FEGERA

The Holdenville City Hall is a Georgian inspired structure built in 1910. The two story rectangular red brick building is enhanced with prominent stone quoins, belt course, keystones, second story pediment and first floor entry portico.

The front elevation is three bays wide and the side nine bays. A prominent metal cornice extends around the building.

The interior has been partioned into smaller offices than the original but all interior components are intact including tin ceilings, cast iron walk in vault (with pediment, lion's head, dentil molding and side pilasters), the original jail cells and second floor court room.

A 1951 rear addition for the fire department is stylistically in keeping with the rest of the building. New aluminum storm windows do not detract from the structure's integrity of design.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Holdenville City Hall is significant because it represents continuity and stability to the political, economic, and social structure of the town. This sturdy structure was built as a center of city government in 1910, has remained so for seventy years and will continue to serve this function for this small community.

In 1910 Contractor Jack Britton built the structure for \$8,700 on a partially leveled hill called "high point" one block from the main downtown intersection. Since then the building has served as center for city governmental functions as well as occasional social gatherings such as high school proms (in the courtroom area).

It is architectually significant because it represents a departure from the typical Victorian Romanesque and Western Commercial styles prevalent in Oklahoma architecture. The attempt to reproduce a more classic style for a public building is the physical evidence of emerging order of a frontier town.
