DESCRIPTION

7.1 Introduction

Pemberton Borough is one of a series of village centers in the farm belt of southern New Jersey which border the Pine Barrens region, and is similar architecturally to other villages in Burlington County, such as Medford and Vincentown. The major portion of the Borough is occupied by the Historic District identified in the 1976 Burlington County Cultural Resources Study. Pemberton Borough survives into the late 20th century as a residential community which is undergoing transition. The cultural resources survey report assisted the Borough in defining the Historic District and plan for its preservation and revitalization. The special tax credits and other State and Federal Loan and Grant Programs available for rehabilitation could have an important influence in the preservation and rehabilitation of buildings and infrastructure.

The Borough of Pemberton is located in Burlington County, 6 miles east of the County Seat of Mount Holly. It is a transitional townscape between the Inner Coastal and Outer Coastal Plains physiographic province of New Jersey. The Inner Coastal Plain is characterized by its fertile prime agricultural acreage and gentle topography, yielding field crops along the lands which parallel the Delaware River. The Outer Coastal Plain, known more commonly as the Pinelands in Burlington County, is the outer shelf of the state containing important natural resources. Agricultural uses within this region relating to cranberry and blueberry production are located nearby to Pemberton Borough, particularly in Pemberton and Southampton Townships. (Pemberton Borough and Pemberton Township are independent municipalities).

Open space agriculture is joined with some hardwood swamps, pine oak and pitch pine forest that becomes prevalent east of the Borough. The surface geology consists of clay, silt, sand and gravel known as the Kirkwood formation. The Borough of Pemberton overlies Manasquan marl, the loose earthy deposit that contains substantial calcium carbonate. This material, marketed as a fertilizer during the 19th century, generated an extraction and distribution business in the Borough. The agricultural land west of Pemberton is contained within the Vincentown formation.

The most important environmental resource for Pemberton Borough has always been its location on the North Branch of the Rancocas Creek. The headwater of the Rancocas is formed in the pinelands and flows westerly to just beyond Mount Holly where it joins with the South Branch of the Rancocas Creek, then it flows into the Delaware River at Riverside-Delanco. The Rancocas at Pemberton benefits from the confluence of two lesser branches located to the east of the borough near New Lisbon. Numerous local and regional industries were built with the "hydropower" of the Rancocas in Mount Holly, Smithville, Birmingham and Browns Mills. The Rancocas cuts through the southern part of Pemberton and is joined with Budd's Run, forming the Borough's north and west boundaries. The village

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COUNT OF CONTRIBUTING AND NON-CONTRIBUTING RESOURCES

The Pemberton Historic District contains 182 contributing buildings and 8 contributing sites. Seven of these sites are the ones identified during the archeological survey of Pemberton and described in the nomination; the eighth is the cemetery associated with the Methodist Church (property #53). A second cemetery, associated with the early decades of the Pemberton Baptist Church, lies outside of the district. The district also contains 55 non-contributing buildings, and three non-contributing structures. These consist of the two bridges and the gauging shed at Budd's Run (properties #3, #33, #34). Altogether, the district contains 248 resources.

Included within this tally is the Morris Mansion and Mill property, individually listed in the National Register. This listed property includes the buildings listed in the present district nomination as properties #2, #4, and #5. Thus, of the 248 resources encompassed by the Pemberton Historic District nomination, three are already listed in the National Register.

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center is set on the crest of land between the Rancocas Creek to the south and Budd's Run to the north. Hanover Street, the major roadway in the Borough, bridges both the Rancocas and Budd's Run, creating a north-south grid area.

Geographical location has always been a key historical factor for the Borough. Connected by roads and railroads, Pemberton was a distribution center for field crops, berries and more. It was also an early service center for the lumber, grain, wood and iron industries. Maintenance of the nearby social and economic activities depended in part on the services provided by the Borough. Presently, Pemberton's location along County Route 530, between Mount Holly and Browns Mills, has created a gateway for traffic to the County College and other facilities located in Pemberton Township, the Fort Dix Military Reservation, Lebanon State Forest, the northern pinelands and the Jersey Shore, which must pass through the Borough.

7.2 District Overview

The Historic District Survey and Pemberton Borough Historic District consist of 227 items including two bridges. This analysis treats the three component buildings at No. 54 as three separate buildings (#'s 54A, B and C) and does not include the two bridges. Most of the buildings within the District (188 of 227) are residential, which accounts for 83 percent of the buildings within the District. Approximately 44 of these units are parted into 22 duplex units. There are 12 commercial buildings which represent just over 5 percent of the total. All of these buildings are located along Hanover Street. Another 12 buildings are of mixed commercial - residential use, and like the commercial buildings, they are concentrated on Hanover Street, between Mary and Pemberton Streets. Just four industrial buildings, or less than 2 percent, are scattered around the proposed District. Eleven (11) institutional buildings, including the Borough Hall, Fire House and several churches are located along Hanover Street (except for the Episcopal Church on Elizabeth Street). These large institutional buildings constitute 5 percent of the building stock within the District. Figures A and B of the Cultural Resource Survey present a graphical summary of this narrative.

An estimated 24 buildings or just over 10 percent of the proposed district are "pivotal". These adjudged "pivotal" buildings or sites contain special visual merit or importance in association with the town's history. Hanover Street contains most of the "pivotal" buildings. Approximately 20 percent or 43 buildings, have been characterized as "matrix". This refers to a representative or similar type of local architecture exhibiting good exterior integrity. The largest category of buildings identified in the District includes 105 buildings defined as "filler". Those buildings defined as "filler" are of diminished architectural significance due to alterations, or simply of lesser architectural interest, but in both cases, the age of the building is still evident. "Filler"

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buildings comprise over 46 percent of the District. An estimated 37 properties were classified as "compatible", or later buildings that are in the scale and material of the district and distinctive in and of its own time. This "compatible" category represents over 16 percent of the total. Finally, there are 16 "incompatible" buildings, which represent only 7 percent of the total. These "incompatible" buildings are defined as somewhat disruptive to the historic character of a streetscape, or a severely altered older building. This building category is scattered throughout the district, and therefore is not easily eliminated from the whole district. Figure C shows the classification of each building in the District. Buildings in the two latter categories are not contributing.

Some 35 buildings are believed to be 18th century houses. These buildings are concentrated on Hanover and Jarvis Streets and represent just over 16 percent of the District. Another 56 buildings were identified as being constructed between 1880 and 1850. These are similarly located and constitute over 24 percent of the total. The largest age group category includes 80 properties, which date between 1851 and 1900, making up 36 percent of the District. Some 46 buildings were estimated to date from the 1901 to 1934 era. These early 20th century houses are mainly grouped at the east end of Elizabeth Street and represent over 20 percent of the District. Finally, 4.5 percent or only 10 buildings are "modern", originating from the 1935 to the present (1985). Figure D presents the approximate building date for each building in the District.

The majority of the buildings within the Pemberton Borough Historic District are of a two to 2½ story height with gable roofs sloping front to back. These account for 58 percent or 132 buildings, that are sometimes in duplex form.

