

Describe present and historic physical appearance.

Situated at the southeastern edge of the business district of New Albany, facing northeast toward Bankhead Street, the Union County Courthouse is a monumental Classical Revival building built in 1909. It is composed as a three-story, cubical central block, surmounted by a dome, flanked by slightly recessed two-story wings terminating in projecting end pavilions. Resting on a low stone basement, the walls are clad in golden-tan brick and trimmed in stone. The facade is dominated by a broad tetrastyle portico of unfluted columns in the Roman Ionic order. Slightly narrower Ionic tetrastyle porticoes adorn the northwest and southeast ends of the building. A stone-trimmed entablature with a modillion cornice visually links the two-story portions of the building but does not extend around the corners of the three-story central block. External corners are trimmed with brick quoins.

The windows are generally one-over-one double-hung, with wood sashes, capped by elaborate projecting lintels. The upper-story windows at the center of the front elevation, which would have originally illuminated the judge's bench in the courtroom, have been closed up.

The most distinctive feature of the Union County Courthouse is its elegant Baroque-style metal dome. It is supported by a tall cylindrical drum, framed by four clusters of columns, and is surmounted by an open-sided lantern bearing a golden eagle at its pinnacle.

On the first story the interior arrangement consists of a short entrance hall leading to a transverse corridor lined with offices. The corridor has marble wainscoting and a terrazzo floor. A stairway rises from each end of the corridor. On the second story a short corridor in each wing leads to double doors on either side of the large square courtroom. The courtroom has been remodeled and has lost its original furnishings, but appears to retain its original spatial configuration. The ceiling of the courtroom rises to two-story height and occupies the space that appears on the exterior as a third story. It is possible that the courtroom may have contained a balcony, but if so, no trace of it remains visible. Aside from the loss of the original courtroom furnishings, the building retains a high degree of integrity.


The nominated property also contains the county jail and the new chancery court building, both of which are located to the rear of the courthouse. Both are nonhistoric and noncontributing.




