#### **SUMMARY**

Harvey's Grocery and Texaco Station is located in the community of Harveyville on Arkansas Highway 24 between Camden and Chidester. The building was built in 1948 to replace the 1942 log building that proved too small to hold Henry Harvey's successful business. Until 1979, Harvey's Grocery sold Texaco brand gasoline and other Texaco products. The family-owned general store and restaurant is still open for business and is owned by Bobby Hildebrand, the grandson of the original owner. Constructed of rock-faced concrete block, the building is the best example of a vernacular 1940s general store and gas station in the Camden vicinity.

#### ELABORATION

Harvey's Grocery and Texaco Station is located at 3241 Hwy 24 west of Camden. The single story rectangular plan building sits upon a continuous concrete foundation. A front-gabled roof covered by asphalt shingles protects the building from the elements. A rock-faced concrete block exterior was chosen for the building, because the low-cost solid walls simulated the look of more expensive stone. Supported by four rock-faced concrete block columns, the shed roof porch is covered by asphalt shingles. The only structural alteration is a concrete block storage facility on the southeast corner of the rear elevation.

#### North/Front Elevation

The north facade fronts Arkansas Hwy 24 and contains a full-length, shed-roofed porch supported by four rock-faced concrete block columns. Beneath the porch near the northeast corner, an original wood door is held shut by a piece of wood and a bench. Metal bars installed by the original owner protect two large single-paned stationary windows. Centered between these windows is a modern aluminum door with fulllength glass. Also located beneath the porch are a soda machine, a bagged ice cooler, and two benches. Situated on the shed roof between two advertisements for Coca-Cola is a sign that reads "Harvey's Grocery." Above the porch, the gable end is sheathed in weatherboard siding and punctured by a louvered vent.

#### **East and West Elevations**

The side elevations are virtually identical. Four, small four-light windows, placed high on the wall to avoid disruption from the interior built-in cabinets, fenestrate the elevations. The only difference between the elevations is that one four-light window on the east elevation is infilled by the cooling system.

#### **South Elevation**

The rear elevation contains the only addition to the building-a small rectangular bathroom was constructed. A large door is slightly off-center on this elevation. Similar to the front façade the gable end is clad in weatherboard siding and punctured by a large louvered vent.

#### Interior

The interior of the building remains relatively unchanged. The original poured concrete floor remains, as well as, various built-in cabinets, shelves and cabinets. Other furnishings include a folding table to allow for indoor dinning, numerous chairs, soft drink coolers and a centrally located cash register station. In the back of the building is a walk-in-freezer that dates to the previous 1942 building. In 1975, the kitchen area of the building was slightly enlarged to keep up with the demand for barbecue, but this has been the only substantial interior change.

#### Site features and Ancillary Structure

Site features include several metal poles that support signs, and a concrete platform that served as the foundation for the gas pumps. The only contributing resource is the oblong concrete gas tank platform that stretches the length of the store. The gas tanks were removed in 1979. Two metal poles flank the building and hold advertisements for various brands of beer. Another sign located east of the building contains the building's name and the current owner's motto "Politic's spoken here," referring to the building's fame as a place to talk politics. A distance of approximately fifty feet from the building is a much older metal sign hanging from a pair of metal poles. Though badly rusted the sign reads, "ask for JAX/BEST BEER IN TOWN" (brewed in New Orleans, the beer was popular in the region until the 1960s). Below it is another metal sign equally as rusted that says, "Harvey's Grocery." Though not considered contributing to the nomination, the signs lend ambiance to Harvey's Grocery and Texaco Station.

To the west of the building is a concrete and vertical board ancillary building that is used for cooking barbecue. Constructed in 1990, the ancillary building does not contribute to the nomination.

#### **SUMMARY**

Harvey's Grocery and Texaco Station is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places with local significance under **Criterion C** for its vernacular architecture. Although dating to 1948, the building utilizes the rectangular plan with front facing gable roof, the full-length porch and the small side windows that have been the idiom for single story commercial buildings since the late 19th century. The building's low-pitched roofline, original single-pane stationary windows, and concrete floor distinguish it as a late example of the form. The building served as a gas station until 1979 and is therefore eligible for nomination under **Criterion A** for its association with the development of Arkansas highway culture. Harvey's Grocery and Texaco Station is being submitted to the National Register of Historic Places under the multiple property listing "Arkansas Highway and Transportation Era Architecture, 1910-1965" in conjunction with the historic context "Arkansas Highway History and Architecture, 1910-1965.

#### **ELABORATION**

The community of Harveyville was established in December of 1941, when Henry Harvey settled there with his family after selling a 3,000-acre farm near Chidester. The first store building was a log cabin type that measured approximately 20x30 feet. In 1948, Henry Harvey's business was growing and since the log building did not allow for easy expansion, it was decided that another larger building would be constructed to the west of the original. Ownership of the grocery store/gas station passed to several of Harvey's relatives (Ellis and A.G. "Doc" Harvey, Henry Harvey, Jr., Guy Harvey, and Bobby and Harvey Hildebrand). According to the Camden News, "After graduating from Camden High School in 1954, Bobby became the sole owner of the business and he has operated it continuously since then with the help of his mother Minnie Mae Hildebrand." During its operation as a gas station until 1979, Texaco gasoline and products were sold at the store. Harvey's Grocery and Texaco Station continues to sell "grocery store and general store items including groceries, meats, soft drinks, beer and various hardware items..."

Outside the period of significance, but still important to locals are the barbecue sandwiches and the political discussions for which the building has become known. In 1975, Bobby Hildebrand began selling his now regionally famous smoked barbecue sandwiches. The store is also well-known regionally as a place to discuss politics, weather, and the economy. According to Jackie Bevill in the Camden News:

"Now every two years during an election year, every politician within the State of Arkansas tries to make it by or at least send a respresntative down to visit with Bobby, his family, employees and friends. Politicians have learned their lesson with, that an endorsement from Harvey's Grocery carries a lot of clout at the polls."

Listed among the many politicians who have visited are Bill Clinton, David Pryor, and Jay Dickie. In 1996, Bobby and his sister Frances Alston attended Bill Clinton's Inaugural Ball. Many of the politicians have signed photographs displayed in the front of the store. A growing portion of the building is used to display collectibles and souvenirs that have been given to the owner by his friends and "some grateful politicians."

#### Significance

Harvey's Grocery and Texaco Station is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places with local significance under **Criterion C**. The 1948 property is eligible under this criterion, because its fundamental form and materials remain intact and it stands as an important example of small mid-twentieth century commercial building. Harvey's Grocery and Texaco Station is being submitted to the National Register of Historic Places under **Criterion A** with local significance under the multiple property listing "Arkansas Highway and Transportation Era Architecture, 1910-1965" in conjunction with the historic context "Arkansas Highway History and Architecture, 1910-1965.