Generally, a steeper gable roof is indicative of an earlier, 18th century house. Cross gable roofed houses of irregular massing constitute 7 percent of the district for a total of 15 buildings. Front gables, where the gable roof slope is side-to-side, comprise 7 percent of the total or 16 buildings. There are 8 Mansarded forms of three stories which comprise just over 3 percent of the proposed district. "Bungalows" from the early 20th century comprise just over 6 percent of the district for a total of 14 buildings. Some 24 houses have "hipped roof" forms and include over 10 percent of the proposed district. 18 buildings cannot be categorized into any of the above noted building forms and comprise 8 percent of the whole.

7.3 Archeology

An archeological study was completed as part of this Cultural Resources Study based on cartographic evidence and archeological field work. Through the use of these two resources, a great amount of data was collected about the proposed District. Identification of sites was aided by a knowledge of plant species. The primary function of the study was to determine the location of

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industrial sites along the Rancocas Creek. These included a sawmill, forge, charcoal house and fulling mill. From these data, a more accurate boundary was identified for the Pemberton Borough Historic District.

The 1752 map was used to project lines and distances on the 1787 map (Figures 5-1 and 5-2). The first helped prove that the "landing" was not to the rear of Antis Avenue, but rather to the back property of the 1752 mansion. The 1787 map was helpful in locating the relationship between the "cole" house and the "forge". It should be pointed out that the 1787 map is a puzzling document. It appears to contain a mistake or omission that was only partly corrected (Figure 5-2). For example, while all the distances north of the creek conform to the 1752 map, the projected dimensions to the south of the creek are out of scale, thus making the forge site further to the west. However, the Forge Race is much too wide, and thus it is conjectured to have been drawn as Forge Street, before the mistake was found. If you were to take the Forge Race segment and place it at Hanover Street, the distance to the west would be correct. (Figure 5-9).

While interesting in that it denotes two dams, the 1829 map (Figure 5-3) lacks the detail to make it an accurate document. Of all the historical maps, the 1876 Scott's map has the best detail. (Figure 5-6). It shows the land configuration, dams, and the sawmill.

Githens Map (1984) of the proposed Historic District has an archeological section. He has indicated the location of all the known resources from written or cartographic evidence. (Figure 5-8).

In order to obtain field data on archeological resources a series of tests were made both on the island and in the area south of the spillways. These consisted of 1' diameter shovel tests and extensive probing with a 3' probe. Figure 5-9 presents the major archeological sites (A-E) identified in this cultural resources survey.

The "Cole" House

There is an extensive amount of charcoal in the area just southwest of the western riprap dam. Although not found, the "cole" house should be located at A (Figure 5-9). The location of this material proves that the distances on the 1787 map for the "cole" house are incorrect. However, it does indicate the relative position between the coal house and the forge.

The "Forge"

The forge was located slightly northeast of the "cole" house. Although slag was found in several locations, no evidence of the forge waterwheel pit or anvil

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base were found. All evidence, including a deep wet area and a long vegetation line, places the "forge" site at the approximate location indicated on B (Figure 5-9). The head raceway as indicated on this sketch is accurate as possible with the resources available. The tailrace appears to have gone at an angle from the forge.

The "Sawmill"

Evidence of the sawmill site was found in the creek bank below the dam. It also appears that a rock may have been placed in the headrace. This can be seen in the pond behind the riprap dam (conjecture). The archeological evidence places the sawmill against the stream and north of the present road as shown on C (Figure 5-9).

The "Fulling Mill"

The fulling mill is only shown on the 1787 map. No evidence of the mill was found during the field investigation. It is conjectured to be located near where it is shown as "D" on Figure 5-9. A deep wet area on the island may have been the base for the waterwheel pit.

The "Packing House"

This area was observed on the 1905 Sanborn Map, but it was not archeologically tested. Approximate location is "E" (Figure 5-9).

The "Pond Area"

The area east of Hanover Street was tested to determine the size of the original pond. While the overall size was not found, it was proven to be larger than what now exists (Figure 5-8).

"Budd" Sawmill Site

The Budd Sawmill site was located along Budd's Run. Because the precise location of the mill is not known, it was not archeologically tested due to limited time and resources for this study. However, the district includes this archeological site.

The Historic District includes all of the areas discussed in the study thus following the dotted line as shown on Figure 5-9. Evidence of the "cole" house and the "sawmill" were used to establish a corner of the Historic District. The forge site and fulling mill site, although not pinpointed, also fall within this area.

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County, NJ7.4 Streetscape Analyses

The following streetscape analysis corresponds with the Historic District survey numbering sequence from 1 to 227 shown on Plate A. It begins at the south end of Hanover Street and proceeds northerly to Budd's Run (#'s 1-85), then Mary Street (#'s 86-99), Hough Street between Mary and Elizabeth (#'s 100-105), Elizabeth Street (#'s 106-147), Hough Street around Early Street (#'s 148-150), Egbert Street (#'s 151-162), the Hough-Reynolds Street intersection (#'s 163-173), Jarvis Street from north to south then back to Pemberton Street (#'s 174-220), and finally to Budd Avenue (#'s 221-227). This streetscape analysis considers the street ensemble as a whole, inclusive of its buildings, lots, setting, sidewalks and related landscapes.

Hanover Street (Nos. 1-85)

Hanover contains the highest concentration of buildings in the Historic District, especially in the blocks between Antis and Pemberton Streets. This location corresponds to the highest ground elevations between the Rancocas Creek and Budd's Run. There the houses are located tight to the street and sidewalk, and spaced closely on narrow lots. To the south of Antis Street and to the north of Pemberton Street, the houses possess greater setback intervals and are placed on wider lots. On the south and near the Rancocas, the lots reflect the original 1752 layout for the New Mills Company (Survey Nos. 5, 6 and 75-83). This plan ("Company lot") established 66-foot (one chain) wide lots that were 285 feet deep on the west side and 190 feet deep on the east side of Hanover Street. The number of buildings on each side of Hanover reflect this density. On the east side there are 50 and on the west side there are 30 houses.

Hanover is the commercial and institutional spine of the Borough containing shops, churches and the Borough Hall. They are also sited on the higher ground between the Rancocas Creek and Budd's Run. There are few buildings in the low-lying areas to the north and south ends of Hanover. Notable exceptions to this open space character include the grist mill and blacksmith shop located adjacent to the Rancocas Creek.

The visual effect of the Hanover streetscape is to create a strong sense of urbanism in an otherwise agricultural context.

Mary Street (Nos. 86-99)

The repetitive building forms of Mary Street convey the strongest "Company town" effect in the Borough. Ironically, only a few of these buildings actually date from the period of the "New Mills Company". These houses are concentrated within two blocks of Mary Street from Hanover to Egbert. The duplex unit at 9 and 11 Mary Street (Survey Nos. 86 and 87) represents the earliest, probably 18th

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century era. The form is unembellished and the fenestration very simple. This worker's house was part of the Company property for well over 100 years.

