, news articles of the period reported significant deterioration of the neighborhood. Fear of burglary and robbery was so high that businesses locked their stores during the day and customers were being robbed on the sidewalks and streets outside.

Woodlawn's population in 1960 totaled 6372, increased to 6964 in 1970, then drastically decreased to 5527 in 1977. Shifts in racial composition appeared during the decade, reporting roughly 20% black and 80% white in 1970 compared with 38% black and 62% white in 1977. Owner occupied housing decreased from 43% to 31% in the same period; unemployment increased from 5% to 33%; retired persons increased from 6% to 23%. As Woodlawn had moved past the mid-twentieth century, it had entered a decline reflected in population and housing shifts and paralleled by construction of Interstate 20/59 and expansion of the Birmingham Municipal Airport. The City of Birmingham and the local neighborhood soon joined forces in efforts to reverse the trend. (Neighborhood Analysis, 1978, p.4-5 to 4-9).

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Woodlawn entered the new millennium as one of Jefferson County's oldest communities, having survived for over one hundred seventy-five years. It had passed from a sparsely populated agricultural settlement to a suddenly booming streetcar suburb during its first phase of development, emerging as a prosperous turn-of-the-century self-governing town. Incorporation into the City of Birmingham had brought increased city services and a period of prosperity during which the neighborhood boasted locally renowned civic, religious, commercial, and educational institutions and facilities. Each phase of development had been impacted by transportation, its settlement dependent on its location on the Georgia Road, the earliest route into the fertile Jones Valley. Next, its situation on the railroad and streetcar routes of the 1870s and 1880s led to its rapid growth, providing a means to reach employment in the burgeoning industries and businesses in the Birmingham Mineral District and the young City of Birmingham. Prosperity was fleeting, however, as the age of the automobile brought mid-twentieth century challenges of an increasingly transient population, greater traffic congestion, and commercial competition from outlying shopping centers. As the natural aging process took its toll on the citizenry, institutions, and buildings, the community met its greatest adversaries: the Birmingham Municipal Airport (later Birmingham International) and Interstate 20/59, one encroaching on the neighborhood from the north and the other bisecting it through the middle. The resultant shift in demographics to a population of lower median income, higher population density and lower owner-occupation threatened the community's existence with crime, deterioration, and unemployment. The City of Birmingham responded with funding and expertise for revitalization, matched by local support of the residential and business sectors of the neighborhood. With the success of the Citizen Participation program, the Woodlawn Business Association, and Stride Forward Woodlawn, the community stands poised at the brink of rebirth, its local infrastructure established and amenable to the direction of city planners.

Then proceed southwest along the southern property lines of 112 61st Street North, 117 60th Street North and 116 60th Street North to the centerline of the alley between 60th Street North and 59th Street North. Then proceed along the centerline of the alley to the projection of the southern property line of 5915 1st Court North. Then proceed southwest along the southern property lines of 5901 through 5915 1st Court North to the centerline of 59th Street North. Then proceed along the centerline of 59th Street North to the southern property line of 120 59th Street North. Then proceed southwest along the southern property line of 120 59th Street North to the centerline of the alley between 59th and 58th Streets North. Then proceed southeast along the centerline of the alley to the centerline of 1st Avenue North. Then proceed southwest along the centerline of 1st Avenue North to the projection of the western property line of 5709 1st Avenue North. Then proceed southeast along the eastern property line of 5709 1st Avenue North to the southern property line of 5709 1st Avenue North. Then proceed southwest along the southern property line of 5709 1st Avenue North to the

