

DESCRIPTION: (cont.) dentil work under cornice resembles scroll rather than rectangular work. INTERIOR: simple Greek Rev. mantels w/oversized pilasters; window and door frames and baseboards are all oversized in width; window and door heads break into 4 sections w/a rounded cornice mold, a plain board, a half round, then a plain board just at the top of the door or window; the central hallway contains an open string spiral staircase w/ simple brackets; 4 paneled window aprons in front rooms; the middle room in the ell are chair rails and door frames w/pronounced architrave w/shoulders. The westernmost room in the ell is a board and batten addition.

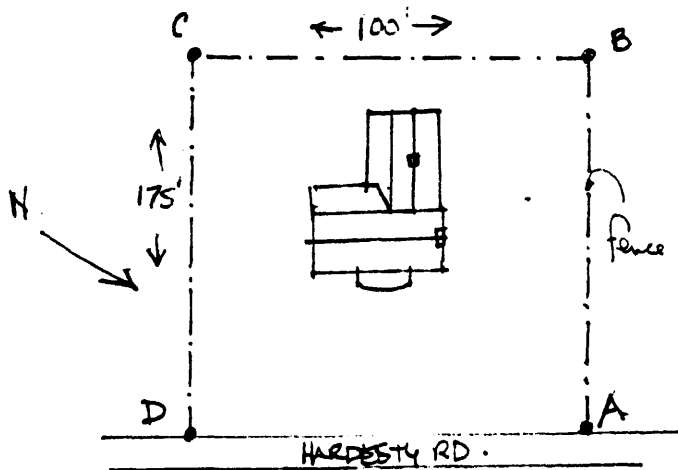

Verbal Boundary Description Acreage approx. 1 acre

Point A is located 70 feet north of the north end of the primary facade of the house. Beginning at point A where a fence intersects the Hardesty Road, proceeding 175 feet southwest from that point to point B, southeast 100 feet with fence to intersection with a fence to point C, then northeast 175 feet with fence to point D, thence 100 ft along Hardesty Rd. to point of origin. The boundaries were drawn to include the house and domestic-related space as defined by fences. There are no outbuildings.

The nominated area contains one contributing building.