The second grouping on the north side of Mary Street between Egbert and Hough are five similar forms with varying porch attachments (Survey Nos. 95-99). They date from the 1880's. Although simple in form, these have other qualities, such as detachment, alley access to the newest of the properties, and siting up on a mound as the street rises from west to east.

The third grouping (Survey Nos. 91-94) sits opposite the second on the south side of Mary Street. These houses have a front gable variation and date to approximately the turn-of-the-century. Both groups have turned porch supports.

Hough Street, Mary-Elizabeth (Nos. 100-105)

This block of Hough Street has properties on the west side that adjoin the Hanover Street properties. Numbers 117 and 115 Hough Street (Survey Nos. 102 and 103) are early forms that can be associated with the New Mills Company. The houses here and to the south (Survey Nos. 100 and 101) were associated with Aaron Early, local merchant during the third-quarter of the 19th century. Like Mary Street, Hough Street reflects worker housing standards.

Elizabeth Street reflects the later Victorian period in most of its buildings, their setting, and the articulation of the street. Elizabeth is as wide as Hanover Street. Between the street and the sidewalks to each side are planting strips that are lined with maple trees. The street canopy of these mature trees gives Elizabeth Street its most dominant feature.

The lots are much larger than those on Hanover Street, being especially wide on the south side of the street, between Egbert and Davis Streets. Also, unlike Hanover Street, these houses on Elizabeth Street are set back from the sidewalk. Lots on the south side of the street originally ran to the Rancocas Creek. Only a few still retain that boundary. Those on the north side have 200-foot depths to Early Street with rear property access and carriage sheds.

The buildings are in three groups. Those between Hanover and Hough are a mixture of early water houses (Survey Nos. 108-111), and later bungalow forms (Survey No. 146-147). From Hough Street to approximately the middle of the block of Davis Street, the houses date mostly to the last quarter of the 19th century. There are some particularly fine architectural works here, including Wellsmere (Survey No. 114), the Williams House (c. 1876) (Survey No. 136), and the Beck House (c. 1876) (Survey No. 137). East of the Episcopal Church along Elizabeth Street, the houses date to the early 20th century. On the south side are a series of 4"-squares" of subtle differences (Survey Nos. 121, 123, 125 and 126).

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Those on the north side contain some good Colonial Revival examples (Survey Nos. 133 and 134).

Hough Street - Around Early Street (Nos. 148-150)

On the east side of Hanover, the properties run the full width of the block north of Elizabeth. This yields rear property access on Hough Street. Therefore, there are few isolated houses on this area of Hough.

Egbert Street (Nos. 151-162)

This cluster of homes on both sides of Egbert, north of Early Street, are associated with late 19th century businessmen Aaron Early (Survey Nos. 151, 156 and 157) and Anthony J. Morris (Survey Nos. 153 and 154). There is an excellent "bungalow style" example (Survey No. 155) and the frame of a house (Survey No. 158) that was moved from Hanover Street after the "1894 fire" and rebuilt at 64 Egbert. There are no distinguishing streetscape features to this area with isolated street trees yielding to open space land uses near Jane Street.

Hough Street/Reynolds Street Intersection (Nos. 163-173)

This area contains the Borough's "lock-up" (Survey No. 167) isolated at the end of Hough Street near Budd's Run. It also contains two early forms (Survey Nos. 171 and 173) on small narrow lots that have been re-clad. Two fine late 19th century houses are on the east side of Hough Street (Survey Nos. 164 and 165) that are located on larger lots and contain garden plots behind the houses.

Jarvis Street (Nos. 174-220)

After Hanover Street, Jarvis Street contains the next highest concentration of buildings in Pemberton. Here the intensive use of land is also present in tight, narrow lots with houses placed close to the sidewalk. There are no non-residential uses. Because the Hanover Street lots run the full depth of the block, the earliest Jarvis Street houses were built on the west side of the street. Early worker houses are also present on the east side of the south end of Jarvis Street, and on the north side of Pemberton Street, east of Jarvis Street. There are simple 1½ story residences (Survey Nos. 176-178 and 217), standard duplex units (Survey Nos. 185, 186, 197-202, 204, 205, 214 and 215) and individual residences of architectural distinction. These include the Malsbury House (c. 1859 and 1876) (Survey No. 181), the Lee Bullock House (c. 1876) (Survey No. 184) and the Baptist Church Parsonage (c. 1859 and 1876) (Survey No. 188).

Jarvis Street has three segments, the first of which is located on the west side of the street from Antis to Pemberton where the density of buildings is the

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greatest. The east side of Jarvis Street reflects the wider lots of Hanover, and the later subdivision of Jarvis Street lots. The third segment is more difficult to characterize. The Hanover Street lots between Pemberton and Reynolds Streets generally run the full depth, with rear property access from Jarvis Street. The west side has a mixture of lot sizes, widths and depths.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

SIGNIFICANCE

Architecture: Excellent collective of Vernacular housing from 18th and early 19th century, reflecting company influence and numerous examples of high style Federal and Victorian architecture.

Industry: Sites of early grist and sawmills, forge and fulling mill. Funded by company which gave early form to the town.

Religion: Earliest Baptist Church in Burlington County (c. 1752), Francis Biggs founder (c. 1763). Formally organized in 1764.

Methodist Church began 1774 (third in NJ after Burlington and Trenton), influenced by Captain Thomas Webb, the founder of Methodism in NJ and visited by Francis Asbury, first Bishop of the Methodist Church in the United States.

Exploration and Settlement: First "company town" in Burlington County, 1752 Company created New Mills. By 1787 a town had formed providing services and products to countryside.

Historic Archeology: Sites of industrial buildings including barrel factories, cranberry packing houses, forge, sawmills, fulling mills and cupola furnace, and sites of houses including forgerman's and worker's houses and site of the Buck Tavern.

8.1 Introduction

The significance of Pemberton Borough is in part a direct result of its remarkably successful industrial development as the first "company town" in Burlington County, which provided its employees a comfortable place to live and work at the "New Mills Company". From its beginnings the town provided residents and nearby farmers with the grain, lumber, wool and iron implements for domestic, commercial and agricultural use, which resulted in a highly profitable and enterprising era of industrial growth for nearly three quarters of a century (1770 - 1840).

Located on the edge of the New Jersey Pine Barrens and connected by the Rancocas Creek, excellent roads and railroad lines, the Borough evolved into a major processing and distribution center for crops produced in the pinelands (berries and field crops) during the late 19th century and early 20th century.

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In addition, the Borough is considered the cradle of the Baptist and Methodist faiths in Burlington County, since in contrast to other parts of the County, development was not guided by the Society of Friends (Quakers). The first churches of both denominations were built in the third quarter of the 18th century, though they have since been replaced with more substantial structures.

The Borough's exceptional buildings from various architectural periods reflect the rich history of industrial activities and prosperity of the 18th and 19th centuries, and the adaptation to processing the resources of the pinelands. It offers, today, a picture of the economic diversification of the Borough since its beginnings in the 18th century, within which the social, economic and religious needs of its residents and neighbors were accommodated.

