

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NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

The # 16 Hayes voting booth was named after the village of Hayes Crossing. The voting house was donated to Rowan County by Clifford Sparks, the owner, with the shake of a hand. No documents were recorded. The voting house has been used by people in the community and the county for multiple purposes, such as weddings, trials and as a temporary jail. Voting ended in the building in the 1950s. The voting booth is situated on a large flat lot on Little Perry Road, 1/10 of a mile off State Road 60.

Number 16 voting house is constructed of fieldstone and flush mortar. The stone was gathered from the creek and a hill behind the building (Virgil Sparks Interview). Exposed beams project from the replacement-shingle roof. Three over one windows are placed on the north and south elevations with three 2' x 2' single lights located under the east gable eave. The windows have ashlar cut stone sills, but lack lintels. The three lights on the east elevation were positioned high to give light and to insure privacy to citizens voting in three booths located under the windows. Victorian beaded boards seal the gable ends between the stone walls and roof.

NARRATIVE STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The # 16 Hayes Voting House meets criterion A and is a significant physical representation of the New Deal. It was constructed by the WPA and used exclusively as a voting house during the period of significance. The # 16 Hayes Voting House has retained a majority of the original materials and is recognizable in function as a voting house. The # 16 Hayes Voting House is located in its original setting and location, and has retained its integrity of association as a building constructed by one of the New deal era agencies.
