The significance of Henry Clay in the development of our country needs no explanation. This is only one of several law offices Clay had which now remains. The Law Office is believed to be one of only two buildings now remaining in Lexington which were built as professional offices. Clay occupied this building as his law office until ca. Sept., 1810. During this period he was elected to successive terms in the Kentucky Legislature (1803-1809), was named (1807, 1810) to fill unexpired terms in the U.S. Senate, was gaining prestige and influence as attorney and political leader, and was preparing for his long career in the federal government and international law.
