Summary:

The Confederate Section—Old Rondo Cemetery is located in Plot 72 near the center of the Old Rondo Cemetery at 1612 Smith Road in Rondo, Miller County, Arkansas. It contains 17 historic government grave markers, a small monument installed in 1962 and a historic marker placed in the 1990s. It, along with Plot 73, is contained within a rectangular concrete boundary.

Elaboration:

The Confederate Section—Old Rondo Cemetery is located in Plot 72 near the center of the Old Rondo Cemetery at 1612 Smith Road in Rondo, Miller County, Arkansas. It contains 17 historic government grave markers, a small monument installed in 1962 and a historic marker placed in the 1990s. It, along with Plot 73, is contained within a rectangular concrete boundary.

The Confederate Section is situated near the center of the Old Rondo Cemetery. From the northern end of the plot heading south, there are nine evenly spaced marble grave markers inscribed with the words "FIVE UNKNOWN/CONFEDERATE/SOLDIERS." A ziggurat-shaped fieldstone monument with an inset marble slab is located south of the first group of grave markers; it is inscribed "IN MEMORY OF/85 UNKNOWN/CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS/WAR BETWEEN THE STATES/ 1861—1865/ERECTED BY/ALBERT PIKE CHAPTER/UDC—1962". Immediately behind the monument is a metal historical marker with information on Camp Josephine McDermott. Continuing south of the monument are eight more marble grave markers, inscribed as are those north of the monument. The monument and historical marker do not contribute to the integrity of the Confederate Section—Old Rondo Cemetery; the seventeen marble grave markers and the surrounding concrete border are contributing elements.

Immediately adjacent to the Confederate Section and within the concrete border is Plot 73, which contains the remains of A. Archer, who was born Jan. 18, 1872 and died Dec. 12, 1910. It is not within the boundaries of this nomination.

The plot and markers are well maintained and in good condition.

SUMMARY:

The Confederate Section—Old Rondo Cemetery at Rondo in Miller County is associated with the historic context "Something So Dim It Must Be Holy: Civil War Commemorative Sculpture in Arkansas, 1886-1934" as a commemorative cemetery associated with the efforts of ancestral organizations in Arkansas. As such, it is eligible under Criterion A with statewide significance for its associations with the efforts of the Albert Pike Chapter No. 2057 of the United Daughters of the Confederacy to reflect members' perception of the noble character and valor of their veterans and their cause. Thus, it also meets the eligibility requirements of Criteria Considerations C (Cemeteries) and F (Commemorative Properties).

Elaboration:

On June 12, 1862, Brig. Gen. H.E. McCulloch ordered all Confederate troops located east of Tyler, Texas, to march to Little Rock, which was threatened by Samuel Curtis's Union army. These troops included the 19th Texas Infantry Regiment under Col. Richard Waterhouse. At least seven companies of the 19th were stationed at Rondo, just past the Arkansas-Texas state line, from July through early September. A fellow Texan encountered them there on September 6, 1862, noting that "we passed through a little village named Rondo. Near this place we encamped alongside the camp of Waterhouse Regiment for the night. They did us the honor of presenting arms as we passed their camp."

While camped at Rondo measles struck, killing dozens of Waterhouse's Rebel soldiers. (The 19th Texas later transferred to Camp Nelson near Cabot, where still more died of measles. Camp Nelson Confederate Cemetery, NR listed May 3, 1996). After the war, the remains of 85 Confederate soldiers who died in the measles epidemic were disinterred and reburied side by side in a common grave in the Old Rondo Cemetery.³

The Albert Pike Chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy was organized in Texarkana in 1931 and immediately began efforts to recognize the unknown soldiers in the Old Rondo Cemetery. Working with Congresswoman Effiegene Wingo, a granddaughter of Confederate soldiers, the group sought federal funding to acquire the plot in which the dead Confederates were buried, as well as marble markers for the grave. were seventeen markers placed, one for every five of the unknown soldiers.⁴

The Confederate Section—Old Rondo Cemetery was sold for \$1 to the Albert Pike Chapter on Dec. 7, 1934; the deed was recorded on July 1, 1938.⁵ The first Rondo dedication cemetery was conducted in 1934 and featured a speech by Confederate veteran T.T.C. Anderson.⁶

In 1962, the Albert Pike Chapter placed a sandstone and marble marker in the center of the Confederate Section in honor of the 85 disease victims buried there. The chapter also holds a memorial service at the cemetery every May.⁷

The Confederate Section—Old Rondo Cemetery is the historic property most closely associated with the efforts of the Albert Pike Chapter 2057 of the United Daughters of the Confederacy to honor Confederate war dead. As such, it deserves recognition on the National Register of Historic Places.