8.2 Historical Development (1752-1984)

Pemberton had a quiet beginning sometime in the 1740's when David Budd selected it as the site for his grist mill. The settlement became the first company town in Burlington County when, in 1752, four men - David Budd, Patrick Reynolds, Robert Smith, and Daniel Smith - incorporated there as the New Mills Company. The Company's purpose was to create a corporate center with attractive home sites owned and operated by the Company. Each of the men owned a full one-quarter interest in the Company which included the grist mill and sawmill they built on the north branch of the Rancocas Creek. All of the men owned a selection of the town lots and were solely responsible for the organization and development of the village. They created the employment, built the homes for the employees, and built the roads and bridges which linked their town with the rest of the County. These men exhibited not only consummate business skills but also creative planning skills for a total community by meeting the needs of the people who lived there. (Prescott. New Mills Corporate papers)

Before 1780, there were Baptist (Burlington County Deeds, 6 April 1752) and Methodist Churches (Asbury. 2 March 1772) and cemeteries, a public school, a company store as well as other businesses, and three hotels. The town's location on the edge of the pine wilderness was geographically remote. However, the citizens had strong business, moral, and religious leadership which led them to be leaders rather than followers. There was a strong conservative element in the development of the community undoubtedly caused partly by the familiar relationships that were firmly established in the marriages between families in the village. (Olsen. Page 22) They were not simply living in the village and having their needs met elsewhere. The Company planned for their needs and most, if not all, were met within the confines of the village. (Olsen. page 11-22).

Following the initial period of development between the 1740's and 1770, there began a highly profitable and enterprising period of industrial growth that lasted about 70 years. The New Mills Company expanded to include a tanyard, a

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cordwainer, a carpenter and two forges. (Olsen. Page 18, 19 and 28) There were about seventy dwellings, two churches, three hotels, and a school in the village by this time. (New Mills Company Estate Map, 1787).

There was considerable patriotic fervor in the village and numerous local men served in the Revolution, either in the Continental Army or the New Jersey Militia. The most noteworthy participant was probably Thomas Reynolds. He was the son of one of the founders of The New Mills Company. At the outbreak of this Revolution, he was a member of the Committee of Observation of Burlington County and was elected a deputy from Burlington County to the Provincial Congress which met at Burlington. In 1776, he was named Lieutenant Colonel of the Second Regiment of the Burlington County Militia. While Reynolds was on furlough in New Mills (Pemberton), he was taken prisoner by British troops on 26 December 1776. He was held as a prisoner of war on Long Island from then until 28 September 1779. After the Revolution, he was a delegate to the State Convention which adopted the U.S. Constitution in 1787. (New Jersey Revolutionary Records formerly in the War Records Office).

Reynolds' daughter, Antis, married Brigadier General John Lacey of the Pennsylvania Militia, and Lacey made possible most of New Mill's (Pemberton) industrial growth. In the 1780's, he built two iron forges on the south side of the Rancocas Creek about 500 feet west of the road as well as a blacksmith shop and fulling mill. New Mills was still a company town with the Company owners' holding virtually all the property still in the originally designated town lots. (Lacey, Memoirs). It wasn't until after Lacey's death in 1814 that the Company system which had prevailed for over sixty years began to break down.

The New Jersey Militia Act of 1793 specifically cited New Mills as the muster-site for the Third Regiment consisting of the militia from Evesham, Northampton, Hanover and Upper Springfield. (NJ in 1973) The United States Post Office Department established the New Mills Post Office on 18 September 1800. (U.S. Post Office Department Records) Major Samuel J. Read's Battalion of New Jersey Detailed Militia and Captain Samuel Jones' Infantry Company were composed of men from New Mills and served in the War of 1812. By 1818, there was also a cut nails factory and a general store to add to the business community. (NJ Mirror. 6 October 1818).

Transportation has always been a paramount concern of the community as evidenced by its initial location on the Rancocas Creek. Earliest maps of the area show bridges and roads. The first official survey of the village streets was in 1792 which designated five streets and gave their physical dimensions. (Burlington County Department of Roads Survey. 23 May 1792) In 1822, the first stagecoach line serving the New Mills area came into being. Clayton C. Atkinson and Company began the New Mills and Philadelphia Accommodation Stage for persons who wished to visit the pines. This early evidence of the promotion of the pines

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as a resort or place to visit is another evidence of the local business acumen. (NJ Mirror. 7 August 1822) By 1825, there was a stageline running from New Mills to Long Beach Island.

This was also a period of flourishing cottage industry. New Mills' sole clockmaker, Joseph Budd, operated his clockmaking and jewelry business from 1820 until 1831. During his eleven years in New Mills/Pemberton, he is believed to have made at least twenty clocks. Two of his clocks are known to be extant, one in Pemberton Township and the other at Batsto. Thomas Gaskill and Samuel Roberts both made Windsor chairs in New Mills during this time. There was a wool carding factory on the site of the old forge, two new stores, a tailor, a drugstore, a lumber business, and a hat manufactory. (Olsen. Pages 41-43 and 44-45).

This industrial period was also the period of most rapid change, both economically and governmentally. Beginning in 1825, a growing number of citizens felt compelled to formulate a plan to incorporate their village. The Company's direct influence had declined, but the leading citizens wanted to preserve the best of what they had been given and felt that incorporation was the only practical means for the continued survival and growth of the village. The Act of Incorporation, transforming the village of New Mills into the Borough of Pemberton, became effective on 15 December 1826. (Pemberton Borough. Act of Incorporation 15 December 1826) The Act of Incorporation also fixed the form of government to be an elected Chief Burgess and six elected Council Members. The governing body was responsible, perceptive, and often innovative in planning for future growth.

In 1834, the Borough was described as the post town of Northampton Township containing 100 dwellings, a grist mill, a sawmill, a fulling mill, a cotton manufactory, a cupola furnace, a hay scale, two churches, a school, two taverns, and five stores. (Gordon. Gazetteer 1834) Manufacturing was still the mainstay of the community. Examination of the Borough minutes for this period reveals a deep concern with the condition of the streets, personal relief for its citizens from the effects of the Depression of 1837; and piping water to the homes of its citizens. (Pemberton Borough Council Minutes 1830-1839). Stagelines expanded and there was a hint of the future influence of the railroad which skirted the edges of the Borough. Pemberton added a coachmaker, a manufacturer of plough castings, a cabinetmaker, a hatter, a turning mill, and three shoemakers.

The 1840's marked a change for Pemberton. It moved from an industrial center to a service provider for the surrounding area during this decade. The nearly 100-year influence of the Company had come to an end. Although the mill property would continue to play an important employment role in the community, its dominance was over. The economic depression had its effect and many bankruptcies occurred despite the best efforts of the Borough Government to provide assistance. The issue of temperance colored most of the decisions made

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in the town for forty years. Few new businesses came into being and those that did provided services for the area. These included a pump factory, a weaver, a confectionary, a cabinetmaker, an undertaker, a dentist, a variety store, and a cheap stove and tin manufactory. (Olsen. Pages 73-79).

