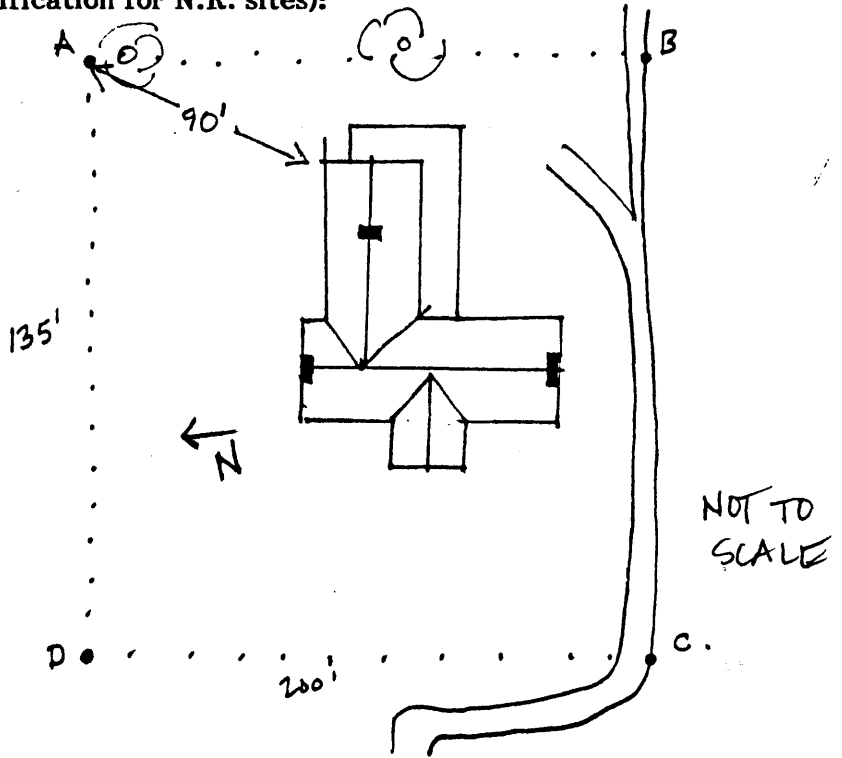

44. Site Plan (and boundary description and justification for N.R. sites):

Beginning at Point A, which is the northeastern corner of the yard, and 60 ft. northeast of the northeast corner of the ell, 200 ft. southward along edge of mowed yard to south edge of drive (B); 135 ft. westward along edge of drive to point (C) where drive begins to curve; then 200 ft. northward (D); then 135 ft. eastward to point of origin.

The boundary encloses the mowed yard area outlined by remnants of a tree line on the east, a driveway on the south, and unmowed fields on the north and west. The area contains no outbuildings.



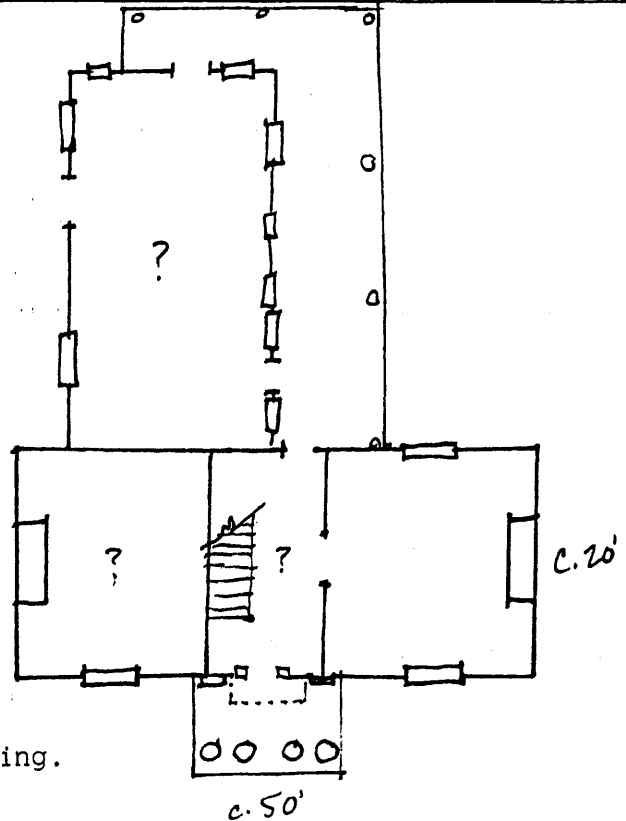
45. Description and House Plan:

Exterior

Two-story, 3-bay brick center-passage, single-pile house with early 20th century frame 2-story ell; pilasters divide bays on front, interior end chimneys, monumental Greek portico of stuccoed brick columns in Doric order, stone porch floor, box cornice, cast iron railing on balcony of second floor, ashlar foundation on front only, 6/6 sash, stone lintels and sills on front, wood sill and cornice on rear, entrance framed by pilasters and surmounted by frieze and cornice, ell sided with weatherboards, 1-story shed-roofed porch on south side and rear.

Interior

Rooms in brick block approx. 20'x20' with 12' wide passage, doors and windows framed with panelled pilasters and surmounted by paneled frieze, Greek Revival pilastered mantel in south room, high baseboards in south room.



The nominated property includes one contributing building.
