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

The Poulet House, a rectangular three-story building with a tower over its main entrance, stands on a hillside overlooking the business district of White Cloud. It is built of red brick and has a three-piece arched stone lintel over each opening. The tower, which is square, sits in the center of the front of the building. It acts as an accent to the main entrance which goes through the tower. There is one large window just over the entrance and two smaller windows near the top on each side of the tower. A two-story wooden porch which was attached to the tower has been removed.

There is a hip roof on the main part of the house while the tower has four gables. All roofing is of wood shingles.

Only two stories are visible from the front because of the sloping site. The back view exposes all three floors and two balconies with metal railings. The second floor balcony runs the full length of the building while the third floor balcony runs about two-thirds the length and is centered on the building. At even intervals under the eaves are pairs of wood brackets.

The interior has plaster walls and wood floors. It also has only one interior stairway.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			

The Poulet House was built about 1880 by Alexis Poulet, a White Cloud businessman. A native of France, Poulet came to Missouri in 1847 at the age of 16. After spending several years in Missouri and also New Orleans, he settled in 1857 at Iowa Point in Doniphan county, Kansas, where he operated a general merchandising business. After the Civil War he moved to White Cloud and operated successively a hardware store, a general mercantile business, and a bank. He became one of the most prominent men of the area.

The Poulet House is a good example of early residential architecture, built of brick and executed in the Renaissance influence style, complete with a rear balconied facade.


