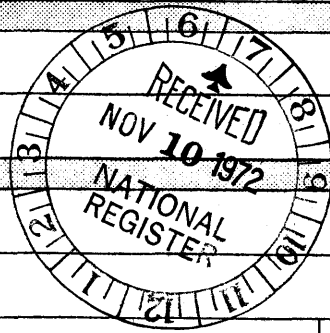

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This French provincial house is conspicuous for its mansard roof. It has fireplaces in living room, library, and dining room. The one in the living room is of marbleized pressed iron, imported from France. The library fireplace has Portuguese tiles, and the one in the dining room has English tiles. The mantels on all are plain.

Ceilings are twelve feet four inches high, and have medallions in the center. The front bay windows are alcoved, with arches above them. The handrail on the stairs is rosewood.

The classic floor plan called for a central hall and a drawing room thirty-two feet long. The family did its living on one side, where there was a library, bedroom and morning room, attached to the kitchen. In recent years, the morning room has been converted into a furnace room.

The drawing room overlooked Port Townsend harbor, and behind it is a twenty-six foot dining room. An open porch across this side later was enclosed in glass.

The upstairs bedrooms are large. One is twenty-six feet long and had originally been a billiard room. The house was built before the age of indoor plumbing, and bathing was done with water carried to dressing rooms. Later bathrooms were installed, one on each floor.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Frank Bartlett house was built in 1883 at a cost of \$10,000. In its history, the place once sold for taxes for \$2,500.

Frank A. Bartlett was born at Worcester, Mass. in 1859. He received his education in Port Townsend public and private schools. He entered his father's business as a clerk at age of eighteen; three years later he became general manager. In 1880 he was married to Leila Seavey. He held several public offices, including those of county treasurer, member of the city council, chairman of the board of health of Puget Sound. Also he served as president of the Chamber of Commerce, treasurer of the Puget Sound telegraph Co., director of Port Townsend Mill Co., president of Port Townsend Steel, Wire, and Nail Co.

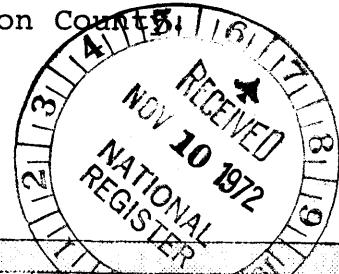
