

Property Number 9, the 1923 Provident Life Insurance Co. Building (Maclellan Building), is one of Hunt's most outstanding office buildings in Chattanooga. Nine stories, the building is ornately decorated in the Classical style and has an unusual green tiled dormered mansard roof. It was originally selected to be included in the thematic district, but due to opposition from the property's owner, it was removed from the district after the nomination was completed but before the nomination was reviewed by the State Review Board.

Continuation: Significance

Soon after its founding, Thomas Maclellan, a Canadian banker, joined the firm as its chief operating officer and his descendants have been influential members of the company to the present. Robert J. Maclellan was the president of the firm when Reuben H. Hunt was commissioned to design their first permanent headquarters building. Up until this time the offices had been located in various buildings in downtown Chattanooga. The rear addition was added in 1950 to accommodate the growing company. By 1960 the firm built a larger building on the corner of Walnut and Fifth Streets and at this time the name was changed to honor the Maclellan family. The company owned the building until 1982. Today the building is owned by the Maclellan Building Limited Partnership.

Tivoli Theater (#7), the Maclellan Building is being included in the Buildings in Hamilton County Designed by R. H. Hunt Thematic Group because it is one of his best office building designs incorporating the Classical Revival style and one of the most distinctive buildings in downtown Chattanooga. The first three stories of this twelve story building are lavishly decorated in the Greek Ionic style with Ionic columns, garlands, egg and dart features, dentils, modillions and eagles at the entrance areas executed in terra cotta. Above this section rises a nine story tower with ornate cornice treatment separating the upper two stories also executed in terra cotta. The cornice is surmounted by one of Chattanooga's most unusual roof lines, a green tile mansard roof punctuated by segmentally arched dormers. Public spaces

The Provident Life and Accident Company Building is significant to this thematic nomination as one of the best designs for an office building executed by R. H. Hunt in the Classical Revival style in downtown Chattanooga. Constructed in 1924 for the Provident Life and Accident Company, one of three large insurance companies based in Chattanooga, its extensive use of terra cotta detailing and the elaborate Classical Revival style entrance mark this design as outstanding in Chattanooga.

The Provident Life and Accident Company was founded in 1887 by a group of Chattanooga businessme
