The Livestock and Equipment Barn at the Glenn Homestead is a two-story, wood frame animal/equipment/feed building. Its plan is fundamentally rectangular, with a central drive and two flanking sheds. Its round metal roof covers novelty-sided walls, and the entire structure is supported by a continuous cast concrete foundation.

The front or western elevation is symmetrically organized around a large, central vehicular entry that is flanked by a single-leaf entry to the north and a smaller, raised square loft door and attached ladder to the south. A hay hood projects over the loft opening directly above and two flanking square fixed wood windows light the loft. Both the shed wall and the barn wall behind it are blank on the northern elevation, while the southern elevation is accessed via a single-leaf door to the west and four fixed windows to the east, each filled with two vertical panes. The eastern elevation is accessed via a larger, square entrance of recent construction to the south, next to the remnants of the original central vehicular entrance. Two fixed square wood windows are symmetrically-placed above and light the loft behind.

The interior partitions and agricultural furnishings on the first floor have been largely removed, leaving only the supporting structural members; however, the hay loft above remains virtually intact, and features all of its original curved wood braces that frame the round roof. In spite of the interior alterations, the exterior is largely intact.


