

## 45. Description and House Plan:

brick

The two-story front block, which faces north, has a side-passage plan and a facade of two rather than the usual three bays. The long one-story ell, also built of brick, was raised to a full two stories late in the 19th century, of frame rather than brick construction. The recessed porch in the east (left) side of the ell was repeated at the second floor, but with a different style and spacing of the posts and with a decoratively pierced parapet.

Exterior detailing includes stone lintels over the openings, recessed small pilasters flanking the transomed front door, and simple square porch posts in the ell's first floor. The brackets in the cornice may date from the construction of the second floor of the ell; the discoloration of the brick shows the outline of the original frieze board. The windows are 6/6 double-hung sash.

All outbuildings have been demolished, at about the time the farmstead was subdivided. The stone well of an icehouse is located near the end of the ell. Resource # Be-210 Boone County Page <u>3</u> of <u>3</u> Pages

significant to Boone County in the same period. The house is one of 16 identified in the county with this plan type and one of 33 buildings identified with primary Greek Revival elements.

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
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
