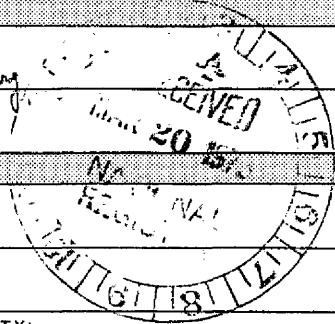

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This sandstone building was built in two parts, the earliest in 1888, and the last in 1894. It later served as a schoolhouse.

Considering its age, the Iona meetinghouse is in good condition. It has a new roof and is being well cared for by the local people who value it highly as a focal point of community history. Its massive stones and decorated flat-arched windows give it a strong and picturesque character.

The earliest part of the building (1888) is the eastern end, forming the crossing of the present T-shaped complex. It differs from the later addition in having flat segment arches over windows and doors. Originally one simple room used as a meeting house by the Mormon congregation, the whole continued as one large space after addition of the ell in 1894. After this time public school was taught in the same space used for worship and church meetings.

Heat was originally supplied by a stove located centrally, with a chimney at the crossing of the "T". There is now no heat in the building. An outhouse supplied sanitary needs. Although this has been removed, there is still no indoor plumbing.

A shake roof (1970) replaces the original cedar shingles. Sandstone for the building was quarried about 16 miles east near Ririe, Idaho. The foundation is of fassaltic lava-rock found near the site.

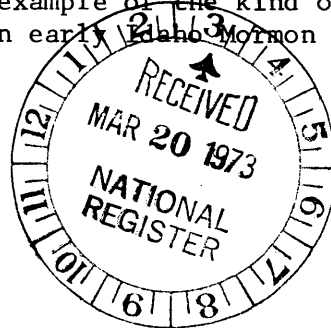

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This is a fine example of pioneer stone construction, and has substantial local and regional historic interest.

As a center of Mormon religious, civic, and educational life in a Mormon community, this is easily the most important structure in Iona. It is a good example of the kind of primitive architecture built by parishioners in early Utah Mormon communities.

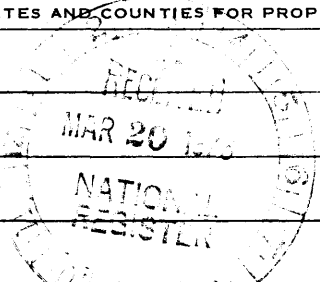

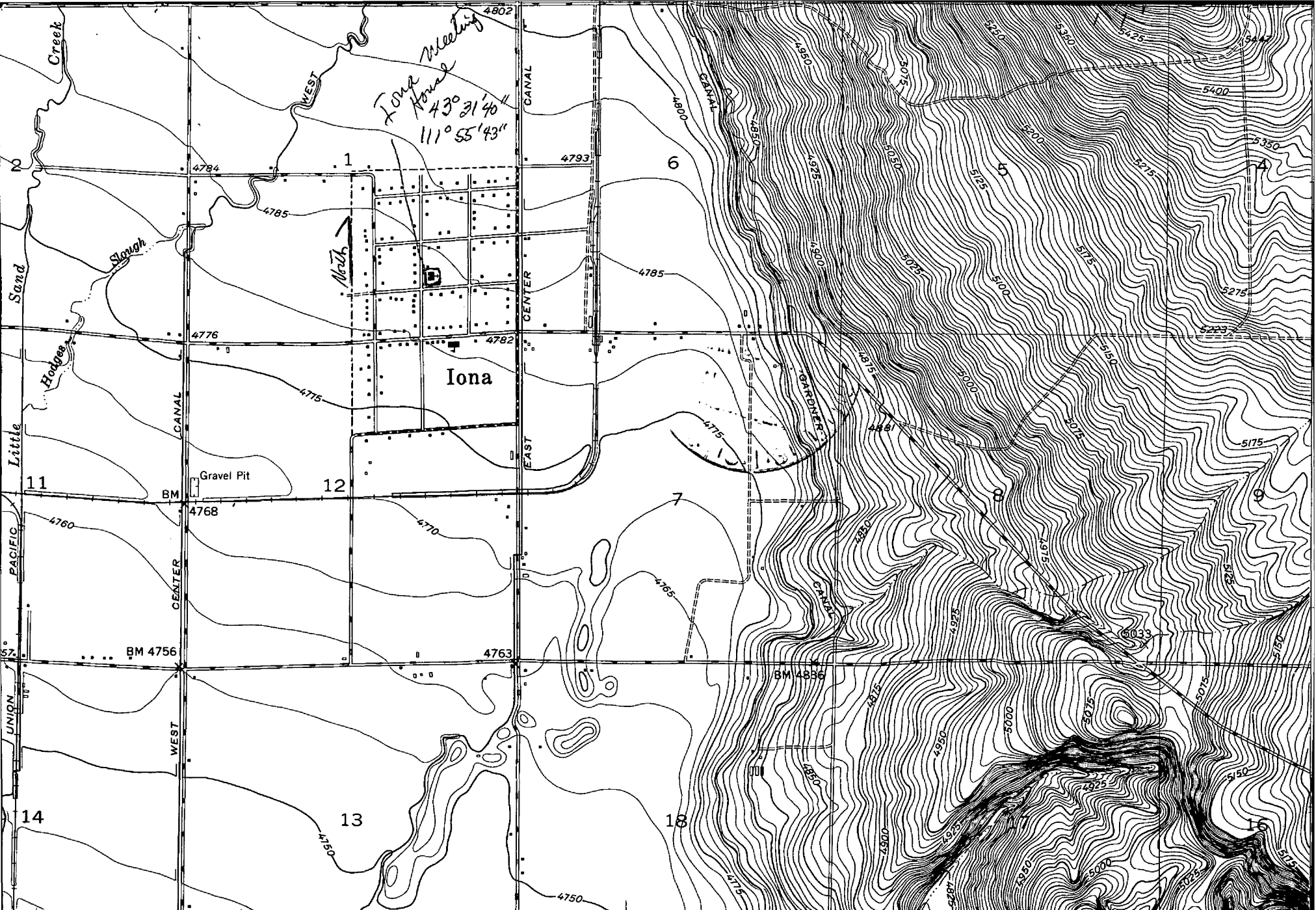

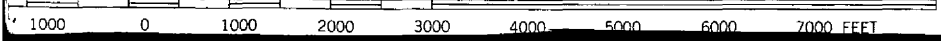
