III. Physical description of property and historical significance

Description: Five-bay frame, clapboard house raised on stone piers with hewn frame. Central hall plan with double parlors and rear wing. Two of the original four chimneys survive. Interior is almost completely original including mantels but the front door has been replaced. House has simple five bay Doric porch. The bracketted cornice was added later.

Significance: This five-bay, central hall plan house, with plain pillars and a transom side-lighted front door is a typical example of the simplest version of the Greek Revival when it was applied to residences in Louisiana.

Built in late 1860's by Captain James Pollard Murphey and derives its name from his wife Georgia Alabama Colbert. For many years it was the home of Laninia Blakey, a descen-