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eastern property line of 15 57th Street. Then proceed southeast along the eastern property line of 15 57th Street to the centerline of 1st Avenue South. Then proceed southwest along the centerline of 1st Avenue South to the projection of the southern property line of 5623 1st Avenue North. The proceed southwest along the rear property lines of 5601 through 5623 1st Avenue North to the centerline of 56th Street. Then proceed southeast along the centerline of 56th Street to the centerline of 1st Avenue South. Then proceed southwest along the centerline of 1st Avenue South to the centerline of 55th Place. Then proceed northwest along the centerline of 55th Place to the projection of the southern property line of 2 55th Place North. Then proceed along the southern property line of 2 55th Place North to its rear property line. Then proceed northwest along the rear property lines of the properties facing 55th Place to the rear property line of 5525 1st Avenue North. Then proceed southwest along the rear property lines of the properties facing 1st Avenue North to the western property line of 5505 1st Avenue North. Then proceed northwest along the western property line of 5505 1st Avenue North to the centerline of 1st Avenue North. Then proceed southwest along the centerline of 1st Avenue North to the projection of the western property line of 5416 1st Avenue North. Then proceed north along the western property line of 5416 1st Avenue North to the rear property line of 5410 1st Avenue North. Then proceed west along the rear property line of 5410 1st Avenue North to the eastern property lines of the properties facing the east side of 54th Street North. Then proceed north along the eastern property lines of the properties facing the east side of 54th Street North to the rear property lines of the properties fronting along Georgia Road. Then proceed west along the rear property lines of the properties fronting along Georgia Road to the centerline of 54th Street North. Then proceed south along the centerline of 54th Street North to the projection of the southern property line of 106 54th Street North. Then proceed west along the southern property line of 106 54th Street North to the centerline of the alley between 53rd and 54th Streets North. The proceed south along the alley to the southern property line of 209 53rd Street North. Then proceed north along the western property line of 4719 9th Terrace North to the centerline of 9th Terrace North. Then proceed west along the centerline of 9th Terrace North to the western property line of 4716 9th Terrace North. then proceed north along the western property line of 4716 9th Terrace North to a line bisecting the

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property at 4716 9th Terrace North from west to east at its midline from north to south. Then proceed east along the projection of the line bisecting the property at 4716 9th Terrace North to the centerline of 50th Street North. The proceed south along the centerline of 50th Street North to the projection of the northern property line of 975 50th Street North. Then proceed east along the northern property line of 975 50th Street North to the centerline of the alley between 50th Street North and Messer Airport Highway. Then proceed south along the alley to the centerline of an alley along the northern property lines of the properties at 5028 through 5116 Georgia Road. Then proceed east along the alley to the centerline of 52nd Street North. Then proceed north along the centerline of 52nd Street North to the centerline of 10th Avenue North (Richard Arrington Boulevard). Then proceed east along the centerline of 10th Avenue North (Richard Arrington Boulevard) to the centerline of the alley between 52nd Street North and 52nd Place North. The proceed south along the centerline of the alley to the centerline of the alley to the rear of the houses along the north side of Georgia Road. Then proceed west along the centerline of the alley to the east property line of 5222 Georgia Road. Then proceed east along the centerline of Georgia Road to the rear property lines of the houses on the west side of the 900 block of 53rd Street North. Then proceed north along the rear property lines of the houses on the west side of the 900 block of 53rd Street North to the centerline of 10th Avenue North (Richard Arrington Boulevard). Then proceed east along the centerline of 10th Avenue North (Richard Arrington Boulevard) to the projection of the western property line of 252 55th Street North. Then proceed east along the western property line of 252 55th Street North to the centerline of 55th Street North. Then proceed north and east along the centerline of 55th Street North to the centerline of 57th Street North. Then proceed southeast along the centerline of 57th Street North to the centerline of 2nd Avenue North. Then proceed northeast along the centerline of 2nd Avenue North to the centerline of the westernmost alley between 57th and 56th Streets North. Then proceed northwest along the centerline of the alley to the to the centerline of 2nd Court North. Then proceed northeast along the centerline of 2nd Court North to the point of beginning.

Boundary Justification

The boundary includes the surviving portions of the Woodlawn neighborhood which retain sufficient historic character and resources to convey a sense of the district's historical development. Areas excluded from the district generally possessed higher ratios of noncontributing to contributing resources or otherwise retained insufficient integrity to warrant inclusion.

