The clay tile exterior wall, silo wall, and water tank characterize this barn as an lowa Agricultural Experiment Station / Matt King design type. The use of clay tile was one of the later improvements in the history of round barns, believed to have been introduced, around 1910, by the lowa Ag. Exp. Station. The water tank atop the silo is an expected characteristic of this type, but may be the only one now existing in lowa.

It is known from the writings of W.E. Frudden that this barn was originally built as a dairy barn. Plans accompanying Frudden's articles show a feed alley, manger, inward facing cow stanchions, gutter, and litter carrier track completely encircling the silo but for the entrance driveway. 22.
