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SUMMARY

The Rison Cities Service Station, located on the corner of Main Street and Magnolia Street, was built in 1938. The brick building sits atop a continuous concrete foundation and is topped by an intersecting gable roof. It is the best example of an English Revival building - as applied to an automobile era building - in Rison.

ELABORATION

Located on the corner of Main Street and Magnolia Street, the Rison Cities Service Station is an excellent example of simplified English Revival architecture. The rectangular-shaped service station is constructed out of bricks and rests upon a continuous concrete foundation. The building supports an intersecting gable roof sheathed in composition shingles. In the apex of each of the three gables there is an oculus, that originally displayed a glass middle, surrounded by brick with exposed ends. The grease pit (object) and scars from where the gas pumps once stood (site) lend to the ambience of the days when this structure served as a service station and they are considered contributing resources.

Southwest Elevation/Front

The southwest elevation fronts Main Street and it is through this entrance that the office was located. Two large, stationary, picture windows, supported by concrete sills flank the front door delineated by nine lights over two vertical panels. The defining feature of the front elevation is the steeply pitched intersecting front gable, one of the distinguishing characteristics of English Revival architecture.

Southeast & Northwest Elevation/Sides

The side elevations are very simple as well as similar in fenestration. Originally each had one picture window supported by a concrete sill and one wood door. Currently the door opening on the southeast elevation is infilled with brick, whereas, the original door on the northwest elevation still remains intact. The window opening on the northwest elevation has been infilled with a window air-conditioning unit.

Northeast/Rear Elevation

Four evenly spaced small windows adorn the north elevation. Each window is supported by a concrete sill and displays three vertical muntins. The original windows are still in place but have been covered with paint for privacy. Located directly behind the store is a large propane tank.

Integrity

The Rison Cities Service Station possesses a strong sense of integrity. There have been no structural alterations to the building throughout the years, except for the infill of one door and the replacement of one window - each of these changes is reversible. The gas pumps were removed at an unknown date (pre 1975). The station maintains its integrity of location and setting, as it is located on the corner of Main Street and Magnolia Street approximately two blocks from downtown Rison. The building beautifully displays the workmanship, design

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features, and materials used at the time of its construction. It is very probable that this building was one of several prefabricated designs that could be ordered from a magazine and put together by local craftsmen. The physical features of this building such as steeply pitched gable roof convey the "feeling" or historic character of this building. Presently this building is vacant and used primarily for storage. The interior of the building is very plain with no lavish adornments.

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SUMMARY

The Rison Cities Service Station is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places with local significance under **Criterion C** for its English Revival style. Constructed in 1938 this building served Rison as a gas station until 1969 when it was sold to the Elrod Company. This property is significant for its association with the development of highway travel in Arkansas and therefore, is also being nominated under **Criterion A** for its association with the development of Arkansas highway culture, which is documented extensively in the multiple property listing. The Rison Cities Service Station is being submitted to the National Register of Historic Places under the multiple property listing "Arkansas Highway and Transportation Era Architecture, 1910-1965" in conjunction with the historic context "Arkansas Highway History and Architecture, 1910-1965."

ELABORATION

The town of Rison serves as the county seat for Cleveland County, which was established in 1873 as Dorsey County and renamed Cleveland County in 1885. Rison, like all towns in America, used a horse and carriage as the primary means of travel until the advent of the automobile in the late 1800s. Research has yet to reveal when the automobile first came to Rison, Arkansas, but it is accurate to say that by the 1920s automobiles were changing the landscape of Rison, Arkansas, as gas stations became a part of the built environment.

According to Jean Louise, a historical consultant, "After WWI, assembly lines began producing inexpensive cars at a rapid rate, highway construction boomed and the market for automobile petroleum exploded." During the 1920s many oil companies begin refining their marketing strategies, which included adopting distinctive signs and gas station designs. The most prevalent style for gas stations in the 1920s was the domestic style - gas stations that resembled small houses with hipped or gabled roofs - these designs blended nicely with their residential surroundings. For motorist passing by these domestic designs triggered positive associations such as friendliness, comfort, and security. Many of these building were prefabricated and could be ordered from a magazine and built on site by local craftsmen. There are several Cities Service stations located throughout Arkansas that are designed in a plan almost identical to the Rison Cities Service Station; therefore, it is very possible that this station was a prefabricated design used for marketing purposes by those oil companies that were subsidiaries of Cities Service.

Rison Cities Service Station

The Rison Cities Service Station, located at the corner of Main and Magnolia Streets in Rison, was constructed in 1938. Historically types of ownership often categorized historic gas stations. For instance land could be leased but improvements owned and the corporation could lease the land from a local owner usually at a stipulated annual rent for a set term of years with renewal options. Abstract research reveals that this was the case with the Rison Cities Service Station. The Arkansas Fuel Oil Company began leasing the property for \$500.00 cash and an additional sum of \$400.00 per year. The lease contract was negotiated so that the rent

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being paid by Arkansas Fuel and Oil Company could be applied towards the final asking price of \$2,500.00, and in 1943 Arkansas Fuel and Oil Company assumed sole ownership of the property.

The Arkansas Oil Company was one of numerous oil companies interlocked through ownership that marketed under the Cities Service sign. Cities Service rose to prominence because they emphasized gasoline marketing. In the 1920s the various Cities Service companies advertised in mass-circulation magazines such as the Saturday Evening Post and in over 142 newspapers in 113 cities across 20 states. In 1965 the various Cities Service companies combined and marketed under the name "Citgo".

At the station commonly referred to as the Cities Service Station, the Arkansas Oil Company marketed their gas at the small English Revival building from 1938 until 1969. Although the Arkansas Oil Company owned the Cities Service Station, throughout the years various people managed the station. Louis Granderson managed the service station at the time it was sold to the Arkansas Oil Company in 1969. The Elrod Company in turn sold the building to Rufus Buie, the present-day owner, during the 1970s. Throughout the years the building has been used for a variety of purposes; however, currently it is being used for storage space.

Significance

The Rison Cities Service Station is the only English Revival service station in Rison, Arkansas. Its architecture reflects the ideals of the 1920s and 1930s, an era when filling stations were designed to harmonize with neighborhoods. The Rison Cities Service Station is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places with local significance under **Criterion C** for its English Revival style and under **Criterion A** for its association with the development of highway travel in Arkansas, which is documented extensively in the multiple property listing. The service station is being submitted to the National Register of Historic Places under the multiple property listing "Arkansas Highway and Transportation Era Architecture, 1910-1965" in conjunction with the historic context "Arkansas Highway History and Architecture, 1910-1965."




