Property has some terracing with stone and cement walls. There are flower beds, trees, shrubs. Early 20th c.well within 2' of east side of wing. To north about 50-75' is $2\frac{1}{2}$ story carriagehouse, clapboard sided, 2/2 windows, gable roof. 1 story garage addition to west. Now functions as garage and residence.

Across West Saddle River Road to the east is the Saddle River.

SIGNIFICANCE: The Dr. E. G. Roy House is of architectural significance. It is a fine example of Second Empire style architecture with this mode's characteristic mansard roof. Its visual significance is enhanced by its proximity to another large, 2½ story Second Empire style house at 223 West Saddle River (0258-24). The Roy House has a few circa 1900 modifications but on the exterior its 1860's appearance is remarkably intact (excepting paint color).

The house is also historically significant in Saddle River's history as a country home location in the late 19th century. Dr. Roy, who is believed to have moved here in 1867, was one of the "city people" (Landscape, Feb. 1890) who established summer homes in Saddle River. Unfortunately further research is needed to provide a biography of Dr.

Roy. The Roy family owned the house until the 1920's.
