



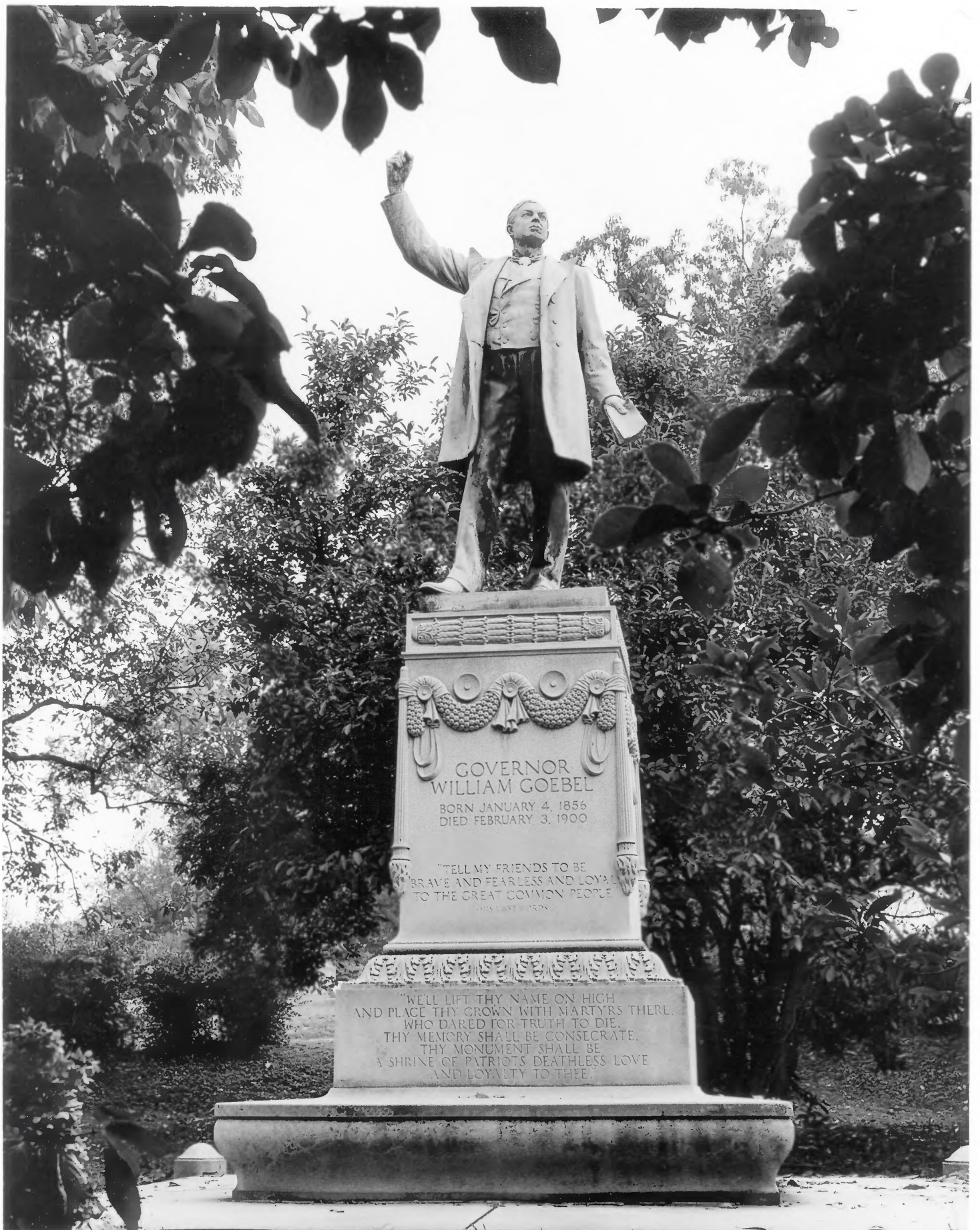

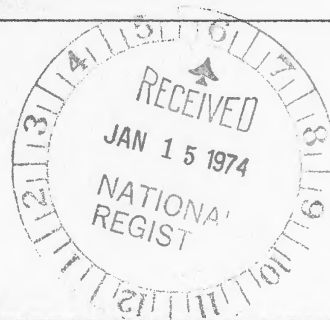
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Governor William Goebel Monument.

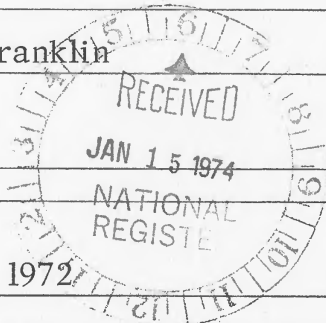


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Monument to the memory of soldiers and officers who had died or would die in defense of the United States.



