

25. Augusta undertaker, acquired the vacant parcel. The house was built by his son-in-law, Leo G. O'Neil, in 1916 and 1917. In 1917 Brothers deeded half half interest in the house and property to O'Neil. Both families continued to live in the house. In 1922, as part of a divorce settlement, O'Neil deeded "the house and all claims of alimony and future support" to his former wife. She subsequently sold the property in 1923 to Isaac Reynolds. On October 28, 1937, Reynolds conveyed the property to his daughter, Lucia Reynolds Asbury, who later sold it to George Kelsch et al. in 1956. Mr. & Mrs. Paul Kelsch formally assumed title to the house in 1981.



First floor plan. Not to scale

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
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