The 1860 census showed a predominantly white New Jersey born population. The occupations listed included a carpenter, carter, miller, millwright, hotelkeeper, shopkeeper, sawyer, tailor, schoolteacher, merchant, blacksmith, nurse, seamstress, washerwoman, dressmaker, and milliner. New businesses included a coal business, a select day school, and a sewing machine store.

The next significant transformation came in 1863 when the Burlington and Mount Holly Railroad opened for travel at Pemberton. (NJ Mirror. 8 January 1863) There were eight trains a day the first year. By 1867, the railroad was extended from Pemberton to Hightstown, and in 1869 the name was changed to the Camden and Burlington County Railroad with fourteen trains a day.

The Civil War took a severe toll on the Borough because 100 of its young men enlisted to form Company E of the Twenty-Third Regiment of the First New Jersey Brigade, First Division, Sixth Army Corps. To have that large a number of young men gone for nine months probably had a drastic impact on the business life of a community as small as Pemberton. Nearly another 100 men served in other military units so the community had most of the men between eighteen and forty-five gone for most of a year. Two of the men of Company E were killed and twelve were wounded.

In 1870, a second railroad, the Pemberton and New York Railroad, connecting Camden to the shore communities by way of Pemberton, began operating. The railroad was an influential employer and affected all of the events in the community. Pemberton now had 167 houses and forty businesses. The railroad was the largest employer providing fifteen jobs. Forty men were day laborers, nine were retired businessmen, and eight were farmers. There was a civil engineer, two physicians, three ministers, one lawyer, three schoolteachers, one judge, one life insurance agent, one coal dealer, one tinman, two masons, one ostler, one hotelkeeper, two housepainters, one cabinetmaker, two harnessmakers, two dressmakers, one watchmaker and jeweler, one restaurant keeper, one tailor, one machinist, two millwrights, three millers, three dry goods dealers, three milliners, one butcher, two coopers, one turner, two wheelwrights, two undertakers, three blacksmiths, one gunsmith, four shoemakers, eleven carpenters, one druggist, and two general merchants. (1870 U.S. Census)

The Borough Council was increasingly concerned about the well-being of its citizens. They devoted most of their time to trying to fund and better equip the fire company, to secure piped-in water, to build a local jail, and to pave the streets. (Pemberton Borough Council Minutes 1874-1884) Increasing numbers of

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small merchants came to town and undertook successful businesses. Pemberton added a shoe factory in 1891 and a library in 1897.

The new century found Pemberton continuing with its best characteristics of industry, patriotism, and education. By 1901, the streets were covered with oyster shells to improve travel and the town had facilities for electricity and telephone service. At the Council Meeting on 23 May 1910, the Council granted permission to Pemberton Township Water and Light Company to lay pipes and make excavations for sewerage. In August 1910, the Pemberton Township Water and Light Company also agreed to provide streetlights for the borough streets.

The years before World War I included a flurry of independent entrepreneurs trying their hands at business. The hotel flourished and added an antique business. The two drugstores enjoyed an active trade. There were also a florist; a department store; three grocery and general stores; an all purpose store that sold groceries, provisions, bread, cakes, ice cream, buckwheat cakes to order at breakfast, and repaired shoes; two meat markets; a poultry business; a fish market; a meat market and delicatessen; four restaurants; an ice cream parlor; a livery business; a billiard saloon; a secondhand furniture store; a confectionary; a blacksmith and wheelwright business; a merry-go-round; a bakery; and Pemberton Barrel Factory; the Philadelphia Novelty Company; a shirt factory; a milliner; a hay press; a concrete paving company; and a hack business. (Olsen. Pages 220-222) In 1905, the business leaders founded a bank called the People's National Bank of Pemberton. (Survey #79) (Olsen. Page 223) Some of the services provided by local businessmen extended the Borough's influence into the surrounding area. The feed mill continued to thrive. There were plumbers; a tinsmith; a hardware business that is still operating in 1984; several cranberry growers and shippers; and the two very active railroads. The Borough built its own electric light plant in 1922. Pemberton Borough wielded influence far larger than its size in the central section of Burlington County.

There were still many businesses in the 1920's but the variety and numbers had declined. Lewis J. Mantel had a grocery and meat business; Kelsey and Kille had a general insurance agency; John G. Hippenstiel sold electrical household appliances; Howard D. Harker ran the Pemberton Hay Press; Howard Pittenger specialized in lumber, hardware, and roofing; Andrew Jones handled automobile repair work; Clarence Kinsley was the local Studebaker dealer; J.W. Whitelock was the barber and Kathryn Shemilia was the beautician; Norris Bush kept the bakery; Richard Lippincott operated an express company serving the Middle Atlantic states; Aaron Johnson had a service station; and Harry Kamm and Lester Shaw sold ice cream, newspapers and magazines.

The depression years saw a resurgence of the entrepreneur in the Borough. The nature of the businesses was different than previously, but the numbers were on the upswing. In the 1930's, the emphasis was on service. Virtually anything

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or any help you could desire was available within the Borough. There were three doctors, three dentists, an insurance business, three churches, a post office, an undertaker, three paperhangers and painters, two general contractors, two electrical contractors, a house and barn painter, two refrigerator dealers, a plumber, two general stores, a department store, four gas stations, an auto simonizing business, two electrical repair shops for appliances, a radio dealer, a radio repair shop, a hardware store, florist, a jeweler, a drugstore, an express company, two grocery stores, a meat market, a movie theater, a pool parlor, a shoe repair business, a dry cleaner, a yarn store, an ice and storage company, a feed mill, two beauty shops, a soda fountain and luncheonette, an ice cream parlor, a sandwich shop, a newspaper, and a cranberry company.

As World War II progressed, the changes were felt in Pemberton. Fort Dix was a major point of debarkation for soldiers heading for the European theater. Fort Dix's proximity to Pemberton Borough made the Borough a favorite site for weddings as the soldiers sent for sweethearts from all over the United States so the weddings could take place before they were sent overseas. The 1940's and 1950's brought changes in the business community, but while the number of businesses declined, there were virtually no changes in those that remained. By this time, Pemberton Borough had truly taken on its present largely residential character. There were two doctors, two dentists, an undertaker, a newspaper, three churches, two grocery stores, two general stores, a department store, a drugstore, a feed mill, a dry cleaner, a shoe repair shop, a paperhanger and painter, an ice cream parlor, two soda fountains and luncheonettes, a movie theater, a florist, a barber, a beauty shop, a canoe rental business, a library, and the post office. There was a wellspring of community-shared and sponsored activities such as an annual soapbox derby, an annual Halloween party, and a community bathing beach.

In 1960, the Borough built its own elementary school and the post office moved into a new building. The library moved several times. There were still two dentists, but no doctor. The drug store continued as did the hardware store and the undertaker. But overall, slowly, the businesses disappeared either to move to a new location in Pemberton Township or to close their doors forever.