DANIEL BOONE'S GRAVE
BORN 1734, DIED 1820 ENTERED EASTERN KENTUCKY 1767, EXPLORED BLUEGRASS REGION 1769-71, GUIDED TRANSYLVANIA COMPANY, BLAZED WILDERNESS TRAIL, BUILT FORT BOONESBOROUGH IN 1775, DIRECTED DEFENSE OF THE FORT, 1776, EMIGRATED TO MISSOURI, 1793, REINTERRED WITH WIFE REBECCA IN FRANKFORT CEMETERY, 1845.

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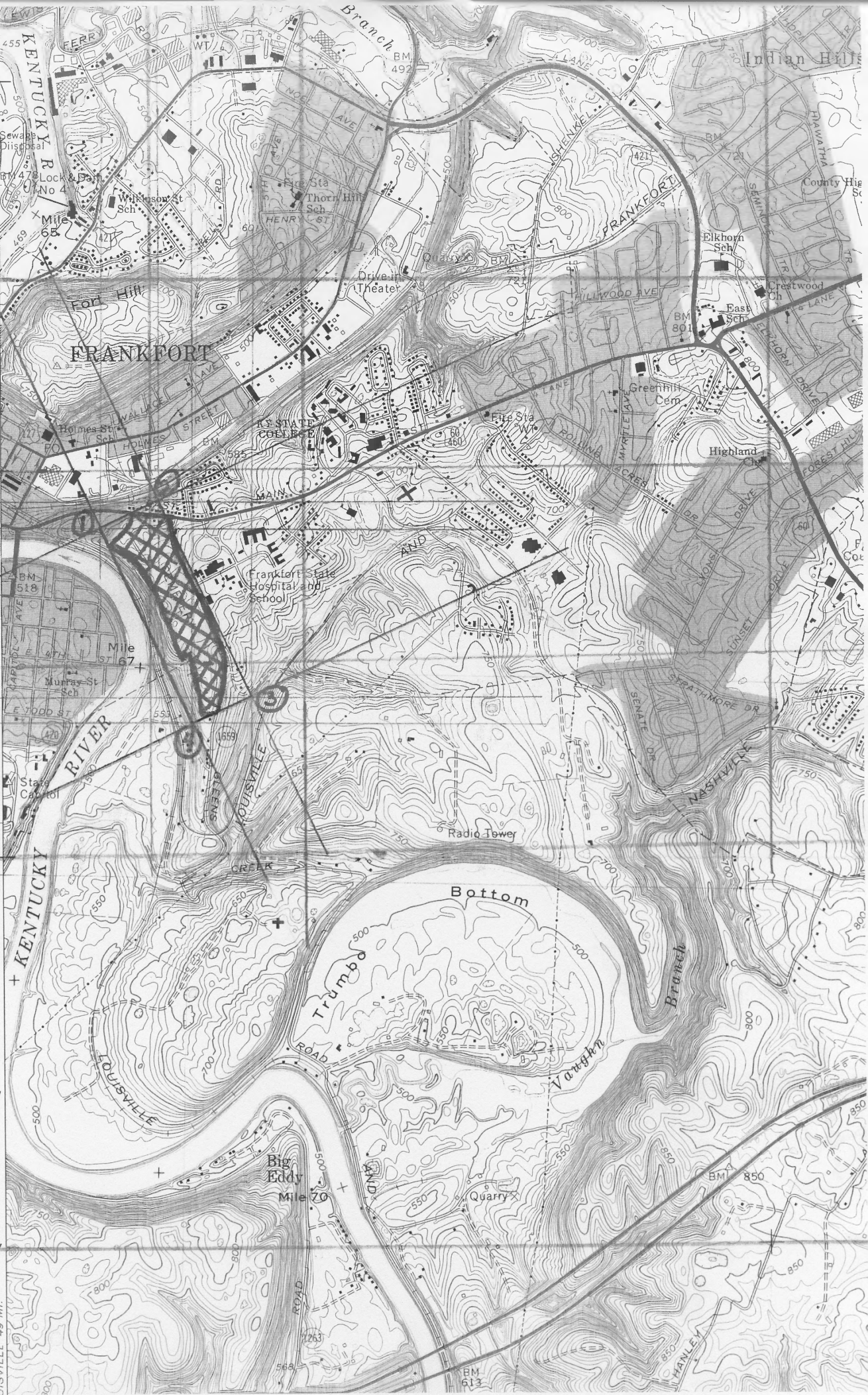
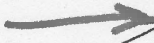
Monument to Daniel and Rebecca Boone. Facing north.