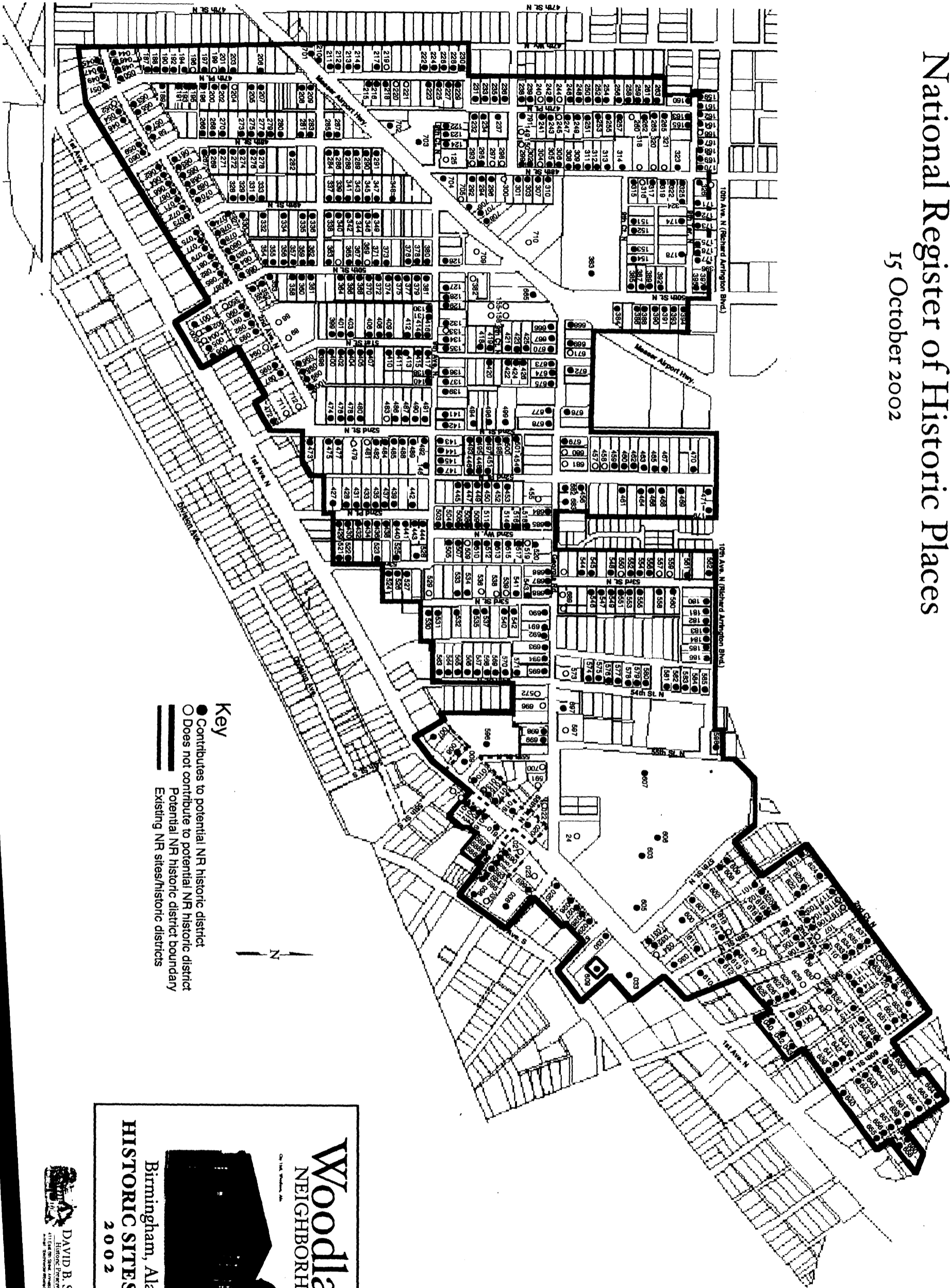