By the 1970's the business district was virtually nonexistent. The businesses on Hanover Street at the midpoint of the decade were Collins and Son Funeral Home, the Burlington County Monument Company, Eleanor's Beauty Salon, T&T's Luncheonette, Dan Baskin Realtors, the Pemberton Music Center, and the Pemberton Pharmacy. There were also two dentists, a second funeral director, a hardware store, a 7-11, a Cumberland Farms, two gas stations, a laundromat, a TV repair shop, a motel, and a dry cleaner. The focal point of a downtown business district had disappeared.

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8.3 Religion

In contrast to other sections of Burlington County with development guided by members of the Society of Friends, Pemberton's experience was quite different. Its first religious influence came from the Baptists. In 1750, Francis Briggs moved to New Mills from Salem County. By 1752, his home was the meeting place for the Baptists in the area. (Olsen. Pages 5 and 6) On 6 April 1752, Michael Woolston granted to Francis Briggs 1½ acres and ten perches of land on the south side of the North Branch of the Rancocas Creek to be forever employed for a meetinghouse and burying place for the people called Anabaptists. The cemetery had been in continuous use since July 1752. (Burlington County Deeds. 6 April 1752) The first Baptist Church building was in the southwest corner of the cemetery and was in use from 1752 until 1823. The New Mills Baptist Church was formally organized on 23 June 1764 with nine charter members. In 1823, the Baptists built a second building at the east end of the cemetery which served until 1861. (Woodward. Page 404)

In 1843, the Baptist Church built a small chapel on the east side of Hanover Street which served as a Sunday School so the children wouldn't have to walk such a great distance. (Survey #81) (Woodward. Pages 404-5) In 1861, the church building still in use was built on the west side of Hanover Street. (Survey #17) (Woodward. Page 405) The old Baptist parsonage is located on Pemberton Street. (Survey #188) The Baptist congregation in Pemberton served as a spiritual mentor for Burlington County. The Baptist Churches in Mount Holly and Vincentown were both established as missions of the Pemberton Church.

The Methodist Church, although it began later, in 1774 precisely, was perhaps even more influential in Pemberton's history. There were Methodist classes held from 1770 on by Captain Thomas Webb, the founder of Methodism in New Jersey. Francis Asbury, the first Bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States, visited New Mills many times. (Asbury Journal. Pages 185-86) The Methodist Church in Pemberton was the third in New Jersey preceded only by Burlington and Trenton. New Mills erected the first Methodist Church building in Burlington County. On 31 December 1774, William Budd, Jr. deeded one quarter acre on the east side of Hanover Street for a Methodist Church and cemetery. (Burlington County Deeds. 31 December 1774) The congregation at Pemberton was responsible for nearly two dozen men entering the Methodist Ministry. Most of the town's business and political leadership came from the roll of the Methodist Church. The present Methodist Church was built in 1895. (Survey #53)

The Episcopal Church began in 1840 when Pemberton was a mission of the Protestant Episcopal Church. (Olsen. Page 79) The church had its first full-time rector in 1847. They originally met in the Odd Fellows' Hall until they purchased the Baptist Sunday School in 1861. (Survey #81) (Olsen. Pages 80 and

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104) They built their first building in 1938 on the south side of Elizabeth Street. (Survey #119) (Olsen. Page 248)

In 1965, St. Mark's Lutheran Church was organized and initially met in the Borough. They now meet in their sanctuary on the south side of Pemberton-Browns Mills Road in Pemberton Township.

The entire social structure of the community focused on its churches, particularly the Baptist and Methodist ones during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. It was unthinkable not to attend one of the churches even if you weren't a member. Their influence was far more pervasive than that of business or education. They governed local recreation and seasonal activities absolutely. (Olsen. Pages 104, 141, 144, 146 and 199) The three churches still physically dominate the town's landscape although their influence in the community has greatly reduced. They each draw their memberships from outlying areas more than from the Borough.

The earliest record of a school in New Mills (Pemberton) is before 1780. By 1780, there was a school kept by an Irishman, John Morgan. By 1800, Morgan was succeeded by John Bull. Bull's schoolhouse stood just north of the original Methodist Meetinghouse on the east side of Hanover Street. In 1827, the Borough Council voted in favor of a union schoolhouse.

8.5 Settlement Patterns

Figure 2 shows the original subdivision and layout of New Mills. It reads as follows: "The whole of the above plan lyeth bounded as following 'Beginning at a twin Black Oak Sapling that standith on the north side of the north main branch of Rancocas Creek about 4 chains above said Grist Mill and 70 from hence (1) north twenty-six degrees east 10 chains and 75 links to a post, then north 64 degrees west 3 chains to a stake in the road that divides Northampton and New Hanover, then north 52 degrees west along land of Robert Smith 11 chains and about 8 links to a corner of the said land, then along his lands north twenty-six degrees east one chain and 90 links, then along David Budd's land north 64 degrees west about 16 chains and a half, then south 35 degrees west about 2 chains to the creek, then along the creek as it goes the following courses, then south 8 chains and a half, and south 16 degrees east 6 chains and east 8 chains and a half, and south 60 degrees east 5 chains and a half and south 80 degrees east 8 chains and a half and south 60 degrees east to the beginning and contains thirty acres".

The thirty acres of the original 1752 deed and plan for New Mills shows a variety of lots divided evenly between the four principals. The "Company lot" contained a grist mill, a sawmill and a dwelling house. David Budd and Robert

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Smith owned the land east and north of the Company land. It seems that this pre-1752 condition effected the cut or layout.

The westernmost lots were the largest lots fronting the Rancocas Creek on a gentle slope along the north bank. A road cut these lots in an east-west direction to the boat landing site on the creek. The landing site was actually on David Budd's Lot No. 4. Here the creek bends abruptly northwest to southwest. David Budd's lot here is of an irregular shape, yet wider (297 vx. 264 feet) than the other three lots. The lengths of lots to the creek vary from 950-650 feet. Patrick Reynolds held Lot No. 3, Robert Smith No. 2 and Daniel Smith No. 1. Four other smaller creek-fronting lots were located east of the five large ones. They were 83 feet wide and 400-540 feet long. Daniel Smith had Lot No. 4 adjacent to his larger plot. Robert Smith had Lot No. 3, David Budd Lot No. 2 and Patrick Reynolds Lot No. 1. There were four lots facing Hanover-Northampton Road just north of the "Company lot". There were 66 feet wide along the road and 285 feet long. Daniel Smith owned Lot No. 4 just north of the "Company lot". This lot contained the extant Morris Mansion. (Survey #5) Patrick Reynolds held Lot No. 3, Robert Smith held Lots No. 2 and No. 1. David Budd did not have any of these farm lots. Robert Smith had only two lots.

