Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Córdova Residence is a detached, two-storey, plastered brick and wood building located on the north side of Calle Gonzalo Marín between the Callejón Salicrup and the Paseo Víctor Rojas, in the historic urban center of Arecibo. Originally intended for solely residential purposes, today the building houses office and commercial space below and a residence above.

The flat-roofed rectangular structure is divided at the street facade into four equivalent and evenly-spaced bays, typical of the neo-classical period in Puerto Rican architecture. At the ground storey, a base molding serves a a defining element between the wall and the sidewalk. All bays at this level were originally treated without distinction: vertical rectangular openings with planar surrounds housed wooden doubledoors. The third bay entrance was distinguishable only by the additional step provided for more comfortable access.

Today, the first and fourth bays house white, metallic Miami-type blinds and concrete balusters of connected oval-shapes. The two central bays have been diminished in size within the original surrounds: the second bay houses an aluminum and glass commercial-type door as access to a lawyer's office, and the third bay consists a fourpanel wooden door as access to the upper level residence.

At the second, level, a continuous balcony is supported by decorative brackets with sea-shell motifs. The balcony railings, altered from wrought iron to concrete in the 1930's consist of three piers infilled with a concrete lattice of interlaced circular forms. The upper storey bays were also originally indistinguishable, consisting of wooden, louvred, double-door windows. Today, bays one and two contain metallic Miami blinds and bays three and four house plain, double-casement planks as doors, and glazed transom panels. The original sorrounds remain, each composed of an eared antepagment crowned by a segmental arch pediment with a sea-shell motif tympanum.

A series of five corinthian pilasters visually defines each bay and supports a cornice consisting of an entablature with floral relief at the freize.

The interior spaces maintain original materials and volumes, consisting of local hardwood floors, walls, and ceilings. Many of the original wooden panel double-doors and floral latticework transoms also remain.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Córdova Residence or "Casa de las Conchas" as it is commonly known in Arecibo is located in an area developed by the city's wealthiest families during the turn of the century and its value is primarely architectural. As an upper class residential sector Gonzalo Marín St. boasts some of the best examples of architectural eclecticism in Arecibo. This building is a magnificent example of integration of various architectural tendencies such as:

- Isabelino neo-classic, present in the structure's general layout.
- Criollo (local style) present in the interior partitions, materials used and the way these were handled by the local artisan.
- Beaux arts, present in the rich ornamental details, frieze, sea-shell tympanum.
 sea-shell motives supporting brackets and many interior ornaments, partitions and lattice work.

Built for residential purposes the property was altered for business-residential uses during the depression when most of the owners of properties in this section of town lost their wealth and had to use the properties as means of support. Alterations to the property were minimal and can easily be reversed.

At present the city government is considering to purchase the structures, restore it and use it for cultural-educationalpurposes since it is located across from the "Casa Ulanga" (AR-07-26-82) Arecibo's Cultural Center.
