Chimneys each gable end, S chimney has 2 shoulders on chimney ends only - flat breast, N chimney shouldered on ends at roof line only; water table; top plate returned on end. Original front porch with chamfered posts, railing gone; had matching porch on rear; 3 steps on rear of house. Original dormers in roof - 3 on front, 2 on rear; no gable end windows. High cellar has cooking fireplace, entrance on S end behind chimney; 1st floor door on S end in front of chimney.

Interior has unique floor plan - 4 room plan plus stair hall in center part of rear of house. Walnut panelled wainscote, double faced doorways, ovals trim, no orig. mantels.

Sited on broad, almost flat, land. No significant outbuildings. Cemetery S.E. of house has Scott graves and Edwin Roberts, minister. (Roberts Chapel across 27 from house)

Beginning at A running N 120 ft to B, thence E 270 ft to C, thence S 120 ft to D, thence W 270 ft to the beginning, containing only the house and yard which is fenced on the S and E. No other significant buildings - about 3/4 acre