Across the road on the east side were eight lots of equal size plus another landing place owned by David Budd, and also containing three lands ponded for the "Mill hydropower" system. This may have been why David Budd did not hold any of the west side road fronting lots. The other eight were also divided unevenly. In from the landing site, David Budd held Lot No. 8, Daniel Smith Lot No. 7 and No. 6, David Budd Lot No. 5, Patrick Reynolds Lots No. 4 and No. 3, Robert Smith Lot No. 2 and Daniel Smith Lot No. 1. Budd then held two of these in addition to his landing-ponded land, Daniel Smith had three, Patrick Reynolds two and Robert Smith only one. These lots were also 66 feet (one chain) wide and 190 feet deep.

Therefore, it does not appear that any of the creek-fronting lots were ever developed. However, the "Company lot" and those lots fronting the road gave the Borough a nucleus for future growth. The initial plan for the Company had little to do with the eventual Borough of Pemberton based on this analysis.

As noted, the Morris Mansion plots accurately onto the Daniel Smith Lot No. 4, 66 feet by 285 feet directly north of the "Company lot". This may indicate that the present house is not the dwelling house shown on the map, as was shown on the 1752 plan. The North Branch of the Rancocas Creek has shifted northward over the years; however, the plan is remarkably accurate otherwise. So, it may appear that an earlier dwelling on the "Company lot" was replaced by the house erected on Lot No. 4. The subsequent 1782 map does not show a dwelling on the "Company lot", and neither does it show one on Lot No. 4. Figures 3 through 8 shows this development theory for New Mills for the period from 1752 through 1865.

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County, NJ8.6 Architecture

The built environment of the Borough of Pemberton is best understood in the context of its early industrial growth, economic diversification and adaptation to processing and distribution of cranberries and field crops. Buildings and structures specifically associated with the industrialization of the Borough are, for the most part, missing from the remaining cultural landscape. However, the economic diversification of the Borough can still be seen in the storefronts along Hanover Street (Survey Nos. 54A, 54B, 54C, 58, 69, 70, 73-75, 55, 77 and 83). In recent years, these storefronts have been closed up, altered and converted to residential uses.

The only surviving indication of the once thriving cranberry industry are the two packing houses (Survey Nos. 1 and 221) extant on the south end of Hanover Street and on Pemberton Street. However, the large operation of berry processing and shipping behind the Budd House (No. 6) and the barrel factory (No. A), located at the south end of Hanover Street, have been destroyed. The remaining housing stock developed during the various eras of development ties together the Borough of Pemberton. As Pemberton adapted to the changing socio-economic pressures, its houses reflected the times, but also remained cohesive and vital as a grouping.

The 18th Century

The houses built by the New Mills Company for their employees were tight, efficient units with little embellishment. They were generally sited close to the street on narrow, deep lots. The buildings were 2½ stories with steeply-pitched gables, which overlapped the second-story ceiling. The houses were usually one room deep and mostly entered from an end-bay door. Fenestration was usually in two- and three-bay window arrangements. The worker housing, in "duplex form" from this era, reflects efficiencies of space, site and materials. Some 35 buildings are believed to be 18th century houses. These buildings are concentrated on Hanover and Jarvis Streets. These include the blacksmith shop (#2), Morris mansion (#5), Hilliard house (#26), Woolston house (#23), Pemberton Savings and Loan (#54A), D.F.Gibbs house (#54B), A. Early house (#'s 54C and 55), Upper Tavern (#70), New Mills store (#72), Pemberton Hotel (#'s 73, 74 and 75), Early and Reeves hardware store (#76), M. Nunnally store (#77), A.S. Mann store and residence (#'s 83-87), and the residential buildings along Jarvis Street (Survey #'s: 184, 185, 191, 201, 202, 203, 204, 207, 211, 213, 217 and 218). The duplex unit at 9 and 11 Mary Street (Survey #'s 86 and 87), represents the earliest 18th century era workers' houses.

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County, NJEarly 19th Century

Houses of the early 19th century reflect the same intensive land use as the 18th century with narrow lots and buildings sited close to the street. Buildings are characterized by more formal details such as boxed cornice returns, fan lights and shallow pitched roofs. This later aspect corresponds to a deeper, two-room floor plan, featuring a side stair hall and front and back parlors. Federal style details include entrance side lights and transoms. In a sense, this period represents the last significant influence of the New Mills Company and its successors, particularly that of John Lacey. These include buildings on Hanover such as the Aaron Early house (#10), J.S. Rodgers House (#46), J. Bell house (#58), J. Pipit house (#59), A. Fort (#60), Pemberton House (#'s 68 and 69), A. Early (#80), A. Mann (#83), miscellaneous storefronts (#'s 84-87), and Survey Nos. 175-178, 181-182, 186, 188, 192, 194, 206, 208-210, 212, 214 and 215, located on Jarvis Street.

The general economic depression that swept Pemberton in the 1840's is characterized by a void or absence of houses that would have been influenced by the Classical Revival styles. Only the Baptist Church (#17) on Hanover Street and the Baptist Sunday School (#81), exhibit traits of the Classical Revival style. In general, this popular method of building can only be seen in lesser architectural embellishments of Pemberton's houses, including porches, cornices and fenestration. It appears unlikely that many houses were originally built "from scratch" during the period from 1840 to 1860.

The post-Civil War era of building in the Borough adapted to a wide-range of architectural concepts in its residential construction, as evidenced by the houses built along Elizabeth Street. The settings for these houses generally include much wider lots, a wider spacing of houses and deeper setbacks. The plan and forms tended to be more rambling, irregular and picturesque. Influences of Andrew Jackson Downing (#'s 137 and 138), the French Second Empire (#136) and the Victorian Gothic (#53) modes are evident. There was a general re-interest in the porch as an extension of living space, and during this period, many earlier houses in the Borough added porches. Many porches were turned-column supported, bracketed and jigsaw scrolled designs. Also, this late 19th century period included a large number of storefront - commercial construction along Hanover Street. Fine Victorian fronts (#'s 14, 68-71 and #'s 73-77) are extant throughout this commercial spine, from this period. Some houses, such as those on the north side of Mary Street, were built in the late 19th century of simple plan and form, but articulated with clearly identifiable Victorian porches such as Survey Nos. 91, 94 and 95-99.

Survey #'s 100-103 were associated with the local merchant, Aaron Early, on Hough Street during the third-quarter of the 19th century. Elizabeth Street reflects the later 19th century (Victorian period) in most of its buildings

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including Wellsmere (#114), the Williams house (#136) and the Beck house (#137). Hough Street contains the Borough's lock-up (#167), and two fine late 19th century houses on the east side of Hough Street (#'s 164 and 165) that are located on large lots with garden plots behind the houses. Budd Avenue has a few late 19th century houses including the B. Johnson house (#226), the E. Dobbins house (#224), a "high shingle" style house with metal roof and a sweeping porch roof supported by grouped columns (#225). Jarvis Street contains several early to mid 19th century homes including the Malsbury house (#181), the Lee Bullock house (#184) and the Baptist Church parsonage (#188).

