Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Atkinson Memorial Presbyterian Church (1916) is a one-story, frame building which combines elements of the Gothic Revival with the Bungalow style. It is now located in a park-like area of Morgan City on the grounds of the Civil War battle site known as Fort Brashear. Despite a short in-town move and accompanying structural alterations, the rarity of the church's Gothic features within the community justifies its nomination to the National Register.

Atkinson Memorial's Gothic Revival characteristics include:

- 1) single and double lancet windows on each side of the nave,
- 2) a squat pointed arch on the entrance porch, and
- 3) a pitched roof supported by a simple exposed truss system.

Its Bungalow features include: 1) a double gable facade, 2) tapered porch columns mounted atop brick piers, 3) bracketed, overhanging eaves, 4) a flared, shingled watertable, and 5) exposed rafter ends.

The church is organized around a simple basilica plan which focuses upon the altar. To the rear of the altar is a small sacristy. Other features of interest include:

- 1) Maltese crosses decorating the porch columns,
- 2) original pews and amber window glass,
- 3) horizontal contrasting bands used to emphasize the building's horizontality. One band is located above the watertable, another midway between the watertable and eaves. The facade has an additional band which separates the gable from the wall below.
- 4. the interior's three-part wall treatment. This consists of a vertical beaded board wainscot, a molded chair rail, and an upper wall covered by horizontal beaded boards. The latter also cover the ceiling.

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The building underwent some serious alterations in 1957 when it was moved four blocks to a more open space to allow for needed expansion of the church complex. The building was lengthened by moving the facade forward twenty feet and erecting an additional bay. At the same time, the gabled entrance porch was moved from the facade's right side to its middle, necessitating the removal of a double lancet window which pierced the facade's left side. This window was reused in one wall of the expansion space.

Despite the move, expansion, and change to the facade, the architectural elements which make the Atkinson Memorial Presbyterian Church significant remain intact. Although one of the double lancet windows was relocated when the massing of the bungalow porch was changed, the window does remain intact, as do all of the church's other original Gothic features. The enlargement of the nave was done very carefully, and all new materials match the original. For this reason, evidence of the expansion cannot be detected on the building's exterior and is difficult to detect inside the structure. Finally, the building still stands within a residential neighborhood only four blocks from its original site. As an example of a rare architectural style within Morgan City, the Atkinson Memorial Presbyterian Church is eligible for National Register listing.

Almost abutting the north side of the church is a large T-shaped educational building constructed at the time of the move. (The buildings are about a yard apart. They are connected at the roofline level at the front and rear to provide sheltered access.) While it is true that the education building is much larger and obscures the church's side elevation, it should be noted that the church remains a distinctive historic element.


Because the educational building is a separate building, it is being noted as a non-contributing element. Also within the boundaries is the site of a Civil War fort. It is listed as a non-contributing element because it does not relate to the significance of the church. Due to possible integrity problems, the fort does not appear to independently meet the National Register criteria.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Atkinson Memorial Presbyterian Church is locally significant in the area of architecture because it is a rare example of the Gothic Revival style within Morgan City.

Although Morgan City has a sizeable collection of historic buildings, certain styles are more prevalent than others. The collection consists of the following: 1) a small number of late nineteenth and early twentieth century commercial buildings with distinctive cornices, 2) a high number of shotgun and cottage residences which are restrained vernacular versions of once popular styles such as Eastlake or Bungalow, and 3) a small number of high style homes and public buildings. Styles represented include Greek Revival, Queen Anne, Eastlake, Bungalow, Prairie, Beaux Arts, Neo-Classical, Moderne, and Gothic Revival. Of these styles, the Gothic Revival is among the most rare. The Historic Structures Survey for St. Mary Parish records 444 50+ year old buildings in Morgan City. However, only four of the 444 show the influence of Gothic styling. The lancet windows, pointed entrance porch arch, and open trusswork ceiling establish the Atkinson Memorial Church as a member of this rare group.

Historical Note

The Atkinson Memorial Presbyterian Church was founded on March 14, 1876. It is named for Dr. C. M. Atkinson, pastor from 1878 until 1906.
