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18. Description

A $2\frac{1}{2}$ story residence with stuccoed walls. An arched porte cochere leads to a service court. The main entrance is through French doors at the left of the porte cochere. There are grouped and paired windows, most of which have upper sashes of small panes. There are some stained glass windows executed by the Alberts Studio, a wellknown Louisville art glass firm at the turn of the century. Large brackets are beneath the wide eaves. The house is situated at the top of a wooded hill above the Ohio River. A driveway ascends the bluff and forms a circle in front of the house. On the north, or river side, a brick terrace and formal garden are recent additions. At the bottom of the hill is a small, frame passenger shelter built by Mr. Brandeis near the interurban tracks which then paralleled River Road. A stone gateway leads to stone steps up the hillside to the house.

19. History

The house was built in 1911-12 for Alfred Brandeis, president of A. Brandeis and Son,, grain dealers, and an organizer and director of the Lincoln Saving Bank and Trust Company. During World War I he served with the United States Food Administration in Washington. One of his brothers was Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis.

The architects, Kenneth McDonald (1852-1940) and William J. Dodd (1862-1930) were prominent in Louisville in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. They designed many fine homes in Louisville and Jefferson County as well as churches and commercial buildings. (see JF-531) A partial set of the original plans for this house is in the possession of the present owners.

20. Significance

This handsome Arts and Crafts - style country house is a significant example of the genre, reminiscent of the work of C.F.A. Voysey and Charles Rennie Mackintosh. (See Glenview Historic District and JF-544, 545, and 556.)


