DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The <u>Tunnel Mill</u> is located on a three quarter mile horseshoe bend of Bear Creek in northwestern Fillmore County, Minnesota. Built on the lower edge of the one hundred and fifty feet deep valley and at the end of a six hundred foot long mill race, the mill derives its name from the fact that the builder and original owner, J.A. Stout, tunnelled underneath the bluff through limestone bedrock, shortcutting the bend of the creek. Consequently he took advantage of the natural twenty five foot drop in the creek bed and eliminated the need for a mill pond.

The <u>Tunnel Mill</u> is a timber and frame structure with horizontal clapboard siding. While of venacular, industrial design, the strong emphasis on verticality, the twin circular windows beneath the gable overhang and the extensive overhang to the eaves reflect the Italianate influence of the period.

J.A. Stout originally constructed only the main portion of the building in 1871, utilizing locally quarried limestone for the base. He added the shed addition in 1881 as a sorghum mill. The original grain mill produced upwards of fifty barrels of flour per day during peak periods while the sorghum mill produced two thousand gallons of molasses in its first year of production. Most of the belts and pulleys are intact in the building as is the tunnel although now unused and dry. Most of the other milling equipment, however, was removed when the mill ceased operation in the 1930s.

Now standing unused except for storage for the old miller's house nearby, the mill is becoming increasingly vandalized and deteriorated.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Completed in 1871 by J.A. Stout, the locally renown miller and mill builder, the <u>Tunnel Mill</u> is the last surviving mill in the important "western concentration" of grist mills in Fillmore County, Minnesota. To explain, Fillmore County which is located in the southernmost tier of counties in southeastern Minnesota, is naturally blessed with great rolling agricultural lands, and quickly cascading creeks and rivers. The latter form the edge to the deep Root River valley basin, a major tributary to the upper Mississippi River. Consequently, with the great wheat "booms" of the 1850s and 1870s, Fillmore County was geologically well suited to develop the greatest number of grain mills ever built in Minnesota. The mills were concentrated in two areas; on the southeastern edge of the county which saw well over one hundred and fifty mills being constructed between 1855 and 1900, and in the smaller northwestern corner of the county where over fifty milk were built during the same period. The <u>Tunnel Mill</u> is the last vestige in the latter in this great milling area.

During the early years and before the development of the modern roller milling technology in the 1880s and 1890s, this county superceeded in quanity and quality even the world renown mills of St. Anthony Falls at Minneapolis.

The mill, like many of its neighboring companies, added a sorghum mill to supplement the grain milling.

Water supplied all power to the mill during its operation from 1871 to the 1930s. But instead of water power being supplied by an adjacent dam which is the normal procedure, the <u>Tunnel Mill</u> capitalized on the natural advantage of its site. Bear Creek, its source of water, takes a three-quarter mile, horseshoe, bend around a hundred and fifty foot bluff. Stout hired four men during what local oldtimers describe as "one long, cold, hard winter" to construct a tunnel shortcutting the creek and supplying the power. Local histories claim the tunnel took the better part of a year to build using three tons of powder to blast the six by six by six hundred foot tunnel through the limestone bedrock. The tunnel created a twentyfive foot drop in the creek bed, more than sufficient to power the mill. It is the only known mill in the state to be powered in such a manner and represents a unique and rather ingenious engineering solution to an age old problem.
