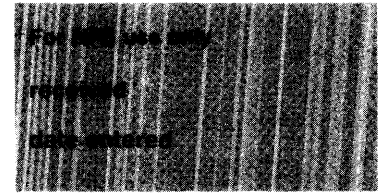

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A.C. Trumbo Home

The A.C. Trumbo Home is a 2½ story dwelling with stucco wall finish. It is approximately 60' x 100' and has a low-pitched hipped roof with cross gable in front. A two-story turret with conical roof is located on the northwest corner. There are two setbacks in the facade. The first is to the left of the front door and is 5' deep and 20' long. The other is located to left of the first and is also 5' deep, but 55' long. There is a canopied porch over main entryway and a 20' x 100' enclosed porch across rear. There are hipped roof dormers in rear and west sides and two red brick interior chimney stacks.

The two-story turret has three 1/1 sash windows with straight tops on each floor. Each window in the turret has plain lintels and sills. The centerpiece of the facade is a floriated stained glass window in an arched surround. The flanking wing to the left of the entryway portion has only one window on first floor. It is a 1/1 sash type with plain lintel. The flanking wing on east end of the facade has a blind arcade feature on the first floor. In the center of the blind arcade is a band of three 1/1 sash windows. This same fenestration and decoration is employed on the first floor of the east side. The first floor of the west side has one large 2/2 sash window, one small 1/1 sash window, and a band of two 1/1 sash windows. The small window and banded windows have metal awnings. The first floor rear wall has two large four-paned fixed windows in enclosed porch and a small fixed paned window to the left of back door.

Second floor fenestration on facade includes one 1/1 sash window to right of stained glass window, one 1/1 sash window in first setback wing, and paired 1/1 sash windows in second setback wing. Third floor facade has band of two 1/1 sash windows set in a semi-elliptical arch surround. The second floor of the east wall has two bands of three 1/1 sash windows separated by decorative mullions. On second floor of the west side, there are three rectangular-shaped 1/1 and one smaller 1/1 sash windows. The rear wall has four 1/1 sash windows on east end above the enclosed porch deck and three 1/1 sash windows in second floor over back door. The roof dormers have bands of either two or three 1/1 sash windows.

The main entry door is wood with large leaded glass pane in geometric pattern flanked by leaded glass sidelights also in geometric design. The rear door is panel-type with pane in the upper half.

Major decorative elements include several Prairie Style features including the central portion which rises slightly higher than the flanking wings to the east, the eaves extending well beyond walls creating a horizontal quality, light colored stucco finish, banded windows in selected openings, and the large stained glass window in the facade which is stylized with a floral pattern. Other decorative features include the canopied entryway, leaded glass main door and sidelights, and bell-like flare on lower slopes of cross gable in the front.

The grounds are delineated by a stucco finished wall with cast iron railing in the front and cast iron fencing on the other sides of the property lines.

A recently constructed 25' x 25' garage stands approximately 10' from southwest corner of the house.
