DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The former McCammon State Bank is a two-story brick block in a Romanesque revival style. It occupies a corner lot; the original entrance opened onto the intersection in conformance with preferred banking house convention.

The design emphasis, too, is on the corner. Narrow round-arched entries onto the inset corner porch are set against double-width round-arched windows in the adjacent bays. In the upper story a more regular pattern is established. Segmentally arched windows alternate with flat pilasters, and stepped bricks are set into the corbel table in bracket fashion. The stories are unified vertically by the pilasters, which are interrupted by plain capitals and terminate in squared pinnacles. Horizontal articulation is achieved by string courses on the upper facade. On the lower it is provided by recessed "architraves," and by a foundation, sills and trim of rusticated stone.

Comparison of historic with contemporary photographs indicate that--except for the closing of the corner entry, the partial filling of both first and second-story windows, the whitewashing of the first-floor walls and minimal adaption of the storefronts to the conventions of modern commercial use--the structure is little changed from its original appearance. It is cornerstone-dated 1906.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The McCammon State Bank building is architecturally significant as a handsome and well-preserved example of a Romanesque Revival style in this small-town setting. It is the only commercial building of much pretension to survive in McCammon, dominating a streetscape of mostly modest one-story structures. It is in fact one of the few to be built, at any rate in such substantial material. Most of the important (and no longer extant) structures of the town--e.g., the Hotel, the opera house, and the roller mill, all built by H. O. Harkness--were of frame construction.

McCammon is a town situated 25 miles southeast of Pocatello in an agricultural valley. It is located on the Portneuf River, on the stage and freight route that dispensed goods from Salt Lake City to the Montana mines beginning in the summer of 1865. First William Murphy and then his nephew H. O. Harkness maintained toll road operations here. Later it became a convergence point for the Utah and Northern Railway with the Oregon Short Line. It was thought by local enthusiasts to lie along the logical westward route of the Chicago and Northwestern; it was the subject of considerable boosting around the time of its incorporation in 1908; it was expected to grow. The McCammon State Bank, chartered in 1907 and listing among its officers H. O. Harkness, who had become a millionaire cattleman and outstanding entrepreneur of the town, is tangible evidence of that expectation.

However, the hoped-for C.N.W. route was never built and McCammon remained a service center for a relatively small rural area. The former bank now houses the post office, some apartments, and several small businesses. It is the major architectural landmark and expression of early aspirations extant in the town.
