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Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The \$500,000 Farmers Public Market was considered "the last word" in marketplace construction when it opened in 1928. Spanish Colonial Revival style architecture - extremely popular in the Southwest at this time with its gracious lines, varied colors, and terra cotta ornamentation - still distinguishes the buildings today, despite obvious signs of aging.

The two-story main building is 125 by 150 feet in size. walls are of clay tile surfaced with stucco. Floors are slabs of reinforced concrete over structural steel joists, making it virtually fireproof throughout. Principal roof materials consist of built up felts and asphalt over steel. Towers and decorative second floor overhangs are covered with Spanish tile.

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On three sides of the major structure was a wood-frame market mall. Once roughly "U" shaped, this mall, which was made up of produce stalls, increased the overall dimensions of the market complex to 320 by 210 feet. The south portion of the "U" was later removed after being partially destroyed by fire (the only significant alteration over the years) and that area is now open and used for parking. The alteration has not significantly effected the structure's integrity.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Farmer's Public Market is significant in the area of architecture because of its Spanish Colonial Revival style and because it was the first planned public market in Oklahoma City.

Construction of Farmer's Public Market began in 1927, and it was opened on June 16, 1928, with great celebration. Spanish Colonial Revival style was extremely popular in the southwest during this period, and it was selected for the market. The building's gracious lines, varied colors, and terra cotta ornamentation are important aspects of the style used in the building's design. Farmer's Public Market is the best remaining example of a public building in Oklahoma City designed in the style.

Furthermore, the building was the first in the city designed especially for use as a public market for agricultural products. Such a center for buying and selling of truck farm and other agricultural products was of extreme importance for a community situated in a primarily agriculturally oriented area.

Farmer's Public Market continues in operation today. Some farm produce is still sold here, but primarily it has become a shopping center for antique buffs.