A thriving cranberry-related industry at the turn-of-the-century included packing and shipping berries, barrel-making, as well as a growers' organization. House construction during this era included large "4 square" types found on Elizabeth Street (#'s 123, 125, 126 and 128) and smaller "bungalows" scattered around the Borough (#'s 112, 113, 145, 155, 170, 183, and 222). The 4 square houses retain the settings of the late 19th century Victorian houses, while the bungalows are architecturally compatible and, at times, excellent examples of their own place and time. Colonial Revival houses are contained within the district at the east end of Elizabeth Street (#'s 133 and 134).

Most of the new construction within the Pemberton Borough Historic District is generally compatible with the lustric fabric. The multi-family apartment building behind the Pemberton Inn on Elizabeth Street (#106) is a reasonably good example of contextual scale and proportioned on a 2½ story frame. Another example of sympathetic design is the house on the southeast corner of Hanover at Reynolds Street (#43). There also exist less compatible split-levels and single-story ranch-style houses scattered within the District (#'s 32 and 169).

Pemberton offers the viewer a wide-range of architectural modes and styles in its buildings with the exception of the Greek Revival. In the buildings of the District, one can see clear indications of economic stimulation, population increases, cultural conditions and architectural evolution. As the mills have been destroyed, storefronts were converted to housing units, and cranberry packing houses and barrel factories demolished. Pemberton's houses convey the epic of the Borough in the absence of many of these other structures.

8.7 Historic Archeology

Pemberton was first established in the 1740's as the seat of David Budd's grist mill. In 1752 the settlement became Burlington County's first corporate town when the New Mill Company was established to create a planned industrial community. The original complex consisted of a grist mill, a saw mill, and millworker's home sites. During the 1780's, the New Mills Company complex expanded to include two forges, a blacksmith's shop, a coal house, and a fulling mill. By the 1820's the site grew with the additions of a turning mill and a

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wool carding mill constructed upon the site of the forge. A cupola furnace was built upon another section of the forge site by 1834. Subsequently, barrel factories and cranberry packing houses were operated at the site. Although these structures functioned in various capacities throughout most of the 19th century, all but a cranberry packing house had burned or were demolished by the first decades of the 20th century.

Archival research and archeological field reconnaissance have determined the approximate dates and locations of historic archeological resources in and around the site of the New Mills Company industrial complex. Archeological evidences of a sawmill and the "Cole" (coal) houses were found during these investigations. Although direct evidences of the forge, the fulling mill, and some packing houses were not located, archeological materials and features suggesting their location were encountered during fieldwork. Evidences suggesting the locations of tailraces, wheel pits, a boxed headrace, and an earthen dam also were discerned during this phase of research.

Archeological fieldwork consisted of a number of 1' diameter shovel tests and a series of 3' probes. These procedures clearly revealed the high integrity and relatively undisturbed nature of historic archeological resources in this area. These resources represent a largely intact, functionally cohesive, extensively documented, and historically significant group of sites capable of yielding information of both regional and local significance. Pemberton evolved as a major processing and distribution center for field crops, cranberries, timber, iron ore, and other Pinelands resources. Information obtained from the above mentioned industrial archeological sites will further understanding of the relationships of these activities with the industrial, technological, and social development of Pemberton in particular, and the Pinelands region in general.

The New Mills complex was the industrial heart of Pemberton during its years as a manufacturing and processing center. Today, the complex retains its importance as an area of high archeological potential. A recent survey of sawmill sites in the Pinelands revealed that only 36 of 158 inventoried sites were found to have intact surficial archeological deposits. (Mounier 1984:108). None have been systematically excavated, and most represent single mill seats. The Pemberton mills archeological area thus represents a unique surviving example of an industrial mill complex of high integrity possessing high potential for providing significant information bearing upon local and regional developments in Pemberton Borough and the Pinelands region.

The archeological potential of these resources will be most fully realized when systematic archeological excavations are undertaken in conjunction with detailed archival research. This research strategy should;

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- (1) identify the factors that contributed towards the location of the industrial complex at its present site.
- (2) identify the construction and developmental phases of the industrial complex.
- (3) delineate the technological, commercial, and social factors affecting change within the mill complex.
- (4) show how the industrial complex interrelated with the borough and the surrounding region.
- (5) support efforts to identify significant individuals and events important to the history of Pemberton and the Pinelands region.
- (6) identify the products and by-products of industrial production in the mill complex.
- (7) delineate the marketing distribution of products manufactured in the industrial complex.
- (8) show how developments in the mill complex affected the history and evolution of Pemberton and the Pinelands region.

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10.2 BOUNDARY JUSTIFICATION

With the exception of the Cranberry Packing House (#1) Blacksmith Shop (#2) and Grist Mill (#4), the south end of the proposed Pemberton Borough Historic District is defined by archeological sites. These include the Barrel Factory (A), the South Pemberton Passenger and Freight Stations (B), Forgerman's House and Wheelwright Shop (C), Mill Ponds (D), Fulling Mill (E), Forge (F), and Coal House & Turning Mill - Saw Mill (G). The Hanover Street, Magnolia Road and West Hampton Street intersection is dominated by modern highway - oriented commercial land uses: Convenience stores, service stations and motels and is an appropriate exclusion and district terminus.

The archeological zone is further defined to the west side of the district by the sites of Theodore Budd & Son's Cranberry Packing Houses (c. 1905). The modern houses along the south side of Antis Street and the mid-20th century houses on Budd Avenue provide an edge condition with the historic houses on the west side of Jarvis Street. The houses at the intersection of Budd Avenue and Pemberton Street appear on the 1876 Bears Map and establish an historic edge with the open-space farmland west and north of these properties. This open space further creates an edge with the buildings on the west side of Jarvis Street between Pemberton Street and Budd's Run. The north end of the historic district is defined by the Pemberton Borough-Pemberton Township political boundary which is the centerline of Budd Run. The old Borough Lock-Up defines the northeast boundary of the district along with the clear changes in the architectural fabric of mid to late 20th century houses at the intersections of St. John and Hough Streets, and Egbert and Jane Streets.

The eastern boundary is then defined by open space land use including two schools and the Odd Fellows Cemetery. This open space continues easterly behind the properties on the north side of Elizabeth Street. These properties contain garages and carriage houses fronting Early Street whereby providing a clear edge with the school property on the north side of Early Street. The extent of the district easterly along Elizabeth Street is defined by a change from 2½ story early 20th century houses to more modern 1½ story mid 20th century houses on the south side of the street.

The Episcopal Church, Hall and Parsonage property runs southerly to the Rancocas Creek and all of this land is within the district.

The Joseph L. Budd property (1874) (Inventory No. 118) apparently does not run to the creek whereas the Issac Shinn (1874) property (Inventory No. 117) does contain the creek as a southerly boundary. Clear 20th century intrusions, modern houses and altered buildings are extant on the east side of Hough Street and the west and east sides of Egbert Street between the Creek and properties fronting Elizabeth Street. These are excluded from the district where the houses on both





home and by so doing founded the early Pemberton County. 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




Pemberton in 1829. This map shows the boundaries of Pemberton Borough, the streets surveyed in 1792, and the streets officially named in 1829.




