

Description

The Titus House is a single story, wood frame Craftsman residence. Its intersecting gable and hipped roof principal components reveal a somewhat irregular plan. A single exterior brick chimney is attached to the center of the western side of the house. The roof material is composition shingle, the walls are clad in original weatherboards and stucco, and the continuous foundation is constructed of stone.

The southern or front elevation presents a very balanced composition, with its symmetrical fenestration and central entrance set beneath the curved, box cornice of the recessed porch and the central, stuccoed gable roof dormer. The dormer is lighted with two small, fixed six-pane wood windows flanking a central louvered vent. The house wall is fenestrated with two tripartite wood windows flanking the central entrance. The windows are composed of two six-over-one windows flanking a central twelve-over-one wood window. The recessed porch is set beneath the side cornice of the gable roof (there is no break in roof pitch) and features a boxed interior cornice which is slightly curved over the entrance. This cornice rests upon two short, sloping wood columns at each end of the porch, which in turn rest upon stone piers. A solid balustrade extends from each pier toward the entry stair where they terminate at stone entrance columns. Exposed rafters detail the roof cornice and decorative knee braces project out to each side of the boxed porch cornice. The only asymmetrical element of the elevation is the western gable roof carport wing which rests upon the same type of supports as the porch but which extends beyond the western wall and out over the driveway. It features a central doghouse dormer.

The eastern elevation is fenestrated with a central six-over-one wood sash window in the stuccoed gable end pediment, a pair of identical windows below to the south, and three of the same to the north. The western elevation features the gable end of the carport to the south and the chimney next to it. The wall is fenestrated with the a group of three wood sash windows between two single wood sash windows, the northernmost of which lights the rear hipped roof shed.

The northern elevation is composed of the rear shed roof addition and the hipped roof rear section. Otherwise the elevation is blank.

The Titus House remains virtually unaltered and is in good condition.

Significance

Criterion C, local significance

The Titus House (Part E, Historic Context #4) is the best example in this neighborhood of Searcy of a single story, wood frame Craftsman residence. It is particularly noteworthy for its successful use of a variety of media to lend a rustic, country character to this decidedly urban setting. This impression belies its virtually square floor plan, the only asymmetry coming from the projecting carport. As such the Titus House is typical of the second phase in the evolution of the Craftsman house designs in White County, in which the wings and appendages are placed more symmetrically around the house block, despite the continuing tendency for the elevations to exhibit an asymmetrical, picturesque aspect.
